## FROM THE PRESIDENT

Hi Folks.

Anyone read the interesting article in <u>The Post</u> recently about local male fish carrying eggs? Did you know the main sources of water pollution are storm water runoff? That means when it rains, it washes stuff off OUR lawns into OUR waterways. Many of OUR everyday activities are sending sediment, grit, heavy metals, oil, fertilizers, and more into sewer drains and eventually into Accotink Creek and the Chesapeake Bay?

Here's a short list of what homeowners can do to promote healthy streams and waterways:

- Fertilize in the FALL only. Heavy Spring rains wash fertilizer away.
- Collect litter and animal waste. Recycle grass clippings and leaves by mulching. Direct your roof runoff into grassy areas or rain barrels for reuse. Apply pesticides (if at all) strictly according to instructions.
- Design plantings to minimize erosion and maximize infiltration. Use mulch to hold the moisture. Install waterfalls that recycle water. Use porous surfaces such as interlocking pavers, flagstones, gravel, or stone rather than concrete or asphalt. Finally, be active and spread the word.
