To celebrate our cultural diversity, the Ravensworth Civic Association held its International Picnic on Saturday, September 29 at the Community of



FALL CLEANING TIME!

All Ravensworth Farm residents have a wonderful opportunity to safely destroy sensitive papers. So clean out those shoe boxes and file cabinets, and bring them to be shredded on Saturday, **November 3rd**, from **10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.**, at the pool parking lot.

Remember: shredding old financial records helps to prevent identity theft.

NO RAIN EQUALS COOLER, CLEANER ACCOTINK CREEK!



Would you believe Accotink Creek has become cleaner and colder because of no rain? The obvious lack of storm water this summer meant hot, dirty and polluted water did not rush off driveways, streets and parking lots, and did not enter the nearest storm drain, carrying trash into Accotink Creek. The creek is flowing during the drought because of naturally cool and clean ground water. One young lady joined Friends of Accotink Creek to earn Community Service hours during our annual fall International Coastal Cleanup on Saturday, 29 Sep, and waded into the stream to find the plastic bags and bottles. She soon had to get out because the water was "too cold!" The trash in the creek this fall is apparently all that remains from earlier storms.

Each person in the RFCA can help keep Accotink Creek cool and clean by picking up trash off the street and stopping the warm, dirty water reaching and destroying life in Accotink Creek! Rain on roofs and streets heats up and rushes into the storm drain carrying pollution and trash directly to the stream! Warmer water has less oxygen. Aquatic life needs oxygen and cool, clean water.

- Responsibly use pesticides / fertilizers! Only fertilize lawns in the fall and use phosphate-free fertilizer. Encourage the natural predators to control your pests. Use boric acid or insecticidal soap; they're less toxic to aquatic life than pesticides.
- <u>Plant native plants!</u> Grow varieties of attractive native plants that are available for residential use. These plants require fewer chemicals, less maintenance and support native wildlife.
- <u>Practice good car care!</u> <u>Fix car leaks!</u> <u>Recycle</u> used motor oil, antifreeze, batteries, etc. Use a car wash that recycles. If washing your car at home, use a small amount of low-suds, biodegradable, phosphate-free cleaners.
- Practice Good Water Stewardship! DIRECT DOWN SPOUTS AWAY FROM YOUR DRIVE-WAY! Keep our stream from drowning -- see: http://www.accotink.org/Stormwater.htm! Use the natural cooling and pollutant-filtering ability of soil & plants. Install rain gardens and rain barrels to capture water and release it slowly! Use porous materials such as spaced bricks or gravel for pathways & patios instead of asphalt or concrete, reducing impervious surfaces and slowing the water.



COYOTE'S IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Some of you may have noticed the coyote's in our neighborhood. Please read the following FAQ to keep your family and pets safe.

Are there coyotes in Fairfax County?

Yes. Coyotes were first sighted around the tank farm and Daniels Run in 2001. They have gradually migrated and are now being reported throughout the entire County.

Should we be concerned?

Not really. They're part of our wildlife now. Coyotes, just like in the old Western movies, are primarily a concern to farmers. For Fairfax County citizens, the big concern is letting out pets at night -- cats or small dogs, which could be killed if they wander into coyote territory. Cats and small pets should be kept indoors, especially at night. Dogs should not be left outdoors unattended.

It's also very important that you <u>don't leave food</u> sources out at <u>night</u>, like dog food or food on compost piles, and secure garbage can lids.

Can't anything be done to remove them?

Not safely. They are very elusive and are difficult to trap humanely or safely. Even if they could be safely captured and removed, as long as the environmental conditions exist to support their survival in the area others will quickly move in behind any that are removed.

What should I do if I spot a coyote?

Nothing. We know that they are here. You don't need to do anything more than you would if you saw a skunk or raccoon. If you see one that is acting sick or aggressive contact Animal Control right away.

Can coyotes be scared off?

Yes. Just yell at them. Coyotes generally aren't confrontational and would rather avoid humans and run away than get in a fight, although they might get into a tug-of-war if you tried to grab away their catch.

However, if a coyote is behaving abnormally or aggressively, like a rabid dog, then call the county police non-emergency number -- **703-691-2131** -- and they will dispatch an animal control officer.

Are there any benefits to having coyotes in the area?

The good news for Fairfax County is that coyotes will help normalize two animal populations that have overgrown due to the lack of a natural predator, and have presented a nuisance problem for citizens. These are rats and Canada geese.

Coyotes will help clean up the high rat population and other rodents as well, which is a welcome activity. In the case of Canada geese, coyotes like eating goose eggs (and occasionally a goose dinner), which should help to mitigate the big soiling problem the county has when geese overrun sports fields, parks, school grounds and lawns.


