#### FROM THE PRESIDENT

Neighbors,

At the end of January the state and county will hold one of a planned series of meetings to discuss the proposed widening of the beltway with HOT lanes. I strongly encourage residents to attend and voice your concerns, questions or support. It is unclear at this point if this project will encourage safe pedestrian and bike access. Originally this project was presented as costing the taxpayers nothing. The numbers being presented now estimate we will pay about \$500 million and the private developer will pay \$1.5 billion. In addition, parts of Braddock Road will likely be expanded or re-configured-- impacting our neighborhood or shopping center. There is no word yet if this proposed development has been designed to accommodate the long-delayed "purple line" of metro around the beltway. The county, state and contractor have been extremely quiet up till now with little public input. If you feel that a widened beltway that caters to single-occupant autos may not be the ideal solution for meeting our transportation needs and to solving gridlock, then I strongly suggest you attend these meetings to offer your voice.

We need a couple more Green Committee volunteers. If anyone is interested contact Hans Jansen or myself. Hope everyone has a nice January.

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#### CONCERNED ABOUT BOARDING HOUSES & OVERCROWDING?

Fairfax County is undertaking a countywide effort to crack down on illegal boarding houses by using Enhanced Code Enforcement Strike Teams. These teams bring together 15 different county agencies to include zoning, building, fire and health code inspectors. Police officers, sheriff's deputies, attorneys, and others also support the teams.

#### What exactly do these teams do?

Their mission is to shut down illegal boarding houses across the county. The teams also take legal action against these illegal boarding houses and their landlords.

#### Why is overcrowding a problem?

Illegal boarding houses are more than a neighborhood nuisance. Too many people living in one house can lead to:

- Dangerous living conditions
- Reduced quality of life
- Financial exploitation

The people who run illegal boarding houses are making money from breaking the law. For the tenants, the result is unsafe housing. These houses may not have enough exits in case of a fire. For neighbors, the result is a reduced quality of life. There can be problems with litter, public urination and too many parked cars.

#### Why were the teams created?

Fairfax County has always taken action against illegal boarding houses. But the teams were created to better enforce zoning, building and safety codes.

#### Can I report a suspected illegal boarding house?

Yes. The teams operate based on complaints. Make a complaint and the teams will investigate. Here's how:

Go to this web site: http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/opa/striketeam/. Scroll down the page to "Report Overcrowding." Then click on "Make a Complaint." Be sure to pick "Too Many Families/Too Many People in Home" when making the complaint. Submit the complaint online.

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
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
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
