FROM THE PRESIDENT

Folks,

Expect to see many trees near the beltway and Braddock Road cut down soon to accommodate staging areas for the proposed widening of the beltway by four HOT (High Occupancy Toll) lanes. In a recent meeting hosted by Supervisor Smyth, there was substantial concern that Braddock Road and other secondary roads would also be widened in the future to handle the increased single-occupant auto traffic. If Braddock Road was widened, we would likely lose some homes on Adair Lane.

Are these HOT lanes a good deal for the public? Under NEPA this \$2 billion project (or will it escalate to \$3 billion?) was negotiated in secrecy, giving citizens only 30 days to respond now and provide input. Virginia must pay \$409 million and guarantee a \$600 million federal loan. Fluor and Transurban will be putting up only 17.5% of the cost; \$348 million, yet will receive most of the revenues for 75 years.

Plus in this plan, air pollution and greenhouse gas emissions have been ignored at a time when visionary states, cities, and communities are undergoing a fundamental shift to common-sense transit and smarter growth solutions. Toxic pollutant hotspots next to highways have been shown to create elevated danger for nearby communities (like Ravensworth), especially for children, the

IS YOUR SIDEWALK CLEAR?

Spring and summer time are here, and that means more and more people will be out on the sidewalks. Please do not block the sidewalks and make sure the entire sidewalk is open for access at all times. People who don't have handicapped family members or small children may not give much thought to this, but a blocked sidewalk can be a very dangerous situation.

My mom can only move around freely on her three wheel scooter. Cars, toys, bikes and overgrown shrubs blocking the sidewalk force her to go into the street or cross the street completely. This makes her life more dangerous and painful and a simple trip becomes much more complicated. My wife who pushes twin boys through the neighborhood in a cart has had to enter the street many times to get around cars blocking the sidewalk.

I would ask everyone to be courteous and keep the walkways clear. Most people I talk to do not realize that <u>blocking the sidewalk is illegal</u>. Any neighbor seeing a blocked sidewalk can anonymously call the Fairfax police to take care of the problem. For persistent problems such as overgrown trees, the VDOT website has a form that can be submitted online: http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/dpwes/utilities/walkways.htm

Parking a car across the sidewalk even for a short period of time can cause folks to walk into the street to get around it. In certain conditions, this could cause a disaster! Since this issue is close to my heart, I even make the pizza delivery guy move his car before I pay him, if he's blocking the sidewalk.

It is also important to keep our driveways in good repair. In my situation, my driveway had a small section where the concrete had cracked and fallen away. My handicapped neighbor and friend tried to turn around in the driveway, got her wheel stuck and the entire scooter flipped over on top of her. She was badly hurt and I was crushed that this happened on my property. I still remember the pain she experienced because I did not fix something very small.



Please be courteous and keep all sidewalks clear and our driveways in good repair. Even old newspapers with their slippery covers on the sidewalk can be a safety hazard. Let's all work together to keep Ravensworth Farm safe for everyone!

INVASIVE PLANTS THREATENING OUR PARKS



In Fairfax County, many invasive plants are degrading our natural resources and preventing us from enjoying our yards, forests and parks. These invasive plants are deteriorating the ecological value of our natural areas by forcing out native plants, which in turn reduces wildlife habitat and biological diversity. They outcompete the indigenous species by blocking access to sunlight and soil resources.

In response to the increasing number of climbing vines that are strangling trees and the thorny shrubs that keep citizens out of the woods, Fairfax County Park Authority created the Invasive Management Area (IMA) program. It is a volunteer-based, community project that aims to reduce invasive plants on our parklands, thereby helping to improve wildlife habitat and restore the native ecology of our fields and forests. The program calls upon enthusiastic and dedicated volunteers throughout the county to assist with targeted manual removal of these undesirable non-native, invasive plants with the help of hand tools provided by

the FCPA – no herbicides or power tools are used by volunteers.

There are many sites countywide that have been identified as areas overrun with invasive plants and adopted by the IMA program. Although there are many invasive, non-native plants in the county parks, the program targets ten specific species selected because they are pervasively invasive and expand rapidly but are also easily and effectively controlled by volunteers. These target species are English ivy (*Helix hedera*), Japanese stiltgrass (*Microstegium vimineum*), winged burning bush (*Euonymus alata*), mile-a-minute (*Polygonum perfoliatum*), Japanese barberry (*Berberis thunbergii*), kudzu (*Pueraria montana*), oriental bittersweet (*Celastrus orbiculatus*), autumn olive (*Elaeagnus umbellate*), garlic mustard (*Alliaria petiolata*), and porcelainberry (*Ampelopsis brevipedunculata*).

However, the IMA program does not just work to remove invasives. Its key components are habitat restoration and a long-term commitment to the park. After an area has been cleared of invasives, native species are planted to restore the natural habitat. Each IMA site is monitored throughout the restoration process, even after the planting, as invasives may reemerge from the existing seedbank or resprout from roots left in the soil.

The success of the program is very much dependent on the dedication of its generous volunteers. It is a fantastic way for kids to earn hours for scout projects or school community service requirements. Many citizens have joined the program to help protect the county's native plants and wildlife so that they can continue to enjoy these natural resources. 




