SCHOOLS HAVE RE-OPENED!

This year school is starting 10 minutes earlier than in previous years. School will be in session from 8:25 to 3:05. Buses are expected to arrive at the school between 8:10 and 8:25 and depart between 3:10 and 3:30 and there are a significant number of families driving their children to school and that coupled with the construction on the Hot Lanes could impact traffic in the neighborhood. With all this happing I suggest that kids could walk to school instead of riding in a car, it is great exercise and really good for the environment so we can build a healthier planet!



To keep our Neighborhood children safe please follow the below rules: -

- ➤ When backing out of a driveway or leaving a garage, watch out for children walking or bicycling to school.
- ➤ When driving in the neighborhood watch out for young people who may be thinking about getting to school, but may not be thinking of getting there safely.
- **SLOW** Down. Watch for children walking in the street.
- **SLOW** Down. Watch for children playing and congregating near bus stops.
- ➤ Be alert. Children arriving late for the bus may dart into the street with out looking for traffic.
- > Drivers are required to travel | SPEED | in a school zone when indicated by a sign or signal.
 - Yellow flashing lights indicate that the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children. Motorists should slow down and prepare to stop their vehicles.
 - Red flashing lights and extended stop arms indicate that the bus has stopped, and that children are getting on or off. Motorists must stop their cars and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop sign is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving before they can start driving again.
- ➤ Parents Please Encourage Pedestrian Safety to Students.

LAKE ACCOTINK NEWS: DAM REPAIRS TO TEMPORARILY CLOSE PARK TRAIL

As construction begins on Lake Accotink Park's dam, part of the trail will be closed to thru traffic for several days between late-August and December. This is the portion of trail right in front of the dam.

To lessen the impact on visitors to the park, the trail will remain open on Fridays and weekends. The exact dates of the trail closures will be posted on signs along the trail.

Dam repairs also require that the water level in the lake be lowered for an extended period of time. This will cause exposure to the deep silt of the lake's bottom. Patrons are advised to stay out of the silt/mud beds. This project is expected to be completed by March 2010.
