In closing, Robin and I would like to wish each of you a wonderful Holiday Season. We hope to see you at the Hayride!

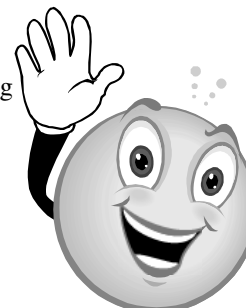

DINING OUT WITH THE GOLDEN RAVENS

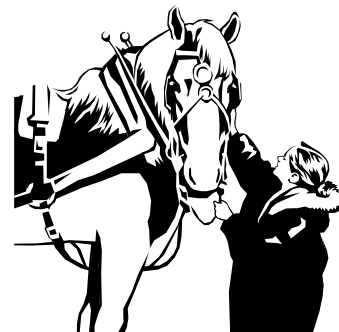

LOTS OF CHANGES COMING TO SPRINGFIELD MALL

The old 40-year old Springfield Mall is poised to undergo a major facelift, gradually changing into a "Springfield Town Center" with tree-lined pathways winding through cafes, shops upscale eateries and a central plaza where people can live, work, shop and play.

Plans for the new mall were recently approved by the Fairfax County Planning Commission and the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors. Everything now appears to be in place for redevelopment to start. The company Web site indicates that construction will begin in spring 2010, but much depends on the state of the economy.

Other plans for the mall area include high-quality retail stores, office space, a hotel, dining and entertainment venues as well as luxury residential units. The complex features a pedestrian-friendly town center, parks and plazas, even a dog park—all connected by walking trails.

The new development will be much larger than the existing mall. The current outside parking lots will be moved to structured lots, many of them underground. The 80-acre site, bordered by Franconia Road, Spring Mall Road, Loisdale Road and Frontier Drive, will be transformed into the new Springfield Town Center, a complex with not only retail stores, but open spaces for concerts, a farmers' market and public exhibitions.

As many as 2,800 housing units are included in the plans, a mix of high-rise and mid-rise buildings. It is currently undecided if these will be condos, rental units or a combination of both. Plans call for the housing units to be grouped along Spring Mall Road with easy access to the Franconia-Springfield Metro station, while office units will be along the western edge of the property, along Loisdale Road. Restaurants, cafes and retail stores will line the trails and pathways throughout the community.

Although actual mall construction has yet to begin, behind-the-scenes preparations are already being made. Re-construction of the current mall space is expected to commence next year and take about 18 months. Construction will be done in sections and the mall's anchor stores will remain open during the reconstruction. The entire project, including housing units and the new town center is slated to take 10 to 20 years.

FAIRFAX COUNTY H1N1 VACCINE AVAILABILITY & DISTRIBUTION

On June 11, 2009, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared a pandemic of novel H1N1 influenza indicating that the new virus is widespread. H1N1 flu spreads the same way seasonal flu spreads, mainly from person to person through coughing or sneezing by infected persons. Sometimes people may become infected by touching something - such as a surface or object - with flu viruses on it and then touching their mouth or nose.

The delay in distribution of 2009 H1N1 vaccine has impacted the entire nation and has resulted in uneven availability. The Fairfax County Health Department is committed to vaccinating target populations as quickly as vaccine becomes available. Depending on the quantities of vaccine available each week, vaccine will be distributed through the five Health Department's clinic locations or mass vaccination clinics. The CDC Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) has recommended the 2009 H1N1 vaccine for the following 5 target groups:

- Pregnant women.
- People who live with or care for children younger than 6 months of age.
- Healthcare and emergency medical services personnel.
- Persons between the ages of 6 months and 24 years old.
- People age 25 through 64 years of age who are at higher risk for novel H1N1 because of chronic health disorders or compromised immune systems.

Once providers meet the demand for vaccine among persons in these initial target groups, vaccination is recommended for all persons 25 through 64 years of age.

A Recent VDOT survey indicated a significant speed of 37 MPH at the 86th percentile data sample

A mean speed of 30 MPH was measured

You can help control the speed of traffic by simply slowing down. The cars behind you will then slow down, as well. Racing to the school to drop-off or pick-up your child will not save even one minute of time—especially for that last quarter mile. Think of our children who may lose control of a bike or ball and dart out into the street. **Help keep our community family-friendly** and obey the neighborhood speed limit which is **25 miles per hour** or else there will be
