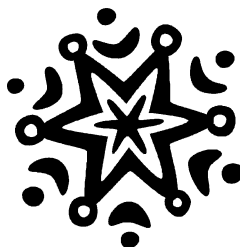
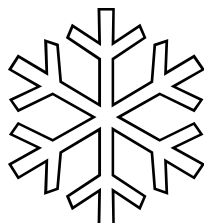

BB GUNS AND AIR RIFLES GUNS ILLEGAL IN RAVENSWORTH

After several reports of kids shooting air rifles and BB guns in Ravensworth, please know that it is illegal for anyone—adults or children—to discharge a BB gun or air pellet gun on your property. Fairfax County code section 6-1-2.1 states that discharge of BB guns, air pistols, air rifles and pellet guns are prohibited unless on a “parcel of land containing at least one (1) acre of land in an area designated for the discharge of firearms or other guns in accordance with Appendix J to the Fairfax County Code.”

Since many Ravensworth homes are close to the elementary school and/or the park, you should also know that if you discharge “any such BB-gun, air pistol, air rifle or pellet gun within one hundred (100) yards of a public school ground or a public park it shall be punishable as a Class 4 misdemeanor.” And no person can pass through a public school ground, or a public park while in possession of a BB-gun, air pistol, air rifle or pellet gun, since this is also a Class 4 misdemeanor.

The next time you see anyone in Ravensworth shooting any type of BB gun or air rifle please call the non-emergency Police number. Should you hear gunfire or if a BB or pellet strikes your house, call 911 immediately. Let's keep everyone safe!

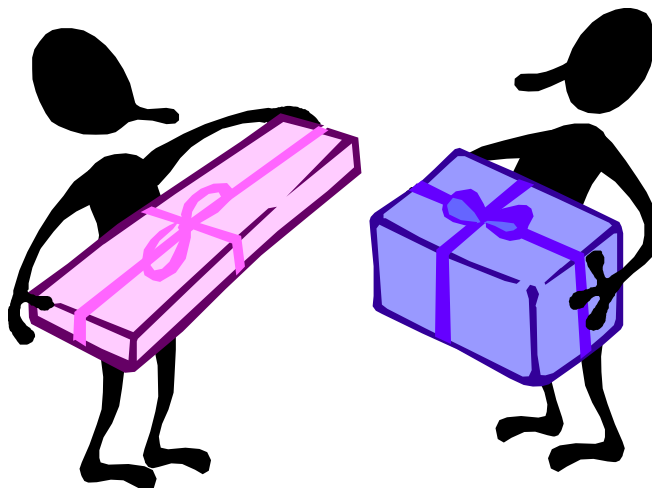

FAIRFAX COUNTY SCHEDULES 2011 ELECTRIC SUNDAYS, REMOTE HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTIONS



The Fairfax County Solid Waste Management Program has released the dates and locations for Electric Sundays, three remote household hazardous waste collection events and three business hazardous waste collection events in 2011. All event details - including dates, times and locations - can be accessed online at <http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/dpwes/recycling/calendar.htm>

Events listed on the calendar include:

- **Electric Sundays** provide county residents with an opportunity to recycle old televisions, computers and peripheral electronics as well as unbroken fluorescent tubes and light bulbs. Events are scheduled once a month from January through November in 2011. Electric Sundays are open to Fairfax County residents only at no charge.

The first one is Jan. 23 from 10 a.m. - 3 p.m. at the I-66 Transfer Station, 4618 West Ox Road, Fairfax, VA 22030.
- **Remote Household Hazardous Waste Collections** allow residents to dispose of household hazardous waste on certain dates and at specified locations throughout the county rather than the county's permanent household hazardous waste disposal sites at the I-66 Transfer Station and the I-95 Landfill Complex. These events are for Fairfax County residents only and there is no cost for this service.
- **Business Hazardous Waste Collections** allow businesses in Fairfax County that qualify as a Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generator (under state law) three opportunities a year to dispose of small quantities of hazardous waste for a fee at the I-66 Transfer Station on designated dates.

Residents are encouraged to check this calendar often as it is regularly updated with the latest event information from the Fairfax County Solid Waste Management Program. Document shredding events are in the process of being planned for 2011. Dates will be posted once confirmed. Questions and concerns about recycling and hazardous waste collection events may be addressed by calling 703-324-5230, TTY 711.

BRACING FOR BRAC

BRAC, the military's Base Realignment and Closing action, will move approximately 19,000 federal workers to our area, most notably to the southeastern part of Fairfax County. This includes Springfield, Newington, Mt. Vernon and Alexandria. By September 15, 2011 this move will be completed. Here are some things you might want to know:

- A four-building office complex called Liberty View will be constructed near the Springfield Metro station. One of these buildings might be a 170-room hotel.
- Metro Park in Springfield has expanded from four to seven buildings to house additional government contractors.
- A fifteen-acre complex called Patriot Ridge will be constructed in Newington near the National Geospatial Intelligence Agency (NGA).
- As many as 12,000 additional workers will be gradually transferring to Fort Belvoir as part of BRAC. 3,400 workers will initially move this spring and then others will follow.
- No additional money has been allocated to improve roads or alleviate traffic congestion the additional federal workers and contractors will create.
- Route 1 in the Mt. Vernon area is expecting very heavy traffic congestion as a result of BRAC.
- Home sales and home values are expected to increase because of the influx of new workers to this part of the county.

FINES GROW SUBSTANTIALLY FOR SEWER POLLUTERS IN FAIRFAX

The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors made it easier to fine businesses and residents who dump damaging waste into the county's sewer system and substantially increased how much each violator would have to pay.

The newly approved rules allow the Wastewater Planning and Monitoring Division to bypass the courts and fine anyone who releases toxic or damaging waste into sewers \$32,500 for each infraction. Fines can go as high as \$100,000 for multiple infractions.

Previously, such fines were limited to \$2,500 and required the county to file a lawsuit to collect.

In addition to the fines, the new code makes it easier for the county to require the violator to pay for any damage they cause to sewer lines.

While fines could be issued to any county resident, wastewater planning director Shahram Mohsenin said the county rarely uses the code to fine businesses, let alone residents.

The most recent case in which the county sought damages was in 2009, when officials ordered the Krispy Kreme donut factory in the Gunston Commerce Center to pay \$1.9 million to repair a sewer line damaged by the factory's discharge.

When people are found in violation, Mohsenin said, the county first tries to work with violators to bring them into compliance with the county code.

Maintenance crews use portable cameras fed into the sewer lines through manholes to locate pipes damaged by illegal discharges and to trace the discharge back to its source.

The county rewrote its sewer code to comply with the recently amended Virginia state code, which strengthened the ability of localities to establish sewer standards and assess fines and damages.

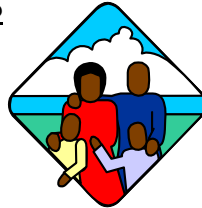

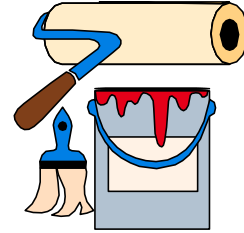

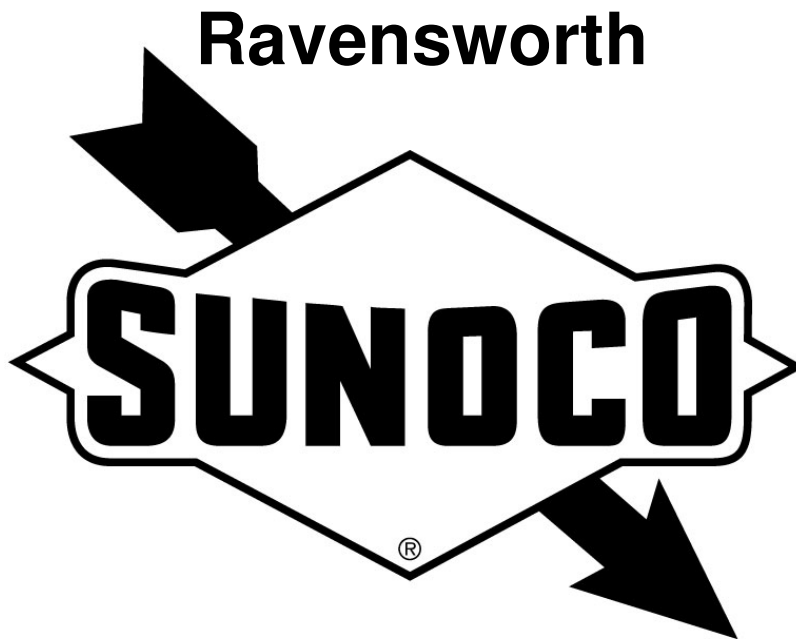
