NEWS FROM THE SHOPPING CENTER

- The Shopping Center owner is planning on demolishing the Safeway, deli, 7-11, and hair salon in 2015. This area will be completely re-designed and rebuilt.
- He hopes that a new grocery store will open sometime in 2016. Today, most major grocery chains require more square footage than our existing store offers.
- An architect has been hired to design the new configuration. As part of his new plan, the historical marker will be moved to a new, more prominent location.
- Both banks have closed. The owner has approached other banks about renting these existing spaces, but most want frontage property (more visible) to Braddock Road. He may possibly incorporate room for this in his new design.
- The renovation of the shopping center will require special zoning hearings. He hopes that our neighborhood will attend those hearings and support him in this upgrade.
- As part of these hearings, we may want to approach the owner about considering options such as adding a safe biking/walking path from our neighborhood to the shopping center.
- The space previously occupied by the Post Office has been rented. More info on this in upcoming issues.

COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP DAY: SATURDAY, MARCH 12, 2011



The twenty-third (23rd) annual Clean-Up Day this year will again provide an added incentive for "Farmers" to tackle back-yard clutter, messy basements, carports or storage sheds.

The Civic Association has again arranged for Fairfax County trash disposal trucks to be parked at the **Ravensworth Elementary School parking lot** on **Saturday, March 12** from **8:00 AM to 12:00 PM**, for the purpose of collecting items which are not accepted by private trash collectors at curbside. One truck will take metal items and another will take other trash. Now is the time to get rid

of old appliances, furniture, mattresses, boards, doors (no glass), swing sets, lawn mowers (<u>thoroughly drained of</u> fluids), piping, etc.

Items that CANNOT be accepted include hazardous waste (BATTERIES, including the small "button" and rechargeables, PAINT, USED OIL, pesticides, and lawn care products), TIRES, sheet rock, STONE OR CRUSHED ROCKS, and products that can be recycled - such as newspapers, cans and glass. Also, BRUSH WILL NOT BE COLLECTED. Residents may take their brush to one of the County's two brush recycling centers, located at:

- Landfill, 9850 Furnace Road, Lorton. Phone 703-690-1703. Hours 7:00 AM 6:00 PM M-F, 7:00 AM 4:00 PM Saturday. Tires (maximum of five without rims) will be accepted at the Lorton Landfill only! Call first!
- + <u>I-66 Transfer Station</u>, 4618 West Ox Road, Fairfax. Phone 703-631-1179. Hours 6:00 AM 7:00 PM daily. Hazardous waste, Thursday 1:00 PM 5:00 PM, Friday 8:00 AM 12 NOON, Saturday 9:00 AM 4:00 PM.

Brush delivered to these recycling centers will be shredded into mulch. Therefore, the brush must be free from other debris. Brush containing stumps, rock, metal, etc. will not be accepted because these items damage shredding equipment. Residents may obtain free shredded wood mulch at both these recycling centers.

THIS IS IMPORTANT!! You may not dump your trash at the school prior to the arrival of the County trucks or after the trucks depart! Disposing of private trash on school property, or in school dumpsters, is punishable by a \$100 fine.

We need a volunteer with a pick-up truck for assisting those people who need help getting large, bulky items to the school. Make every effort to get your materials to the school on your own as this pick-up is intended mainly for disabled or elderly residents. We do not have sufficient volunteers to clean out basements. To offer assistance or schedule a pick-up, call Jim Hickey at 703-321-8535. The Deer Resistant Shrub and Small Tree package is offered for \$15.95 and includes two each of the following species: Red osier dogwood, Silky dogwood, Serviceberry, Spicebush, and Pawpaw.

The Wildlife Friendly Tree Package sells for \$10.95 and is ideal for common areas or larger suburban yards. The tree package includes two each of the following: Black oak, Sycamore, and American hornbeam.

All seedlings are native to Northern Virginia

WHO TAKES CARE OF THIS?

Question: I often see dead animals on the road and do not know whom to call. Who do we call to pick up road kill that is bigger than a simple squirrel?

Answer: VDOT is the authority vested with the responsibility to remove road kill from public roads. They use subcontractors who are generally required to respond within 24 hours. Road kill on private property, private roads or driveways is the responsibility of the property owner.

To report dead animal removal or any other road issue, call VDOT's Customer Service Center at 800-FOR-ROAD or 800-367-7623.

You can also report unsafe conditions, such as a blind or poorly marked intersection, slick or icy roads to the same number. Don't want to call? The VDOT website has an online request form.


