FROM THE EDITOR:

Dear Neighbors:

A few weeks ago, our civic association met with representatives from VDOT and the companies building and managing the HOT lanes project—and they spoke to us about the project and specifically what the Braddock Road interchange will look like. First, I'd like to say a big thank you to Ellen Eggerton who organizes our meetings and presentations. It was a timely, interesting and informative meeting. Several neighbors from Danbury Forest joined us, as well.

Second, everyone-- get ready! By this coming December, Ravensworth will be impacted by the HOT/Express Lane entrance at Braddock Road and the Beltway. Here are some of the facts we learned about their operation:

- The new HOT lanes will be now called "Express Lanes."
- The Express Lanes will run between the mixing bowl and end before the American Legion Bridge.
- You must have an E-Z Pass transponder to use the express lanes.
- A new type of transponder will be available this summer that will let you switch be-

tween single user and HOV-3 status.

- Two signs will appear along Braddock Road, letting motorists know the current price. Once you pass these signs, you are locked into that price.
- One of these signs will be at the entrance of the express lane ramps, visible to those who exit Ravensworth via Queensberry Road.
- Fees could be \$4-6 during peak hours and as little as ten cents late at night.
- You will not be able to cross over from the express lanes into the regular beltway lanes except at designated exit points.
- HOV-3 and motorcycles will be free.
- Cameras and computers will constantly monitor the lanes and HOV status of cars.
- The speed limit will be 55 mph.
- 8 Virginia State Police cars will continually patrol and ticket violators.
- The Express Lane project is 84 percent complete and is scheduled to open at the end of December 2012.
- Transurban will be responsible for road maintenance & repair. VDOT will do the snow removal.
- \$5 million dollars has been allocated to re-forest the beltway area, where possible, along the entire corridor.

Gardening Tip of the Month:

Shrubs that flower on "new" wood (current season's growth) need to be pruned in late winter to early spring (January to March) when they are dormant.

Examples: Butterfly bush -prune to 12 inches from base Red twig dogwood -prune to ground Oakleaf hydrangea -only prune dead wood



STAFFING PROBLEM AT LAKE ACCOTINK



Jim Hickey, Ravensworth resident and active in FLAP (Friends of Lake Accotink) advised us that the Fairfax County Park Authority decided to leave Lake Accotink, Burke Lake and Fairfax Lake unstaffed, 24/7, for eight weeks, beginning January 23, 2012. It would mean that the gated entrances would remain open, possibly encouraging vandalism and illegal activities. Due to Jim's calling campaign to the Fairfax County Park Authority, Supervisor Cook and Chairman Boliva, the Park Authority agreed to have someone at Lake Accotink to open/close the gates and staff the area some of the time. Jim urges everyone in the neighborhood to email, call or write to Supervisor Cook and the Park Authority and urge them to lend their support for full and continued staffing at Lake Accotink. Thanks, Jim, for being a strong advocate for our neighborhood treasure!

YIELD ON GREEN CHANGE COMING TO QUEENSBERRY INTERSECTION!

Anyone who uses Wakefield Park or the Audrey Moore Recreation Center knows how dangerous the Queensberry/Braddock Road intersection can be. It seem like no one ever expects cars to travel straight across this intersection. I personally have had several "near misses" and have witnessed two different accidents at our light.

VDOT has finally agreed to put up two signs that say, "Left Turn Yield on Green": one sign for those exiting our neighborhood at Queensberry and the other for those exiting the Park.



BUILDING PERMITS

A building permit is a document issued by Fairfax County which legally authorizes construction activity. Anytime you have work done on your house, you need to have a completed building permit on file. You can apply for a permit two ways.


First, you may pick up a permit application at the Permit Application Center at the Herrity Building in the Fairfax County Government complex. You may be asked to pay for all or part of your permit fee at the time of application. A visit or telephone call to the Permit Application Center will provide you with the resources and information necessary to make your project a success and to avoid potential problems which could cost you time and money. Be prepared to discuss your project with permit staff who will ask you questions such as "What are you planning to do?" and "Where are you planning to do it?" The permit staff will discuss the specific process for your specific project.

COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP DAY: SATURDAY, MARCH 10, 2012



The twenty-fourth (24th) annual Clean-Up Day this year will again provide an added incentive for "Farmers" to tackle back-yard clutter, messy basements, carports or storage sheds.

The Civic Association has again arranged for Fairfax County trash disposal trucks to be parked at the **Ravensworth Elementary School parking lot** on **Saturday**, **March 10** from **8:00 AM to 12:00 PM**, for the purpose of collecting items which are not accepted by private trash collectors at curbside. One truck will take metal items and another will take other trash. Now is the time to get rid of old

appliances, furniture, mattresses, boards, doors (no glass), swing sets, lawn mowers (thoroughly drained of fluids), piping, etc.

Items that CANNOT be accepted include hazardous waste (BATTERIES, including the small "button" and rechargeables, PAINT, USED OIL, pesticides, and lawn care products), TIRES, sheet rock, STONE OR CRUSHED ROCKS, and products that can be recycled - such as newspapers, cans and glass. Also, BRUSH WILL NOT BE COLLECTED. Residents may take their brush to one of the County's two brush recycling centers, located at:

- + <u>I-95 Landfill</u>, 9850 Furnace Road, Lorton. Phone 703-690-1703. Hours 7:00 AM 6:00 PM M-F, 7:00 AM 4:00 PM Saturday. Tires (maximum of five without rims) will be accepted at the <u>Lorton Landfill only</u>! Call first!
- <u>I-66 Transfer Station</u>, 4618 West Ox Road, Fairfax. Phone 703-631-1179. Hours 6:00 AM 7:00 PM daily. Hazardous waste, Thursday 1:00 PM - 5:00 PM, Friday 8:00 AM - 12 NOON, Saturday 9:00 AM - 4:00 PM.

Brush delivered to these recycling centers will be shredded into mulch. Therefore, the brush must be free from other debris. Brush containing stumps, rock, metal, etc. will not be accepted because these items damage shredding equipment. Residents may obtain free shredded wood mulch at both these recycling centers.

THIS IS IMPORTANT!! You may not dump your trash at the school prior to the arrival of the County trucks or after the trucks depart! Disposing of private trash on school property, or in school dumpsters, is punishable by a \$100 fine.

We need a volunteer with a pick-up truck for assisting those people who need help getting large, bulky items to the school. Make every effort to get your materials to the school on your own as this pick-up is intended mainly for disabled or elderly residents. We do not have sufficient volunteers to clean out basements. To offer assistance or schedule a pick-up, call Jim Hickey at 703-321-8535. For instructions on where to dispose of hazardous waste, call 703-324-5068, and for where to dispose of stumps, rocks and tile, call 703-690-1703.

MEDICAL RESERVE CORP NEEDS HELP!

You do not have to be a doctor or nurse, or even have a medical background, to become a volunteer with the Fairfax Medical Reserve Corps (MRC). The Fairfax MRC is an all volunteer program designed to augment the ability of our public health system to help our community when disaster strikes. MRC volunteers may be called on to provide emergency assistance, like staffing medication dispensing sites. It takes just ten hours of training to make a difference in your community. TRIMMING TREES

Winter is a good time to prune deciduous trees. Once the foliage has dropped, it's easier to get a look at the branching structure and spot any potential problems. Richard Eaton, an arborist, shares the following tips for pruning small or recently planted deciduous trees:

- Prune out any diseased or broken limbs.
- Remove branches that cross over one another.
- Remove branches that go against the flow of the tree's natural habit (i.e. upward pointing branches on a weeping tree).
- Avoid pruning branches completely flush with the trunk or major limbs; make cuts slightly above the junction point, leaving the branch "collar" intact.
- Don't use wound sealants; trees have a natural ability to heal themselves.
- Try not to disrupt the natural architecture of the tree.
- Be conservative; cut only branches you are confident need to be removed.
- For safety, use tools that allow you to reach up into the canopy, such as pole pruner, rather than climbing up on a ladder. If you need a ladder, says Eaton, it's probably time to call a certified arborist.






