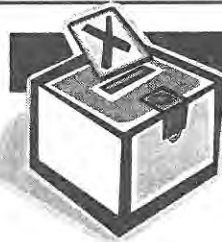
**FROM THE PRESIDENT:**

It's truly amazing how fast time flies during the holiday season. The chilly temperatures have arrived, the trees are now bare, and winter officially begins on December 2. If you haven't already done so, now is a great time to winterize your home. Our community is made of up houses built with quality construction. Whenever I'm doing home improvement projects and have exposed infrastructure I enjoy examining the architecture and building methods. It makes me appreciate the materials and craftsmanship. If properly maintained, these homes are built to last. As they say, an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. Here are a few items to keep in mind as you prepare for winter:

- I think the most important of all is preparing against frozen pipes. Garden hoses should be drained, but if you can't disconnect them from the spigot to prevent seepage, you can shut off the pipe from inside and, if equipped, remove the drain cap, drain, but just put it back on halfway. Don't forget to retighten in the Spring! Our homes are predominantly brick and masonry so you typically don't see a lot of frozen pipes. It never hurts to increase your odds, though.

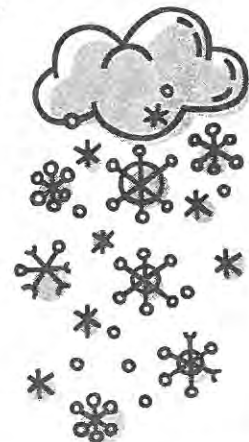

- Remove leaves and debris sitting on the gutters and near the ends of drains. If you have screens, try using a leaf blower to remove any build-up. Otherwise, you may want to scoop out any debris that could block melting snow from properly draining -which could refreeze and create dangerous icicles.
- If you have rain barrels it's a good idea to drain them as well to prevent damage to the barrel from expanding ice.
- Even if you're not burning wood it's still a good idea to have your chimney inspected and/or cleaned if it's been a while. It not only alerts you to potential problems (that could develop into expensive repairs) but also reduces the likelihood of chimney fires. Oftentimes cracks form in the concrete on the chimney cap which will grow each winter from ice seepage. While chimney sweeps may suggest pricey protective coating applications to prevent this, a good budget alternative is a can of Rust-Oleum LeakSeal flexible rubber coating. You can find this at hardware and home good stores, like Home Depot, for about \$10. It easily sprays on and creates an impermeable synthetic barrier between your masonry/brick and the elements that lasts for years.
- Lastly, don't forget a good snow shovel, ice scraper, and a new set of windshield wipers if they're overdue.

Enjoy the rest of the year and see you in 2013. Think snow!

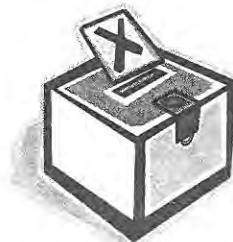

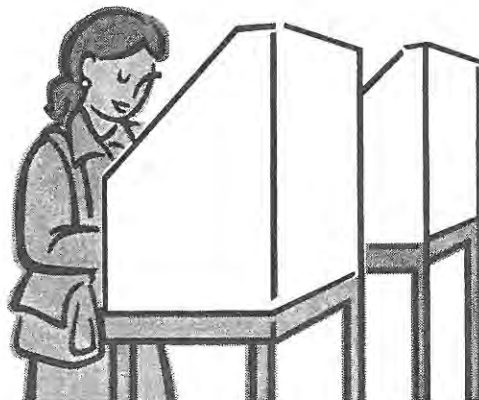

## HOW TO GET TICKETS TO THE PRESIDENTIAL INAUGURATION

Interested in attending the presidential inauguration across the Potomac in January? There are a limited number of tickets and your best bet is to request them—now—from your member of Congress. Each Senator and Representative receives a limited quantity of free tickets that they may distribute to the public at their discretion.



Congressman Gerry Connolly, Congressman Frank Wolf, and Congressman Moran, as well as Senator Mark Warner all have tickets available. Some congressional offices had December 7 deadlines to request tickets but others may still be taking requests.

In 2009, President Obama's inauguration attracted 1.8 million to the National Mall, according to an estimate from the Washington Post. President Obama's swearing-in will take place at noon Monday, January 21 on the West Front of the U.S. Capitol. (He'll be sworn in privately the day before, due to a constitutional requirement that he be sworn in by Jan. 20, since the 20th falls on a Sunday.) If you don't get a ticket, there are large screens set up on the mall to watch the goings-on.

Viewing the swearing-in ceremonies from the National Mall does not require tickets. The non-ticketed area of the National Mall begins at Fourth Street NW.

The swearing-in and address will be followed by a parade down Pennsylvania Avenue, which is open to the public. Many states have their own inaugural balls and Virginia typically is part of the Mid-Atlantic Ball. No details out yet on it. ## PRESIDENTIAL INAUGURATION FACTS, PRECEDENTS, & FIRSTS

Since 1901, the Joint Congressional Committee on Inaugural Ceremonies has been responsible for the planning and execution of the swearing-in ceremonies and the luncheon for the Inauguration of the President of the United States at the U.S. Capitol. The following information is from the JCCIC's website.

The fifty-seventh Inaugural Ceremonies will be held Monday, January 21, 2013. An official, private swearing-in will be held Sunday, January 20 in order to comply with the constitutional requirement that the president be sworn in by January 20 and still stay within the precedent of not holding the ceremony on a Sunday.

The warmest presidential inauguration on record was the forty-ninth, Ronald Reagan's first, with a high of 55F. The coldest was four years later for his second with a noon temperature of 7F.

The Marine Band first played at Thomas Jefferson's inauguration and has played at every inauguration since then. His was also the first inauguration held in Washington, DC. In 1797, John Adams was the first president to receive the oath of office from the Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court. James Madison's inauguration in 1809 was the first to have an Inaugural Ball. It took place at Long's Hotel and tickets cost \$4. Andrew Jackson's second Inauguration was the first time two Inaugural balls were held and Zachary Taylor's was the first to have three balls. Franklin Pierce cancelled the Inaugural Ball. Harry Truman reinstated the Inaugural Ball.

## VDOT TO MEET SNOW WITH 4,000 PLOW TRUCKS

When Northern Virginia gets snow this winter, the Virginia Department of Transportation says it's ready to meet it head-on, with a \$55 million budget and new resources, including technology that allows for more efficient plowing and an increased road-salt supply.

At a briefing about the department's winter preparedness plans Wednesday in Fairfax, Branco Vlacich, VDOT's Northern Virginia maintenance engineer, said 4,000 trucks would be available to plow snow and keep roads clear this winter — 1,000 more trucks than VDOT had during the harsh winter of 2010.

About 2,200 of the 4,000 trucks will be equipped with Automatic Vehicle Locator (AVL) technology, enabling officials to locate plow trucks and deploy them to the nearest emergency areas. About 97 percent of the trucks have been contracted by VDOT.

After the extreme snowfalls of the 2009-2010 winter and last year's extremely mild winter, Chris Strong, a meteorologist with the National Weather Service, said Virginia commuters should be prepared for something in-between — "near-average" snowfall this coming winter.

That doesn't mean snowfalls of years past aren't in mind: The agency says it's preparing for all kinds of scenarios. A new facility near the Beltway and Van Dorn Street in Alexandria will store up to 22,000 tons of salt — a hot commodity the Commonwealth almost ran out of during the 2010 storm, Vlacich said.

During a snow storm on the afternoon of January 26, 2011, traffic came to an absolute standstill on many major thoroughfares and commuters went as far as abandoning their cars on the roads.

Vlacich, who noted traffic as one of the department's largest challenges this year, said VDOT would be working closely with the federal government to try to avoid a repeat of the mess, and urged residents to stay off of the roads in the event of snow, encouraging them to telework if need be. If the roads are clogged with traffic during a snow-storm, the trucks become useless, he said.

When possible, trucks will be pre-deployed to priority locations in order avoid traffic, he said. "My great fear is the traffic," Vlacich said. "I have visions of 4,000 trucks sitting still."

The I-495 Express Lanes will be one of VDOT's top priorities in the event of snow. Seven trucks will flush brine — a solution of salt and water — to clear snow that accumulates in the lanes down the drains on the Beltway. Ice will be another challenge, Strong said, likening the impact of an ice storm this winter to that of June's devastating derecho.

VDOT will also be using a new mobile weather station, allowing officials to determine on-road conditions and ensure roads are properly treated with anti-icing chemicals.

Residents will also be able to check plowing progress in their neighborhoods through a new online tool. After more than two inches of snowfall, people can look to see whether plowing has begun, has been completed or has yet to start in their area. "We're all in this together," Vlacich said. "When the roads are clear, we all win."

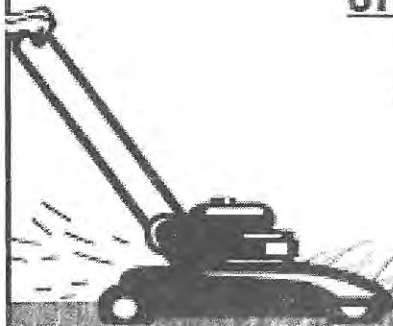

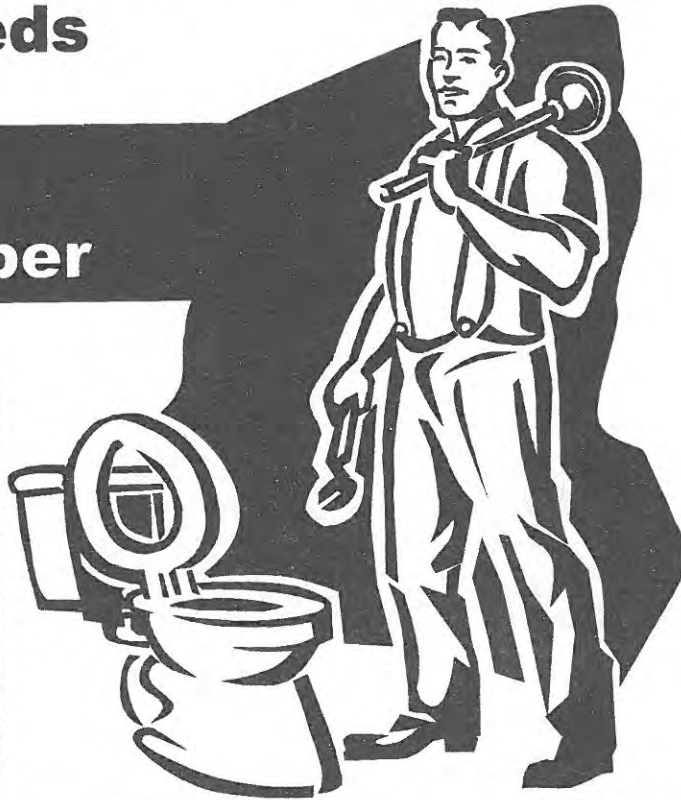

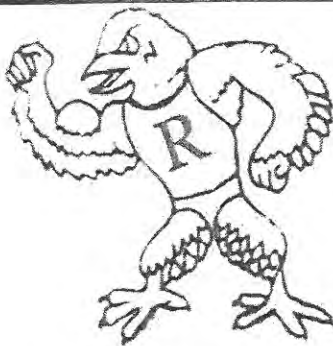
