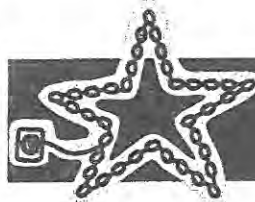

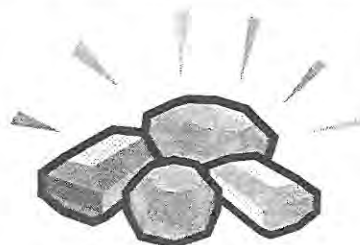
POTHoles: REPORT 'EM OR THEY WON'T GET FIXED

PARKWOOD WEE: PRESCHOOL COULDN'T BE CLOSER

When we moved here in summer 2011, I knew we'd already missed the January registration deadlines for preschools. I was bummed. Our three-year-old was furious. Last winter, a neighbor mentioned that the Weekday Early Education (WEE) Center at Parkwood Baptist Church might have an opening. She also said the classes run from 10:00am to 2:00pm. That sounded ideal for our "we-don't-do-mornings" family so I checked them out. I found a "gem" of a preschool four and a half minutes from our door. They did have an opening and our daughter started in March. Within days, she had 12 new friends and three favorite teachers. She had such fun-filled days that she again needed naps, which made mama happy. Besides science, music, chapel, library, lunch, center times, snack, craft times, math, and show and tell, there's a great playground that includes Kelly's Sand House. As with the playground at the Ravensworth Pool, the sandbox house was built in memory of Kelly Karlinchak from our neighborhood. The WEE Center's current director, Ann (Asiello) Lipton, grew up on Inverchapel Road and her kids still hang out here with their grandparents. The WEE Center started just ten years after my house was built so I guess it qualifies as a neighborhood institution.

If you're looking for a one-, two-, three-, or four-day preschool program for your child between the ages of one and a half and five, I can personally recommend the WEE Center as a nearby, loving, and challenging (in a good way) choice. Even if you just want to give your potty-trained child an hour of enrichment (and yourself a break) one to three days a week, the WEE Center's after-school (2-3pm) classes are a great option. They even have periodic classes for parents on topics such as child development and kindergarten readiness. The readers of Washington Family Magazine voted The WEE Center "Best for Families" in 2012 and our family absolutely concurs more.



The WEE Center will hold its annual open house January 24 from 6:30-8:00pm or you can schedule a tour any time by calling the office. Open registration for the 2013-14 school year begins February 26. I know it's a bare bones theater with a simple, old school, concession area, but it's just the right price for me and offers the kind of thinking person's film I enjoy (Arbitrage, Argo, Anna Karenina, Zero Dark Thirty, Hyde Park on the Hudson) along with a few block-busters (Skyfall) thrown in. And, sometimes, if the movie has been in theaters for a while, I have the whole place to myself!



It's located at Fair City Mall at Pickett and Main. Its web address is www.cinemaartstheatre.com. The ticket prices fit my pocket book:

Before 11:00 AM: - \$6.00

Matinee, before 6 PM: \$8.00

Wednesday Seniors (60+): \$5:00, and all day Wednesday

Evening Prices General Admission: \$10.50

Evening Prices: Seniors (60+), Children (12 and under), College Students w/valid current ID: \$8.00

The proprietor even sends out e-newsletters announcing coming attractions of new films with a bit of industry gossip thrown in. To sign up, email newsletters-join@cinemaartstheatre.com.

Get a bite to eat before/after the movie at First Watch, near Ulta, across the parking lot from Best Buy. Only open until 2:30PM, offers breakfast and lunch fare at a reasonable price.

I know Angelika is the new kid in town (Merrifield) but along with the new, sleek, flashy exterior comes New York City prices: General Admission until 4:00 PM = \$13!!!! Seniors (60+) \$12!!! Children (3-11) \$10!!! Other deals are available, but trying to keep all the exceptions in my head makes me dizzy (Mon – Thur before Noon: \$6, Wed. 4-7PM: \$8, Baby Boomers (55+): \$7 including free popcorn with the purchase of a drink!!). I have to admit, I've not been in the theater, so if someone who's been there can recommend it, let us know! (Parking seems terrible, have to park in one of two parking structures, a la Shirlington! This is why I don't go to Shirlington anymore.)
