
LIKE TO PARTY??? CHECK OUT GOLDEN RAVENS






A CHRISTMAS CAROL DEC. 9

HYPOTHERMIA PREVENTION PROGRAM

The Hypothermia Prevention Program is one of the county's most successful—and important—public-private partnerships. The program relies on nonprofit and faith-based community partners to help carry out the life-saving mission to give the county's most vulnerable neighbors a safe place stay from the cold.

It is thanks to the collaborative efforts of the partnership that no unsheltered individuals died due to hypothermia this past winter.

The hypothermia shelters operate from November through March every year, with a "no turn-away" policy during freezing temperatures at all emergency homeless shelters beginning on Nov. 1. The county worked with partners to visit shelter sites prior to the 2013-2014 season to ensure they met the applicable fire and building codes.

Program Highlights

The Hypothermia Prevention Program:

- Served 1,056 unduplicated individuals during the 2013-2014 season
- Offers 36 shelters across the county—35 of which are places of worship
- Functions using more than 2,300 volunteers to run the shelters

FIVE CAR THINGS TO CHECK BEFORE WINTER ARRIVES

With winter weather just around the corner (sorry!), here's a quick checklist to get your car ready for the cold to come.

Tires – Give them a once-over for wear and tire pressure (they can lose pressure in the cold). If you'll need snow tires, now is a good time to get them.

Wipers – Hard or worn wipers are a danger in bad weather. Think they can handle the snow/hail/road salt/miscellaneous debris they'll soon be facing? If not, replace them

Fluids – Top up your windshield washer fluid and flush and refill your car's coolant system.

Battery – Check that your car's electrical system is properly charged. The last thing you want in the dead of winter is a dead battery.

Heating – Make sure your heating system and window defroster are working properly. You'll thank us when the mercury drops.

If you live in a cold climate, remember to put the ice scraper, floor mats and the rest of your winter supplies back in the car.

HIRING A CONTRACTOR

Editor's Note: This is the second of two articles Detective Loesch and Officer Frey of West Springfield District Station's Crime Prevention Section requested that the Civic Association share with the Ravensworth community.

Home improvements can enhance your home's value and comfort, but choosing the wrong contractor can make the process frustrating and expensive. The wrong contractor can leave you with shoddy work and a poor outcome that you'll need to correct. A few precautions can help you locate a reputable contractor and minimize these kinds of problems

Quick Tips: Hiring a Contractor

- Seek referrals.
- Solicit bids from at least 3 contractors.
- Be wary of "too good to be true" proposals.
- Research the contractor for previous complaints.
- Insist on a written contract that outlines your project and includes starting and completion dates.
- Review all documents before you sign them, including contracts, warranties, and plans.
- Make sure there are no blank spaces on anything you sign.
- Insist upon a written warranty on all materials and work.
- Secure building permits (if necessary) before starting the project and identify the contractor on the application.
- Withhold final payment until the project is completed and inspected.
- Secure a contractor's affidavit that all subcontractors and material suppliers have been paid before making final payment.
- Report any problems to the appropriate licensing board.

Locating a Contractor

Avoid contractors who use aggressive, high-pressure tactics to scare you into working with them. Decline unsolicited pitches from contractors who are "just in the neighborhood," use overly-friendly sales pitches, or quote you a price too good to be true. Comparison shop. Obtain bids from three contractors and ask for three references from each. Ask neighbors, friends, or relatives who have recently completed a home improvement project for their recommendations. The Virginia Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation (DPOR), which licenses contractors, provides information about specific contractors, including their addresses, length of time licensed, and whether they've been the subject of DPOR disciplinary action for violation of DPOR rules. DPOR does not investigate unethical business practices. Visit the DPOR website or call the DPOR at 804-367-8500. To learn if a complaint has been filed by a Fairfax County resident against a contractor, search the complaint history files of the Consumer Affairs Branch.

Hiring a Contractor

Always ask the contractor for a copy of his contractor's license from the Virginia Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation. Verify the license and contact information via the DPOR website or by calling the DPOR at 804-367-8500. Any contractor seeking work through home solicitation also must carry a solicitor license issued by the Fairfax County Department of Cable and Consumer Services (DCCS).

Ask the contractor for his current liability insurance policy. Verify with the contractor's insurance agent that the policy is still in effect and covers your type of project.

Some types of work require a permit. Call the Fairfax County Department of Public Works and Environmental Services' Permits Branch at 703-324-1555, TTY 711, to determine whether a permit is necessary. The Permits Branch also can provide information on each contractor's licensing and disciplinary status.

Don't rely on verbal agreements. Ask the contractor you've selected to prepare a written contract that includes, at a minimum, the contractor's name, street address (not a P.O. box number), license number, a description of the work to be performed (including clean-up) and timetable, the materials to be used, subcontractor names, if any, starting and completion dates, warranty provisions, and a payment schedule based on completion of specific stages of the job.

Read and understand the contract before you sign it. If you don't understand it, consult an attorney. Never rely on the salesperson to read or explain the contract to you. Verify that all oral promises have been put in writing. Make sure all blanks are filled in before signing.

Payment

Con artists and fly-by-night operators typically insist on a large down payment or that you pay in cash before work is done. Once they have the money, they may never return. Your down payment should be as little as you can negotiate with the contractor, but typically no more than 25-30 percent of the total cost. Pay by credit card, not cash. Don't allow payments to get ahead of the work.

Withhold the final payment until the entire project is finished and inspected and you receive a contractor's affidavit affirming that all subcontractors and suppliers have been paid. You don't want to have a mechanic's placed against your property if you've paid the contractor, but he hasn't paid the subcontractors and suppliers.

NEVER TOO YOUNG FOR STROKE

Unless you're a senior citizen, and perhaps even if you are, you probably think you're too young to have a stroke. You're not. Other experts say young stroke patients have higher rates of stroke caused by hemorrhage than elderly patients do. The root of these hemorrhages and clots can vary by age. In elderly patients, high blood pressure and cholesterol are often to blame. Younger stroke victims are more likely than seniors to have a stroke caused by inherited disease affecting the heart or circulatory system. Sadly, that doesn't mean the results will be different. Stroke can cause serious disability, regardless of age. Many people die from stroke, and those who survive can suffer problems with speech, movement, vision, memory and swallowing ... along with other serious issues.

Keeping your heart and vascular system healthy is the best way to avoid stroke. In addition to eating well, exercising frequently and not smoking, that also means regular checkups to keep tabs on your heart and vascular health. If you have a disease that could raise your risk, heed your doctor's instructions to help you stay in the clear.


