COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP "JUNK" TRUCK MARCH 14

The annual Clean-Up Day this year provides an added incentive for "Farmers" to tackle back-yard clutter, messy basements, carports or storage sheds. Jim Hickey, chair of the Civic Association's Green Committee, has arranged for a Fairfax County trash disposal truck to be parked at the Ravensworth Farm SWIMMING POOL parking lot on Saturday, March 14 from 8:00am to noon for the purpose of collecting items which are not accepted by private trash collectors at curbside. Now is the time to get rid of old appliances, furniture, mattresses, boards, doors (no glass), swing sets, lawn mowers (thoroughly drained of fluids), piping, etc.

Items that CANNOT be accepted include hazardous waste (batteries, including the small "button" and rechargeables, paint, used oil, pesticides, and lawn care products), tires, sheetrock, stone or crushed rocks, and products that can be recycled - such as newspapers, cans and glass. Also, brush will not be collected.

THIS IS IMPORTANT!! You may not dump your trash at the pool prior to the arrival of the County trucks or after the trucks depart!

KINDERGARTEN @ RAVENSWORTH ES

If you have a rising kindergartener and have not completed a "Survey of Preschool Children," please contact Ravensworth Elementary School by March 31 to provide them the information. Knowing who is coming in the fall helps the school plan to have the right number of teachers and instructional assistants for kindergarten.



Kindergarten orientation for next year will be Wednesday, April 8 from 6-7:30 pm, at Ravensworth Elementary School. The school would be delighted to accept your child's registration any time. Registration forms are available at fcps.edu/parents/start/kindergarten.shtml. In addition to the registration forms, you will be required to show: a copy of your deed or lease or other proof of where you live, identification for the child's parent or guardian, an original birth certificate for the child, and the state health form completed by a doctor or nurse practitioner after September 1, 2014. The health form is available at http://fcps.edu/it/forms/mch213.pdf so be sure to take it along to your child's next check-up and save the hassle of getting it later.

Virginia law requires that children who will reach their fifth birthday on or before September 30, 2015 must be enrolled in Kindergarten for the 2015-16 school year unless the parent or guardian notifies the school in writing that they do not wish the child to attend school until the following year.



ENERGY DRINK EXPOSURE IN KIDS IS SERIOUS

If energy drinks are your caffeine source of choice, it's crucial you hear this message about the dangers they pose to children. According to a recent study, young kids who consume energy drinks can suffer some serious health woes, such as cardiovascular and neurological problems.

A research team led by a Wayne State University doctor reviewed data from 55 U.S. poison control centers, focusing on calls regarding exposure to energy substances, such as energy drinks. They found more than fifty-one-hundred calls about energy drinks over a three-year period ending in 2013. "Unintentional" exposures involving kids under age 5 accounted for 40 percent of the calls. Researchers say these kids likely consumed someone else's energy drink that was left in an accessible place.

Even the tamest energy drinks contain at least double the caffeine found in 12 ounces of Coca-Cola. These levels can cause problems for adults, so just think of the havoc they could wreak for small children. The poison control center stats showed that people of all ages have experienced negative effects related to energy drinks, such as seizures, abnormal heart rhythms and problems with electrical signal conduction in the heart. Other common results of excessive caffeine intake include dehydration, headaches, insomnia and jitteriness.

With all these possible consequences for kids who consume caffeine, it's easy to see why keeping energy beverages away from kids is so important. So be sure you keep those cans of the super-caffeinated stuff out of their reach. And it may be worth considering whether mom, dad and older siblings should find a less potent way to wake up for the day. It certainly wouldn't do anyone any harm to start the day fueled by a little less caffeine.


GMU FINDING NEW WAY TO TREAT BREAST CANCER

A GMU pilot study examines method of tailoring doses of medications for late-stage patients, according to media report. Researchers at George Mason University's campus in Manassas are pursuing a cutting-edge medical study that is extending the lives of late-stage breast cancer patients, according to a Washington TV station.

The pilot study, conducted by the university's Center for Applied Proteomics and Molecular Medicine, involves finding the right drugs to treat a patient's specific tumors, according to a news report by WUSA-9. Close to 60 percent of the 25 patients in the study have seen their lives extended, Channel 9 reports. And funds for the study have come from an unlikely source: high school volleyball teams. A volleyball coach at West Springfield High School launched the fund-raising effort in 2004, and it has spread across the country, raising \$1.5 million a year.

DIGGING? CHECK IF YOU NEED A PERMIT FIRST

Sure, it's winter right now but plenty of neighbors on the Farm are using these winter months to plan their summer landscaping and construction activities.

Before you dig up or dump dirt in your yard, there are some important facts that you should know.

Fairfax County may require you to get permits to clear land, dig up dirt or dump fill dirt. This is because these "land disturbance" actions can cause soil erosion that can harm your home, your neighborhood and our environment. To disturb the land means to cut down trees or shrubs, excavate, grade, or add fill dirt.


When do I need county permits to dig up dirt, dump fill dirt or clear land? You need a site permit and grading plan anytime you will disturb 2,500 square feet or more of land. You also will need to put down a conservation deposit.

Projects that may disturb 2,500 square feet of land include:

- Building an addition to your home.
- Building a large garage or carport.
- Installing a paved driveway or in-ground swimming pool.

Most projects do not need permits and plans, including:

- Gardening or landscaping at home.
- Installing a fence, post or sign (a building permit may be required).
- Digging for individual sewer or water connections.



If you think you may disturb 2,500 square feet of land or more, follow these simple steps:

- Check whether you need a site permit and grading plan.
- Check whether your property is located in a Chesapeake Bay Resource Protection Area; development
 is limited in these areas.

Contact Fairfax County's Site Permits Branch at 703-324-1510, TTY 711 to find out if you need a permit and grading plan or if your property is in a protection area. Also call Miss Utility at 811, TTY 711, before you start digging, so you know where utility lines are buried in your property.

Facts that you should know.

Fairfax County may require you to get permits to clear land, dig up dirt or dump fill dirt.

What does soil erosion cost you?

- It could cause drainage or flooding problems for your home or your neighbors.
- Treating drinking water is more expensive and complicated.
- Sediment increases the growth of bacteria in water, posing a risk to swimmers, livestock and wildlife.
- Tax dollars must be used to pay for cleaning up clogged storm drainage systems that can cause flooding.
- More money must be spent to protect the Potomac River and Chesapeake Bay.

What are clues to possible illegal land disturbance?

- The activity takes place before 7 a.m. or after 7 p.m. or on weekends.
- There is no company name on the construction vehicles or equipment.
- There is no advertising sign for the construction company doing the work at the site.
- The land is being cleared without surveyor's flags on trees.
- There is no construction entrance next to the road (eg. an area of stone and gravel placed to keep mud off of streets)

What should you do if you see potentially illegal digging, filling or clearing?

Call the county's 24-hour environmental hotline at 703-324-1937. The best time to call is when you first see signs of any suspicious activity. Be sure to provide a street address, so inspectors know which property to investigate.

Here are some additional tips:

- Never challenge the property owner or construction company. They may have a permit and be acting legally.
- Never trespass onto private property.
- Always gather as much information as possible such as dates, times, license plate numbers and states, and descriptions of who, what, where and when.

BRAIN WIRING MAY IMPACT GRASP OF SECOND LANGUAGE

Have you ever wondered why some people can learn a second language much easier than others can? The answer may be found in the way our brains are wired.

Researchers at Penn State University have been studying how brain wiring relates to the development of second-language skills. In this study, the researchers also maintain that simply attempting to learn another language will likely give the brain an automatic boost. The findings were published recently in the Journal of Neurolinguistics.

The researchers recruited 39 native English speakers and had 23 of them study Chinese vocabulary for six weeks. The participants' brains were scanned using MRI before and after the trial.

Participants who had the most success learning Chinese also had brains that were better integrated. They had strong connections between certain brain regions, called nodes. The stronger the connections, the faster the nodes work together, fostering better learning and retention.

The study didn't delve into why certain people have brains that are well integrated. Also, the researchers aren't sure of the impact of factors such as stress and motivation on the ability to grasp a second language.

But as an aside, the research suggests that merely studying a second language for a while can positively impact the brain, regardless of the learner's age. And even if you don't have time to tackle another language such as French or Spanish, there are plenty of activities you can do instead that will also exercise the brain.

So when you're playing chess, Scrabble or your favorite card game, the effect goes way beyond good fellowship and competition. You're also giving your brain a great workout.

TAKING A BITE OUT OF RABIES

In this day and age, rabies could be misconstrued as an affliction limited to works of fiction: "Old Yeller," "Cujo" and "To Kill a Mockingbird" come to mind. But rabies is still a threat in our modern world — and not to just animals.

Rabies is a viral disease that is usually transmitted from mammal to mammal through saliva, most often through a bite or scratch. It affects the central nervous system and causes inflammation in the brain.

The most common way humans contract the disease is being bitten by a rabid animal. In the U.S., raccoons, skunks, foxes, bats and coyotes are all known carriers of different strains of rabies. In part thanks to vaccines, these days domestic animals only account for 3 percent of the disease — but 55,000 people still die from rabies around the world annually.

Rabid animals often exhibit symptoms like excessive drool or strange behavior, such as aggression or turning in circles. Wild animals with the disease often show no fear of humans.

If you are bitten or scratched by a rabid — or possibly rabid — animal, wash the wound immediately with soap and water and contact your physician or local health department.

The first symptoms in humans usually include an itching sensation at the site of the bite, followed by weariness, restlessness, agitation and muscle spasms. Once the symptoms actually start, which can vary from 10 days to seven years after infection, the disease is almost always fatal; an infected person usually dies from respiratory failure within seven days of symptom onset. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports less than 10 documented cases of human survival from rabies without prophylactic treatment.

Rabies is no fictional foe — if there's a chance you've been infected, seek medical attention immediately.


