FROM THE PRESIDENT

I hope this April issue finds you well and looking forward to spring. It's been a cold winter and as of this writing (it's still early March) we're still under snow. I won't hesitate to admit I love snow even this late in the season. I had a rare opportunity this winter to use an antique snow blower for the first time. It's from the late 60's or early 70's and originally came from the couple we bought the house from who lived here 33 years. I had it tuned up this fall and it worked! We haven't had a lot of snow, just a lot of cold weather which kept the snow on the ground for a long time. But I think it's time to start thinking about more outdoor activities.

Unfortunately my last letter missed the March Farmer deadline so a lot of my updates didn't make it but there are a few that are still relevant.

Speeding. I proposed an anti-speeding resolution. It's largely symbolic but shows the community we're serious about the problem. Second, your board recently asked the county to perform a **traffic calming study** on Queensberry, Inverchapel, Ellet, and Moultrie roads to see if they qualify for the additional \$200 fine for speeding tickets. The study comes at no cost and is non-binding. Speeding has been at the top of our community's list of concerns for a number of years now and recently Supervisor Cook's office (along with our other





MARCH 26 MEETING WIN A FREE TABLET & OTHER GOODIES

RAIN BARREL WORKSHOPS

As part of a regional initiative, the district offers build-your-own rain barrel workshops and also distributes low-cost rain barrels to Fairfax County citizens. At the workshops, you will learn how to install and maintain a rain barrel and take one home! Rain barrels can be placed under downspouts to capture runoff from your roof. Rain barrels can save both money and water. Instead of water from the tap or faucet, you can use the water you've saved to keep your home landscape happy and growing. Furthermore, installing a rain barrel means that you will be protecting the Chesapeake Bay. Water stored in your rain barrel won't rush off into our streams. Instead, as you use the stored rain water around the home and garden, it will absorb slowly into the ground replenishing groundwater supplies. By decreasing the volume of storm runoff, rain barrels also help moderate stream erosion and the resulting pollution that is impairing the Chesapeake Bay.

Registration is required for all programs. The fee per barrel is \$55.00 for build-your-own workshops and \$65.00 per barrel for distribution events. To register visit http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/nvswcd/rainbarrels.htm for more information.

U-HAUL IT REZONING AT MARCH 26 MEETING

A re-zoning application, submitted by the Port Royal Rd U-Haul has now been accepted for review and comment. The property in question is an approximately five (5) acre parcel located at 5271 and 5285 Port Royal Road on which a warehouse built in 1963 is located. The Property is currently zoned I-4. The Applicant seeks to rezone the property to I-5 to use the land as a U Haul It facility for the rental of trucks of various sizes and to construct, within the warehouse building, a three-level self-storage component which would also be operated by U Haul. Supervisor Cook's office will host a community input meeting at Community of Christ Church on March 26 at 7:00p.m. in conjunction with the general membership meeting of the Ravensworth Farm Civic Association.

JOIN RAVENSWORTH'S NEW COMMUNITY SUPPORTED AGRICULTURE (CSA)

Fresh fruits and vegetables delivered straight to our Farm! by Jen Auble

Lancaster Farm Fresh Cooperative (LFFC) is a non-profit organic farmers cooperative of 75 farmers in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. This year, LFFC has a weekend pick-up location in Ravensworth Farm on Inverchapel Road.

LFFC provides fresh, certified organic fruits, vegetables, and other farm-fresh products through a subscription program known as Community Supported Agriculture (CSA). CSA members commit to support LFFC farmers for the entire growing season by pre-paying for their share of the harvest in the winter and early spring. The farmers are able to purchase supplies in the winter and start their crops in early spring. They repay the shareholders in fresh, organic, seasonal produce. CSAs enable you to keep local sustainable farms and local food safe for future generations. The produce sold through LFFC is certified organic unless otherwise noted.

As a current shareholder, I can say that it has been a very enjoyable experience and I am very excited to have a location in our neighborhood. Tell your friends from nearby neighborhoods how easy it will be to get fresh veggies and fruits. It's even closer than the Farmer's Market.

<u>How does it work?</u> Every Thursday, the list of items on the share is emailed out to members, so that everyone can menu plan for the coming weekend's delivery in Ravensworth Farm. There are active Facebook and Pinterest sites where members share recipes that they are making using the produce from the week's share. At pick-up, there's a "swap box" to which you can add produce from your share box that your family doesn't eat as much of and take more of something your family likes better. (The swap box works best if you're among the first to pick up your share after delivery.)

What does it cost? This spring/summer season is 26 weeks this year from May to October. LFFC has five share options available for vegetables, which allows families of all sizes to participate. Best of all, the produce is very affordable and ranges from \$14-\$31 per week for veggies (depending on share size) and \$11 per week for

en, meat, cheese, bread, and egg shares available.

COMPENSATION INCREASE APPROVED FOR BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

For the first time since 2008, the Board of Supervisors at its meeting March 4 approved a compensation increase for members of the board. The increase will be effective Jan. 1, 2016, and will apply to the board members and chairman elected on Nov. 3, 2015.

Currently all board members receive an annual salary of \$75,000. Beginning next year, the chairman's salary will be \$100,000 and other board members will receive \$95,000.

As Board of Supervisors Chairman Sharon Bulova explained, the timing of salary adjustments is established by state law, which mandates that increases can only be approved after a public hearing is held and no later than April 15 of any year in which there is an election for board members. A public hearing was held at the Jan. 27 board meeting.

HELP WITH TAX PREPARATION

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program in Fairfax County serves individuals or families with a 2014 income of \$52,000 or less. Last tax season, low-income families in this area saved over \$1.1 million in tax preparation fees by having their tax returns prepared for free by volunteers in the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program (VITA). These families received over \$8 million in refunds and credits. Clients bring their social security cards, W2s, and other documents to one of twenty locations in the area and are generally served on a first come, first-served basis. They are greeted by volunteers who help organize documents and then meet with a trained and tested volunteer who prepares their returns using professional software provided by the IRS. Translators and IT support volunteers also assist. If you are interested in volunteering, or if you know someone who is eligible for the program, call James Do at 703-533-5471, or email james.do@fairfaxcounty.gov.

The AARP Free Tax-Aide Assistance Program has close to 300 Volunteers, certified by IRS, who will assist taxpayers in the preparation and submittal of their Virginia and Federal tax returns. They are located at thirteen sites in Northern Virginia to provide this service free of cost for taxpayers with low and middle incomes. Assistance is available through April 15 and all returns are filed electronically. Remember to bring documents, such as last year's tax return, a photo ID, and your Social Security card. Residents with illnesses or infirmities, which confine them to their homes, may schedule appointments with AARP by calling 703-594-6576. WORLD POLICE & FIRE GAMES OPEN IN FAIRFAX JUNE 26

The World Police & Fire Games are a spectacular international sporting event, offering police officers, firefighters, customs and correction officers from around the world an opportunity to showcase their athletic excellence in 'Olympic' style sporting events. Held biennially, the Games will be held in Fairfax County, VA in 2015, Montreal in 2017 and Chengdu, China in 2019

The Fairfax 2015 World Police & Fire Games are scheduled between 26 June and 5 July. Opening Ceremonies will be held at the historical RFK Stadium in Washington, D.C. and Closing Ceremonies located at the Wolf Trap for the Performing Arts in Fairfax County, VA. FIVE WAYS TO SPOT SCAM "IRS" CALLS

The Internal Revenue Service issued a consumer alert today providing taxpayers with additional tips to protect themselves from telephone scam artists calling and pretending to be with the IRS.

These callers may demand money or may say you have a refund due and try to trick you into sharing private information. These con artists can sound convincing when they call. They may know a lot about you, and they usually alter the caller ID to make it look like the IRS is calling. They use fake names and bogus IRS identification badge numbers. If you don't answer, they often leave an "urgent" callback request.

"These telephone scams are being seen in every part of the country, and we urge people not to be deceived by these threatening phone calls," IRS Commissioner John Koskinen said. "We have formal processes in place for people with tax issues. The IRS respects taxpayer rights, and these angry, shake-down calls are not how we do business."

The IRS reminds people that they can know pretty easily when a supposed IRS caller is a fake. Here are five things the scammers often do but the IRS will not do. Any one of these five things is a tell-tale sign of a scam. The IRS will never:

- 1. Call to demand immediate payment, nor will we call about taxes owed without first having mailed you a bill.
- 2. Demand that you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.
- 3. Require you to use a specific payment method for your taxes, such as a prepaid debit card.
- 4. Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- 5. Threaten to bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have you arrested for not paying.

If you get a phone call from someone claiming to be from the IRS and asking for money, here's what you should do:


- If you know you owe taxes or think you might owe, call the IRS at 1.800.829.1040. The IRS workers can help you with a payment issue.
- If you know you don't owe taxes or have no reason to believe that you do, report the incident to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration (TIGTA) at 1.800.366.4484 or at www.tigta.gov.

Remember, too, the IRS does not use unsolicited email, text messages or any social media to discuss your personal tax issue. For more information on reporting tax scams, go to www.irs.gov and type "scam" in the search box.
