PUTTING CHILDREN IN HARMS WAY

by A Concerned Neighbor

I am not sure who needs education more, children or parents. Twice daily, I observe parents ignoring the procedure for the safe student drop off and pick up at the Ravensworth Elementary School and putting their children in harm's way. Letters and student take-home notices have clearly stated that parents approach the "kiss and ride" drop off by using Gosport Drive and turning North onto Nutting and then turning right into the school parking lot. A majority of parents follow this procedure which works very efficiently and provides safety for the children. But there are several parents who insist on driving South on Nutting and parking in front of homeowner's driveways and a fire hydrant. They then leave their cars and "jaywalk" their children across Nutting to escort them to the school while dodging the Northbound traffic. On several occasions, teachers who were assigned to assist as crossing guards were almost run down by the opposing traffic.

To the parents that are doing this I have two questions. One, why are you placing your children in this harmful situation? Two why are you teaching your children that it's okay to break the law by parking across driveways and in front of fire hydrants?

Let me educate you. According to Fairfax Ordnances, vehicles shall be kept at least 10 feet from the nearest driveway and 15 feet from the nearest fire hydrant. If you don't care about paying the fine, why not consider the safety of your child?

<u>SCHOOL TRAFFIC ON NUTTING DR</u>

During school drop off and dismissal times (8:05-8:25am and 3:10-3:30pm), Kiss 'n Ride traffic comes north on Nutting Dr from Gosport Ln into the school. Then traffic exits the school by turning right on Nutting Dr and continuing north to Ellet Rd. Southbound traffic will not be allowed to turn left into the school during these hours.

SCHOOL SCHEDULE CHANGES

If it seems you're seeing kids scurrying to school at a different time than last year- you're right! Ravensworth Elementary's bell schedule changed this year. From most perspectives, it's a positive change as students have an extra ten minutes to sleep. Students may arrive at school as early as 8:05, may go to their classrooms at 8:15, and are tardy at 8:25. Dismissal is at 3:10pm. Lake Braddock's Middle and High school students caught a break, too. Their bus now comes through the neighborhood around 7:30, about 45 minutes later than previous years, with the afternoon bus passing through around 3:15.



SEWER PIPES - OUT OF SIGHT; OUT OF MIND

Most of us don't think about it, but if you live in one of the original 1960s-era homes in Ravensworth Farm (which means most of us), each time you flush a toilet, take a shower, or just turn on a faucet, you are sending water—plus whatever it's carrying—down a sewer pipe that was new when President Kennedy was in office, TV shows were black and white, and men used lots of Vitalis (which wasn't what it sounds like).

In the intervening half century, that sewer pipe has carried a lot of content and been subject to tree roots, ordinary corrosion, and (perhaps) soil collapse; its present condition is anyone's guess. Estimates vary from 50 to nearly 100 years before we should expect failure, but they're all approaching that age where a sewer back-up *could* mean a plumber's snake can't fix it anymore and it's time to call in the big guns (read "backhoe").

If you expect to be in your home for at least the next few years, you may wish to be apprised of a process that's available for **relining** the sewer pipe with a fresh epoxy inner sleeve which essentially renews the sewer line's life for another 50 years and avoids the more expensive prospect of the aforementioned backhoe...with attendant damage to lawns, trees, or driveways.

This treatment is called CIPP (cured-in-place piping), and it is done by first clearing the pipe of roots, rust, and other blockages, inserting a flexible "sock" into the pipe (which is impregnated with an epoxy resin) at the basement access point (or cleanout joint), pushing it out under the yard all the way to the street tie-in at the common sewer line, expanding it to hug the inside of the original pipe, and letting it cure rock hard in a couple hours. The resulting inner liner becomes the new pipe, rendering any defects of the original one harmless.

Dynamic Drain, a company that performs this service, met with several RF residents on Aug 13 to explain how this works (the PowerPoint presentation is available at the email address below). Part of that presentation is the following information: An initial video inspection, documentation, and grading of your sewer line (from 1 to 5, depending on your pipe's condition) is performed to know what faults currently exist. The condition of each will obviously be unique. They estimate that their 2-man crews can perform 4 inspections in a day, and they would charge \$1600 for a day's labor, making the cost to 4 homeowners \$400 each—for the inspection and a detailed documentation of your pipe.

After generating that report, they would then give each homeowner a proposal for relining their sewer pipe as described above. (Cost for each home would vary based on length of pipe from basement to main sewer line and other factors.)

The cost of the inspection is **deducted** from the lining cost, if done.

So if anyone is interested in having an inspection, please email me and I'll compile as many groups of four home-owners as I can and send them to Dynamic for a contract. You'll be more likely to be with three other people the earlier I get your email. Those who can't be matched would be unable to enjoy a 4-way cost split. I won't refer your name to Dynamic unless and until there's three others with you.

Residents who frequent the Facebook page for Ravensworth Farm knew about this in August, so some of their inspections are in the works now. I don't mean to make you feel rushed, and this may be a "bad time" for you—I get that. But if Dynamic charges a "per day" labor rate that can be shared, this may be a train that passes by just once.

Caveats: I don't represent Dynamic Drain, have no financial stake in your participation, and no one appointed me to run interference for Dynamic. Like most homeowners with a 50+ year-old home, I like to save on major improvements when possible, and—as I implied in a prior Farmer piece—not spending money can sometimes prove more costly than spending it. This may be one such time.

COMMUNITY SUPPORTED AGRICULTURE

Fresh fruits and vegetables are being delivered directly to Ravensworth Farm! by Jennifer Auble

Lancaster Farm Fresh Cooperative (LFFC) is a non-profit organic farmers cooperative of 75 farmers in Lancaster County Pennsylvania. LFFC provides fresh, certified organic fruits, vegetables, and other farm fresh products through a subscription program also known as Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program. CSA members commit to support LFFC farmers for the entire growing season by paying for their share of the harvest in the winter and early spring. The farmers are able to purchase supplies in the winter and start their crops in early spring, they repay the shareholders in fresh, organic, seasonal produce. CSA enables you to keep local sustainable farms and local food safe for future generations. The produce sold through LFFC is certified organic unless otherwise noted.

This fall season, from the first week of November for 8 consecutive weeks, LFFC has a medium and a large share option. The produce ranges from \$21-\$32 per week for veggies (depending on share size) and \$7.40 per week for fruit. In addition to fruits and vegetables, there are also chicken, meat, cheese, bread, omnivore, vegan and egg shares available.

Every Thursday, the list of items on the share is emailed out to help with meal planning. On a weekly basis (weekend day), everyone picks up their share at a home in Ravensworth Farm. There are active Facebook and Pinterest sites where community members share recipes that they are making using the vegetables that we receive. It's really that simple!

We need 30 shares to make this a viable site. As a current shareholder, I can say that it has been a very enjoyable experience and I am very excited to be able to host a location in our neighborhood.


In addition to The Ravensworth Farmer and the Ravensworth Farm Directory, the Civic Association also funds:
