RFCA Lifetime Achievement Award -- An award to recognize stalwarts of the community who have devoted years of effort and service to the Ravensworth Farm community.



COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP IS BACK ON!

Thanks to the efforts of many, the Community Clean-Up is back on. Bring your junk to the school parking lot between 8 and 11:00 on May 20. (This is the weekend after the Community-Wide Yard Sale so you can get rid of anything that didn't sell.) Since Fairfax County lost Ravensworth Farm's request for a county "junk truck" to be here in March, Civic Association President Allan Robertson worked out an agreement with another neighborhood to piggyback on that neighborhood's "junk truck." However, the neighborhood's logistics couldn't support the traffic from its own residents and Ravensworth Farm as well.

When Johnny Irizarry and Ravensworth Farm resident Tom Bruce, both of TJJR's Plumbing, heard about the problem, they offered a solution. TJJR will provide a truck and trailer to move Ravensworth Farm's combined junk to the other neighborhood without unduly impacting their traffic. So, bring your junk to the Ravensworth Elementary School parking lot between 8:00 and 11:00 am on May 20 and send it on its way. The Boy Scouts will be there to help you unload. If you have a larger item or two and need the truck to come to you, call Jim Hickey in advance at 703-321-8535 to arrange for pickup. (Please no wholesale basement or garage cleanouts, though.) If you need plumbing help, call TJJR Plumbing at 703-864-3599 or tjjrplumbling.com and thank them for helping the Ravensworth Farm neighborhood.

The Junk Truck ACCEPTS the following kinds of trash:

old appliances (non-working- if it works, let Dominion Power haul it away and give you \$50 from Dominion's appliance recycling program), furniture, mattresses, boards, doors (no glass), swing sets, lawn mowers (thoroughly drained of fluids), piping, etc.

The Junk Truck DOES NOT ACCEPT these items:

hazardous waste (batteries, including the small "button" and rechargeables, paint, used oil, pesticides and lawn care products), tires, sheetrock, stone or crushed rocks, and products that can be recycled - such as newspapers, cans and glass. Also, brush will not be collected.

DOG PARKS NOW & FUTURE: FIND 'EM

I want to tell you about an important new resource for our Ravensworth community. It is a great new website for dogs and their owners looking for dog parks. It also will provide benefit to those who may be trying to get a dog park established near their home. Lake Accotink has traditionally been a very dog-friendly venue and adding an Off-Leash Dog Area would become a great community asset.

Mr. Steve Beste, a Ravenswoth resident and long-time active member of the Civic Association, worked on this project to develop a website about dog parks that you can see at: http://arcg.is/2naRLEw

1. For dog owners, it maps where all the Northern Virginia dog parks are, with links to features, directions, Yelp reviews, and pictures.

2. It maps where the dogs are, based on dog license data that was collected from the 6 local jurisdictions that license dogs. This has never been done before.

3. For people planning new dog parks, it shows the possible land parcels that meet County requirements for dog park locations (or, as the Fairfax County rules call them Off Leash Dog Areas (OLDAs).)

A chance encounter spurred Mr. Beste's interest in geographical information systems (GIS). He was so interested in fact, that he enrolled at George Mason University. Data? Maps? Computers? Theory and hands-on work with the cartographic software? He was definitely into the possibilities!

Interestingly, the term paper for the course was to be not a paper at all, but a research question that can be answered geographically. Steve came up with his question: Where are the best locations for future dog parks in Fairfax County given the dog population and suitable park land? What put it in his mind was all those afternoons taking his daughter's dog, Kiva, to the local dog park in Arlington. It was the highlight of his day - and a pleasure for Steve, too. Let's get more dog parks!

The county provided a spreadsheet with dog licenses information, including street addresses. Following data cleanup, geolocation of addresses (finding their latitude and longitude for mapping) Mr. Beste had developed a tool that people can use to see where the dogs are, for the first time, really.

The result of the project was a printed map, a PowerPoint presentation, and a 5-minute video. That was fine for the professor, but useless for dog owners looking to enjoy a romp with their dogs or for promoting dog parks in the county. For that, Steve has placed the map online and made it interactive. So, taking the project beyond the class-room, he has included the other jurisdictions that license dogs and created a truly useful tool for our community. 

The Little Free Library nonprofit organization has been honored by the Library of Congress, the National Book Foundation, and the American Library Association, and Reader's Digest named them one of the "50 Surprising Things We Love about America." APPLIANCE RECYCLING REBATE PROGRAM ENDS MAY 31

By Dominion Virginia Power—If you're a Dominion Virginia Power customer, you can easily get rid of your old secondary refrigerator or freezer. We'll pick up the appliance at no cost and you'll receive a \$50 incentive for participating. In addition, you can also slash your electric bills by removing the inefficient appliance that may be using quite a bit of energy. However, don't wait too long, as this program will be closing and no longer accepting new participants for pick-ups (subject to funding availability) after May 31, 2017. All rebates will be paid by July 31, 2017.

According to the EPA, replacing an inefficient refrigerator can save about \$120 per year. This program is only available to residential customers. Refrigerator or freezer units must be at least 10 years old and between 10 to 32 cubic feet capacity. All units must be in working condition and operating to qualify and may have to meet additional Terms & Conditions.

Contact us at 1-888-366-8280 or online at www.arcaincutility.com to schedule an appointment. You will need your Dominion Account number (for the location where we will be picking up the appliance), so having it available before you call will speed up the enrollment process. On the day of the appointment, the contractor will inspect your refrigerator or freezer to ensure it qualifies for the program. Upon inspection, the contractor will collect the unit and provide you with a receipt of collection for your records.

Your rebate application will be filed automatically following the collection. You can check your rebate status using Manage Your Account or by calling 1-888-366-8280. Your rebate check will be mailed directly to you. You are eligible to recycle two qualifying appliances per account over the life of the program.

SOLAR FOR YOUR HOUSE

For a limited time, residents and businesses can get discounted prices on solar panels through Solarize Fairfax County. Like a Groupon for solar, this program offers one-time, low prices with companies chosen through competitive bids. Fairfax County is partnering with the Northern Virginia Regional Commission and nonprofit Local Energy Assistance Program to offer this program. Solarize Fairfax County runs from April 18 through June 30 (last information session is June 5). To get started saving on your electric bill:

- Sign up for a free solar assessment. No commitment to install solar is required.
- Attend an information session between now and June 5 (see schedule at http://solarizenova.org/events) to learn whether solar is right for you, understand pricing and financing options and meet the contractors who will install your equipment.


