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SAVE LAKE ACCOTINK UP AND RUNNING!

Editor's Note: Refer to the March 2018 issue of The Ravensworth Farmer for a more detailed overview and for proposed resolutions to be voted on at the March 22 Civic Association meeting.

On February 6, 2018, Ravensworth Farm Civic Association held an emergency meeting to discuss the future of Lake Accotink. Supervisor Cook attended and answered questions. During the meeting, Supervisor Cook challenged the people at the meeting to get organized, form a non-profit, start a petition drive, make yard signs, begin a social media campaign, etc.

A number of Ravensworth and North Springfield residents took up the challenge. The next day, a non-profit organization, SAVE LAKE ACCOTINK, was officially formed. SAVE LAKE ACCOTINK is dedicated to the sustainable preservation of Lake Accotink in its current form.

Why should we save Lake Accotink?

I am sure the immediate answer on your minds is because we love the lake. Lake Accotink is an important part of our lives. We enjoy walking around the lake, running into friends and neighbors on the trail, and we love all the nature photography that gets posted on the Ravensworth Farm Facebook page.

But Lake Accotink is much more than just a body of water. Lake Accotink is a vital component of Fairfax County's natural environment. The lake, of course, is man-made, but it is home to abundant wildlife.

If Lake Accotink is eliminated as proposed in Options A and E of the Park Authority's Master Plan Revision, the aquatic wildlife and its birds, including the herons and eagles, will disappear. If the lake is retained but made smaller, as in Option F, it will not be large enough to sustain the number and variety of wildlife it now does. The smaller lake proposed in Option F is not large enough, does not provide enough fishing area, for our bald eagles. Only Options B and C preserve Lake Accotink as a home for much of the wildlife we love. (*See the March 2018 issue of The Ravensworth Farmer for additional details on Options A-F*)

More than just providing a home for animals, Lake Accotink is vital to the health of the waters below the lake. Increased rainwater runoff from our roadways and parking lots has increased the amount of sediment carried downstream by Accotink Creek. When that sediment washes into Lake Accotink, roughly half of it is trapped as the water flow slows and the sediment is allowed to settle.

Sediment in stream water is considered a pollutant. Too much sediment will kill aquatic wildlife and adversely affect the other animals that rely upon that aquatic wildlife.

The water quality above Lake Accotink is quite poor. The water quality below Lake Accotink is much better. Because Lake Accotink is doing its job to trap sediment, more wildlife survives below the lake than above the lake. This wildlife below Lake Accotink that depends upon the lake even includes an endangered freshwater mussel. None of these mussels live above Lake Accotink, and if the lake is allowed to fill in or if the dam is removed, the population of mussels below the lake will be destroyed.

Another reason to save Lake Accotink is that it serves a more diverse population than any other lake in Fairfax County. Lake Accotink provides much-needed recreation for an underserved population. If the lake disappears, these much-needed amenities will likely go with it. This underserved community lacks a voice. SAVE LAKE AC-COTINK is reaching out to give all members of the community the voice we deserve.

What about the cost?

The estimated cost of all the options presented by FCPA can be found at https://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/parks/planning-development/lakeaccotink.

But these costs do not account for the myriad hidden costs that have not been studied at all. If the dam is removed or the lake is allowed to fill in, all that sediment that is currently being trapped will flow downstream through lower Accotink Creek, into Pohick Bay, and into the Potomac on down to the Chesapeake.

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Environmental regulations limit the amount of sediment that waterways are allowed to carry into the Potomac and Chesapeake and pending regulations will further reduce the amount of sediment Accotink Creek is allowed to dump into Pohick Bay. As stated above, Lake Accotink is trapping about half the sediment flowing into it from Accotink Creek and its upper tributaries.

If FCPA gets rid of the lake, something else will have to be done to trap this sediment. The cost of the measures required to replace Lake Accotink's sediment sequestration will likely be in the hundreds of millions of dollars. Compared to the hidden cost of losing the lake, the \$45,000,000 cost of dredging the lake and creating a forebay is a bargain.

According to Fairfax County Board of Supervisors Chairman Sharon Bulova in a Washington Post article dated December 29, 2005, "The lake 'is doing its job' as a filter for the Chesapeake Bay. The citizens of Fairfax County cannot afford to allow Lake Accotink to stop doing its job.

Which of the FCPA options is best?

Given the need to preserve the lake as a sediment trap and the value of the lake as a home for wildlife and for recreation, Option C is the only sustainable option.

Option C calls for a full dredge of Lake Accotink and the construction of a forebay. The forebay will trap most of the sediment washed downstream, extending the time between full dredges of the lake to thirty-five (35) years or more.

If the forebays are placed above the lake by Braddock Road, Option C becomes even more sustainable. The annual dredges of the forebay will cost less and, with immediate access to Braddock Road, will impact the community less.

There are also other alternative methods for implementing Option C that FCPA has not yet studied or considered. SAVE LAKE ACCOTINK is working to find the best solutions for the environment and the community.

What can we do to save Lake Accotink?

SAVE LAKE ACCOTINK has begun a growing movement. We have started a petition to get the issue placed on the 2019 ballot for a bond referendum.

FCPA lacks the budget to pay the cost of dredging Lake Accotink. A bond is required to fund Option C. A link to our online petition can be found on our website, savelakeaccotink.org.

We need to get enough signatures to get the bond referendum on the ballot, and our deadline for these signatures is May 28, 2018. Please go online and sign the petition. We could also use some help taking hard copies of the petition to the lake at busy times or door to door. You can volunteer on our website, too.



Our next scheduled event is April 7, 2018. The morning of April 7, The Nature Conservancy is sponsoring a watershed cleanup. After the cleanup, SAVE LAKE ACCOTINK is hosting a BBQ in the pool parking lot with a silent auction of Lake Accotink art. Further details are TBD.

ACCOTINK COMMENT PERIOD ENDS MAY 28

From February 15, 2018 email from the Fairfax County Park Authority

We are very pleased to see robust discussion and interest regarding options for Lake Accotink!

Throughout the master planning process, our goal has been to maximize community engagement and to hear from as many people as possible. After first presenting the lake management options to the community in May 2016, we received only a smattering of comments from residents. Subsequent to the January 22, 2018 community meeting, attended by more than 100 citizens, we have received more than 400 responses to our online survey and nearly 50 individual emails from citizens sharing their preference and perspective. Each person's input is valuable in determining the management of the lake which, in turn, will influence the character of Lake Accotink Park in the future.

We recognize that this is a very complex issue, and so, with that in mind, we have decided to keep taking public comment about the future of the lake through Monday, May 28, 2018. This extended comment period will allow more residents to consider the options and share their thoughts before any decisions are made.

If you have not shared your opinion regarding the lake management options, please go to the Lake Accotink Park Master Plan Revision project webpage (www.fairfaxcounty.gov/parks/planning-development/lakeaccotink) to review the options under consideration. We ask for your response to a quick online survey that will indicate your preference for the future of the lake. You can also share additional comments through the survey page or send your comments separately to Parkmail@fairfaxcounty.gov.

COUNTY EXECUTIVE PRESENTS PROPOSED COUNTY BUDGET

From an email by Supervisor John Cook, February 20, 2018

Fairfax County Executive Bryan Hill presented his proposed 2019 County Budget Plan at this morning's Board of Supervisors' meeting. His presentation begins the County budget season. The final budget will be voted on by the Board of Supervisors on May 1, 2018.

Mr. Hill recommended a real estate tax rate increase of 2.5 cents (from \$1.13 to \$1.155 per \$100 of assessed value). This increase would fully fund the Fairfax County Public Schools' request, address many of the Board of Supervisors' priorities (including Diversion First and Gang Prevention), and fully fund the County employee compensation plan. The average Fairfax County resident would see \$268 added to their tax bill. You can find more details on the proposed FY2019 budget here.

I have concerns about this budget proposal. On one hand, top priorities, such as teacher pay and our Diversion First program, are funded. On the other hand, the proposed tax increase is significant. I would have preferred to see some proposals for reductions in non-priority programs as a better way of funding key priorities.

The County Executive's proposal is only the first step in our budget process. Your opinion matters. You may submit your comments to my office at Braddock@fairfaxcounty.gov or call 703-425-9300. I take your opinions very seriously and will consider them all prior to making a final decision on the budget.



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
