

RAVENSWORTH FARM ELECTION LEGEND ON TV

Ravensworth Farm resident Ruth Hartman was interviewed on Fox 5 news November 3 about her involvement as an elections officer in the Ravensworth precinct because she was about to work her 70th election. After that interview, Ruth did, indeed, work her 70th election on November 6 and plans to return to work her 71st election in 2019.

Ruth has already worked more elections than any other election officer in Fairfax County and she has worked every one of those elections at Ravensworth Elementary School. Ruth isn't sure anyone could catch her record now because, when she started as an election officer, there were sometimes as many as four elections a year. Now it is very unusual to have even three. Ruth served a stint as Chief Election Officer for the Ravensworth Precinct before relinquishing that job to the person who held it before Ravensworth's current Chief, Doddie Cave. Doddie is in the top five for number of elections worked in Fairfax County herself.

SPRINGFIELD, Va. - One of the most inspiring stories being told this election season has nothing to do with someone who is looking for your vote. Rather, she is looking to help you vote. Ruth Hartman is about to spend her 70th election working at the polls in Fairfax County. "It doesn't seem that way to me," she laughed.

Hartman worked her very first election back in 1968 at Ravensworth Elementary School in Springfield. In fact, she has worked all 69 of her previous elections there – the same place her kids went to school. Although at first, she didn't want the job. Hartman said her neighbor asked her to help out at the polls, and she only said yes because she was a little lonely after moving to town from Massachusetts. "I had never moved in my life until I moved here, and I tell ya, I was one sorry person," she recalled. "I used to call home and cry all the time. I would call my mother on the phone and cry."

But sometimes, she said, things happen for a reason. Hartman became an award-winning volunteer – working elections, at her local civic association and at Fairfax Hospital too. And while Hartman has dedicated her life to helping others, she said she still feels like she's the one whose benefited the most.

"Keep busy and be with people," she smiled. "That's the key right there." She added, "What do you have if you don't have people, you know? You could be a hermit. What fun would that be?" Hartman said she has no plans to stop working elections anytime soon. Although these days, she only works the ones in November.

RAVENSWORTH RESIDENT RECEIVES ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP AWARD

The Fairfax County Park Authority Board has named Green Spring Gardens volunteer Tatiana Lisle the recipient of the 2018 Sally Ormsby Environmental Stewardship Award. Lisle was recognized for her work to protect pollinators by managing bees at Green Spring Gardens.

The park beekeeper is also the volunteer organizer of Green Spring's popular Honeybee Day, which is held in conjunction with National Honey Month. Her work as the site's beekeeper ensures beautiful flowers for the park, as well as helping the endangered honeybee.

Praised as a "volunteer extraordinaire," Lisle also works as a children's education instructor and teaches today's youth about watershed education, pollination, horticulture and stewardship. She volunteers as an instructor in adult education programs, is a certified Extension Master Gardener with the Green Spring unit and is an avid birder who assists with species counts at Huntley Meadows Park. In addition, Lisle is a member of the Friends of Green Spring (FROGS) and holds a leadership role on the organization's Board of Directors.

The Sally Ormsby Environmental Stewardship Award was established by the Park Authority Board in 2007 in recognition of Sally B. Ormsby's many years of service as a citizen steward. The award is open to individuals and groups whose actions embody the spirit of environmental stewardship and provide tangible environmental benefits to Fairfax County parks. Lisle will receive the award at the Elly Doyle Park Services and Outstanding Volunteers Award ceremony in November.

AVOID CHRISTMAS TREE AND DECORATION FIRES

Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious. Carefully decorating your home can help make your holidays safer.

Picking the tree

Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.

Placing the tree

Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.

Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.

Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.

Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.

Lighting the tree

Use lights that have the label of an independent testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use. Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.

Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.

Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.

After Christmas

Get rid of the tree after Christmas. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the home. Check with your local community to find a recycling program. Bring outdoor electrical lights inside after the holidays to prevent hazards and make them last longer.

HELP PREVENT CRIME AND TERRORIST ATTACKS IN FAIRFAX COUNTY

The Fairfax County Police Department joined local authorities to create a new app called "iWatchNova" to collect information on suspicious activity or behavior that could be associated with terrorist or criminal activity.

From the FCPD website: iWatchNOVA facilitates reporting of suspicious activities like possible surveillance or casing operations, people photographing or videotaping critical infrastructure or security checkpoints. The Northern Virginia Regional Intelligence Center (NVRIC), which covers 18 jurisdictions, then collects, evaluates, analyzes and disseminates this information. Reports through iWatchNOVA are examined to determine if there is a viable threat to the community.

The iWatchNOVA app is free and easy to use on your IOS or Android, with the ability to remain anonymous. The portal is also accessible through their website (https://iwatchnova.org). It gives you the option to upload photos and provide specific details. The state-of-the-art technology from Trapwire then provides robust analytical capabilities that allow NVRIC to detect patterns indicative of terrorist and criminal preparations. This allows law enforcement to use the eyes and ears of the community to prevent terrorism, fight crime and keep Northern Virginia safe for all. Source: Supervisor John Cook's Braddock Beacon

A global study published this year reports that 259 people have died while attempting to take extreme selfies. The study is based on data from 2011 to 2017. The study also suggested that the numbers are probably far larger, as officials likely reported many selfie-caused deaths as something else. The researchers said the majority of the deaths were from falling, drowning, or vehicle accidents. One example from the news this July, is the death of Gavin Zimmerman as he tried to take a selfie on a New Zealand cliff. The study suggested the posting of "no selfies" signs at dangers locations like mountains, lakes, and the tops of tall buildings.

Source: Office of Braddock Supervisor John Cook Constituents have asked about SLOW DOWN WE LIVE HERE signs. In the 2018 Budget carryover, Supervisor Cook requested funds be set aside for more signs. The Board of Supervisors passed this item. Signs should be available in 2019.



SCAMMERS SURGE

A new report predicts nearly half of all calls to mobile phones in 2019 will be fraudulent. First Orion, a company that provides call screening and blocking services, analyzed more than 50 billion cell phone calls over an 18-month period. The portion of calls considered mobile scams rose from 3.7 percent of total calls in 2017 to 29.2 percent in 2018. The company predicts scam calls will likely reach 44.6 percent by early 2019.

First Orion says many scammers are using "neighborhood spoofing," a technique that disguises their actual phone number and displays it as a local number on a call recipient's caller ID. Call-blocking apps can only block known numbers, not legitimate numbers that scammers temporarily hijack.

READING MATTERS!

Check out the impact of a child reading 20 minutes per day. A child who reads 20 minutes per day is exposed to 1.8 million words per year and scores in the 90th percentile on standardized tests. A child who reads five minutes per day is exposed to 282,000 words per year and scores in the 50th percentile on standardized tests. A child who reads just one minute per day is exposed to only 8,000 words per year and scores in the 10th percentile on standardized tests.

CONTRIBUTE TO CLEAN WATER

Compared to a lawn area, rain gardens absorb 30 percent more water, preventing runoff, erosion and flooding which is becoming a problem for many municipalities and their storm water infrastructure. As forests and farms are replaced by cities and suburbs, runoff from impervious surfaces has increased dramatically and damaged the environment in significant ways.

Rain gardens reduce storm water runoff and help prevent some of this damage. Every homeowner and business that installs a rain garden will be doing their part to protect: communities from flooding; streams and lakes from pollution, sedimentation and erosion; the water table and underground aquifers; and will be adding to the beauty of local communities. Rain gardens are comprised of plants that are good at trapping and slowing water and sediment runoff after rainfall. They also provide valuable habitat for pollinators, birds and butterflies. In order to be effective, rain gardens must be constructed in a specific way. A rain garden is not a pond and is intended to be dry between rainfalls. Water in rain gardens should quickly soak into the ground.
