PRESIDENT'S LETTER

I am occasionally asked, "What does Ravensworth Farm Civic Association ("RFCA") do for me?" At the risk of appearing flippant, I am going to briefly channel John Fitzgerald Kennedy. Ask not what your civic association can do for you. Ask what you can do for your civic association.

RFCA does not have the enforcement authority of a HOA. For the most part, RFCA does not have any secret contacts or phone numbers to those who can make things happen. The real power of any civic association is the ability to leverage the weight of collective action.

RFCA provides a ready-built network for communication and coordination. A civic association shows its full power and effectiveness in a community-wide emergency or in a significant matter of general concern. But these grave issues do not often surface.

The truth is, from day to day, there is nothing the civic association can do for you that you cannot do for yourself or your neighbors. It is here that President Kennedy's illustrious words become particularly profound.

RFCA can do for you only that which you can do for RFCA. The onus is on each of us to make and do for RFCA that which we would have RFCA be and do for us.

But the truly great thing about RFCA is that you do not



CAN I LEAVE MY CHILD ALONE?

There are no laws in Virginia that say when or for how long a child can be left alone. Working with other jurisdictions in Northern Virginia, Fairfax County has developed these supervision guidelines for parents and caretakers to consider before leaving a child alone.

Parents are ultimately responsible for making decisions about their children's safety. Every child is different and must be assessed based on their maturity, skills and comfort level to be home alone.

Is my child ready? Does he or she ...

- understand instructions and follow important rules?
- know how to ask for help from friends, neighbors, and police?
- make good decisions when away from you or other adults?
- know when to contact you and 911 when needed?
- feel comfortable and confident about staying home alone?

Age Guidelines:

8 YEARS AND YOUNGER should always be in the care of a responsible person. Children this age should never be left unsupervised in homes, cars, playgrounds or yards.

9-10 YEARS OLD may be ready to be left unsupervised up to 1.5 hours during daylight and early evening hours. 11-12 YEARS OLD may be ready to be left unsupervised up to 3 hours during daylight and early evening hours. 13-15 YEARS OLD may be ready to be left unsupervised more than three hours but not overnight.

16 AND OLDER may be ready to be left unsupervised overnight for one to two days, with a plan in place.

Babysitting Age Guidelines:

10-12 YEARS OLD may provide care of other children for up to three hours with the help of an adult. 13-15 YEARS OLD may babysit infants and children but not overnight.

16 AND OLDER may watch children overnight.

The first few years of a child's life are a sensitive period in the process of development, laying a foundation in childhood and beyond for cognitive functioning; social and emotional skills; behavior and self-regulatory capacities; and physical health. Infant & Toddler Connection of Fairfax-Falls Church Services

Infant and Toddler of Fairfax-Falls Church (ITC) serves children who:

- Are under the age of three years old and
- Live in Fairfax County or the cities of Fairfax or Falls Church and
- Meet one or more of the following criteria:
 - Have a 25% or greater delay in at least one developmental area (cognitive, adaptive, receptive, or expressive language, social/emotional, fine motor, gross motor)
 - Have a diagnosed condition that has a high probability of resulting in a developmental delay (examples include but are not limited to Down syndrome, hearing or visual impairment, failure to thrive, etc.)
 - Have demonstrated atypical development (examples include but are not limited to unintelligible speech, feeding concerns, etc.)



RADON TEST KITS FOR \$3

The Virginia Department of Health has made radon gas test kits available to Virginia residents for \$3. This includes the shipping and the lab results. Visit https://www.vdhradon.org/ to order your kit.

What Is Radon?

Radon is a naturally occurring radioactive gas that results from the decay of Uranium which is found in certain types of soil and bedrock. You can't see, smell or taste it and it



can only be detected by testing. Radon is normally reduced to very low levels in outdoor air, but in certain circumstances it can reach much higher concentrations indoors. Radon is measured in picocuries per liter (pCi/L).

Is Radon A Health Hazard?

Yes, it can be. Radon is considered second only to smoking as the leading cause of lung cancer. Radon gas and its by-products are inhaled and may become trapped in your lungs. Studies have shown that prolonged exposure to radon and its by-products may cause lung cancer.

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) estimates that as many as 21,000 lung cancer deaths per year in the United States may be associated with exposure to radon. Approximately 600 of those deaths occur in Virginia (based on census statistics). Radon exposure is not known to cause any immediate physical symptoms or reactions. The higher the radon level and the longer a person is exposed to it, then the greater the health risk.

How Does Radon Get Into Your House?

Radon can seep into your home from exposed dirt such as a crawl space, plumbing cut-out or old cellar. It can also pass through openings in your foundation such as unsealed sumps, drains, joints, cracks and open top block walls. The highest levels of radon are typically found in the lowest livable areas of the home, such as basements or other rooms in direct contact with the ground.

The health risk associated with drinking radon in well water is thought to be very low - but when the water is agitated it may contribute additional radon to your indoor air. The EPA has yet to finalize a national standard for radon in ground water. Testing and (if necessary) mitigating the indoor air is usually the most effective and affordable way to reduce radon health risks.

EMERGENCY CONNECTIONS

New 911 technology provides first responders with automatic info by Michael Cochrane, Post Date: December 13, 2018 - Issue Date: December 29, 2018

Americans make more than 240 million calls to the 911 emergency phone number each year. Yet, despite the ubiquity of cellular networks and the internet, many emergency response centers still rely on callers to provide location and other diagnostic information over the phone before dispatchers can determine how to respond.

Tech startup RapidSOS is attempting to solve this problem by integrating emergency services with connected devices such as smartphones, wearables, and onboard vehicle-connected emergency systems. Using the RapidSOS system, such devices can provide immediate information about a user's location and emergency situation, even if the user cannot speak.

"Most emergency communication today uses infrastructure established between the 1960s and the 1980s, and it means that if you need 911 but can't have a conversation you are in trouble. 911 doesn't even know your name when you call," Michael Martin, CEO and co-founder of RapidSOS, said in a TechCrunch interview. "But there is all this rich information today, and so our job is to help make that available when you really need it."

The company partners with vehicle manufacturers and device- and app-makers such as Apple and Google to provide emergency workers with user location information, along with user-supplied data such as medical history or emergency contacts: When a person initiates an emergency call using a connected device or app—or when a connected vehicle detects a crash—RapidSOS' software sends the info directly to the 911 system. The service is free for users of mobile devices.

Nationwide, more than 1,500 emergency 911 centers are already using RapidSOS applications, the company says. Reprinted from: World News Group, https://world.wng.org/2018/12/emergency connections

FRIENDLY COMPANION APP

An app pairs college students with senior citizens by Michael Cochrane, Post Date: September 27, 2018 - Issue Date: October 13, 2018

Older Americans who don't need in-home care or assisted living may still need help with everyday needs such as transportation, shopping, and technology. Many just need companionship. A Miami-based startup called Papa is aiming to fill this gap by providing a service that connects senior citizens with college students, an approach it calls "grandkids-on-demand."

"People don't always want to say they want companionship, even though their families say they do," Papa founder Andrew Parker told TechCrunch. "But when a visit ends up being six hours, that's evident what it's for." Parker started the company after trying to help his struggling grandmother care for his grandfather, who had Alzheimer's. Traditional home care didn't seem to fit his grandfather's needs, so he looked for an alternative. Hiring a college student to help his grandfather was such a success that he built an app to extend the concept to others. He named the service "Papa" after his grandfather's nickname.

The basic service is \$20 per hour. If seniors pay an additional \$30 monthly service fee, they can request a particular student, called a "Papa Pal." All Papa Pal candidates must pass a background check and motor vehicle records check. The company also administers a personality test to ensure all Papa Pals are outgoing, empathetic, and patient. Parker trains the students to help their clients increase their social interaction through what he calls "instructive companionship."

"It's like, teach your senior how to use social media today, get them their first 10 friends, or have them FaceTime with family members," Parker told Fast Company.

The startup plans to expand from Florida to at least five other states next year. Medicare will introduce its expanded Medicare Advantage program in 2019 that will cover many of the services Papa offers, such as transportation to medical appointments.
