



BEVERLY SCHUBERT - "BLAME" IT ON THE CAVES

"It's been wonderful the whole time living here," shared Ravensworth Farm original owner Beverly Schubert during a February interview at which her daughter and one of her three sons were present.

"I am so glad we moved here, and I am glad I am still here," she said about our neighborhood. She and her husband were the original owners of a three-bedroom house with a basement on Gosport Lane near Sedgwick Lane.

Beverly's path to Ravensworth Farm began in the late 1950s in Westchester County, NY — in the suburbs north of the Big Apple.

Born in Tarrytown, and later moving to Hawthorne, Beverly was working for Readers Digest as an administrative assistant in 1956 when a friend introduced her to a man 11 years her senior.

The potential suitor was Wolfgang "Wolf" Schubert, who had moved to the area after serving in the Army during and after World War II, and then working as a cinematographer on a film called Island of Allah in Saudi Arabia.

As the son of German immigrant parents, Wolf spoke German fluently, a skill he used as an interpreter for the military police during his time in the Army.

Wolf proposed to Beverly after three months of dating, and they were married a year later, in 1958. They remained in Westchester, where they had the first two of their four children: Chris and Ken.

In 1960, Wolf took a job with the Department of Agriculture in Washington. Because Beverly was pregnant and didn't want to switch doctors, she remained in New York until after Ken was born, living with her mother, brother and sister while Wolf rented a room in Dupont Circle.

Eventually, the couple rented an apartment in the Arlington community of Claremont, where they became friends with another couple — Doddie and Pat Cave.

Both couples quickly outgrew the apartment complex's two children limit and began house hunting. Third son Glenn, named after astronaut John Glenn, caused his family to be officially, though unwillingly, in violation of the apartment rules.

In 1963, the Schuberts visited Ravensworth Farm to look at houses and liked it, but they were waiting for Wolf's government raise before they could qualify for a loan. The Caves also came to look and bought a house. By the time Wolf's raise came through, the available Ravensworth houses had been sold and the family was placed on a waiting list. However, and like magic, one of the families that had planned to buy in the subdivision was transferred by the military to Japan.

Their departure gave the Schuberts another chance to move into the Farm, although they were not able to choose their lot. Instead, they had to take the one that had become available, which turned out to be right next to the Caves, their next-door neighbors from Arlington. Absolutely uncanny.

The Schuberts moved into Ravensworth in August 1963. They were the first family on Gosport Lane, still unpaved at the time. Soon, the street was abuzz with young couples with children.

Wolf's life-long interest in photography led him to carve out space in the basement for a darkroom. He also had an interest in astronomy, building his own telescope from scratch.

Beverly served as a room mother at Ravensworth Elementary and as a den mother for her sons' Cub Scouts troops and troop leader for her daughter's Girl Scout troops.

Along with friend and neighbor Doddie, Beverly has been active in Ravensworth's garden club for decades. When the kids were younger, the two also volunteered for the swim team, keeping track of league records and helping at swim meets. For years, Beverly ran one of the most popular booths at the school's Halloween Carnival — the zoo, in which participants tried to win stuffed animals by drawing numbers from plastic pumpkins. New neighbors were always welcomed with one of Beverly's homemade cakes.

In one of her crowning achievements, Beverly was voted Farmer of the Year by the civic association in 1976. She is especially proud of this designation.

When her children were older and starting college, Beverly took a part-time job in a doctor's office—a position she obtained as a result of her friendship with yet another Ravensworth Farm original owner who still lives in our subdivision: Inverchapel Road resident and nurse Sheila Bouchard, who had four of her own children. Doddie worked in the same office, as well as Rita Bouchard, a nurse and original owner who passed away in 2015.

When the Schubert children were young, they and others from the neighborhood were treated by Dr. Steven Yates, a pediatrician who made housecalls in his four-wheel-drive Jeep. Beverly recalled in the 1960s and '70s having milk and eggs delivered directly to Ravensworth homes. Glass milk jugs would be placed in metal containers and then returned when empty.

Oldest son Chris started first grade at Ravensworth Elementary in the mid-1960s and all four Schubert children — including daughter Linda, who was born in 1966 and is the only one of the four born while the family lived in Ravensworth — went to Ravensworth Elementary, Poe Intermediate and Annandale High. Beverly recalled Mrs. Corsepius, who typically taught first grade, was a favorite of her kids.

The kids spent many summer days at the pool, although it took several years on the waiting list before the family was able to get a membership at the popular club. They swam at GARC in Annandale instead.

The boys stayed busy in scouting and sports, including baseball and tennis. "I always loved sports and I loved going to all of the boys' games," said Beverly with a smile.

In the winter, the boys would ice skate and play hockey when Lake Accotink was frozen. Park rangers would chase the boys off the ice, but they would get right back on once the rangers were out of sight. In warmer weather, Lake Accotink was where the boys would go fishing and Chris would sail his fiberglass boat.

In the 1960s and 1970s, the kids on Gosport Lane played dodge ball and kick-the-can in the street until they heard the familiar sound of their parents calling them for dinner. The boys would shoot off homemade model rockets in a field that is now the site of the St. James sports complex.

Ravensworth homes were built without central air. In the early days, people either muddled through with fans or window units. For the Schubert family, an investment in an air-conditioning system came earlier than it did for most neighbors, due to the boys' allergies (which also prevented them from having a dog for many years). At first, all three boys slept in one bedroom with a window unit and Sheila Bouchard would administer their allergy shots at home so they could avoid going in to the doctor's office.

Other memories that the three Schuberts recalled were sitting out on the stoop in the summer and enjoying the company of family and neighbors. They remember going to downtown Washington to see the Woodies and Hecht's department store windows dressed for the holiday shopping season and eating out as a family at the Buckaroo in Ravensworth Shopping Center and the Rustler in central Annandale.

The family used to assemble the monthly Ravensworth Farmer newsletter, with Beverly typing it, Wolf running the mimeograph machine, and neighbors joining them to put the pages together.

For many years, the Schuberts' other next-door neighbors were the Buschers, an older couple who were surrogate grandparents to the kids (and whose own son and family lived on Hatteras). Beverly remembers her boys picking the neighbor's pansies out of her garden and giving them to her as a bouquet, which she rewarded them for with cookies and candy.

In 1977, Wolf's stepmother Schmidtl, a petite German woman, came to live with the family after her husband died. Remembered today as a "crocheting machine," she made all kinds of wearable items for the family and neighbors. Later, Beverly's brother moved down from New York after retirement and lived with the couple while he looked for a place to live. He eventually bought a house on Moultrie Road, where he lived for more than a decade.

Sadly, Wolf passed away in 2014 at the age of 92. Beverly remains in her brick home with two of her four kids nearby.

Happily, son Ken and his family live in Ravensworth on Hatteras Lane and son Chris has a house in the adjacent North Springfield subdivision. Ken has taken his sons fishing at Lake Accotink, just as he used to fish there.

Over the years, there have been lots of weddings and graduations, in addition to the arrival of grandchildren and great-grandchildren. The Schubert family tradition is for all the members who can make it to get together at Beverly's house on the Saturday after Christmas.

"I knew I was blessed to have such a big family and see all these generations," Beverly said. "My father died at age 54 and only got to see one of his grandchildren."

And blessed are they to have Beverly as their matriarch.



THE CAVES: FIFTY SIX YEARS ON GOSPORT LANE

Pat and Doddie Cave moved into Ravensworth in September 1963. Prior to the move, they had lived in Clairmont Apartments in Arlington. They learned of Ravensworth when a coworker and a neighbor from the apartments moved there.

When the Caves moved in, the community had developed from Braddock Road to Sedgwick Lane. There were no homes on the south side of Queensberry beyond Hatteras Lane. They purchased a three bedroom rambler for their growing family, right next door to a coworker! Most of the community were young couples with small children. Everyone was very friendly and helpful.

Pat was working for the Navy Facilities Engineering Command (Nav Fac) and Doddie part time at a doctor's office. Pat's commute to Old Town Alexandria was 40 minutes and Doddie's to Beauregard Medical Center around 20 minutes. Braddock Road was only two lanes then.

They bought groceries at the Giant Food in Springfield and clothes in Shirlington. Over the years, the community pool, shopping center and Wakefield Park were opened.

Their three children attended Ravensworth Elementary, Poe Middle School, and Annandale High School. Sharon, Rick, and Maribeth were all on swim teams: Sharon at the community Ravensworth pool and Rick and Maribeth were on swim teams at Ravensworth, Annandale High School and with Solotar. Their other activities were varied. Sharon was involved in Girl Scouts, high school drill team and played the piano. Rick played Little League Baseball and Basketball and was on the football and basketball teams at Annandale. Maribeth participated in scouts, played basketball, was a high school cheerleader and on the tennis team.

The children's activities and Pat's and Doddie's involvement in the community kept them very busy. They have enjoyed the Friday night concerts at the lake, the swim meets, and the adult swim parties. Pat participated with the Civic Association. Doddie was a Ravensworth swim team representative for eight years, scout leader for boys and girls, Garden Club President and Vice President and an election official for local and national elections for 50 years so far.

Many changes in the community have occurred as Braddock Road was expanded; a Beltway was built, stores opened nearby, and traffic and development increased. Pat and Doddie miss the Civic Association dances and the freedom and safety their children enjoyed. They especially cherish the lasting friendships they have made over the 56 years as residents of Ravensworth Farm.
