

PET WASTE MANAGEMENT IN LAKE ACCOTINK PARK

Thanks to the support of Friends of Lake Accotink Park (FLAP), our community has 10 pet waste stands located along the Lake Accotink trail with an 11th to be added soon.

The management of pet waste is a significant environmental concern. Controlling waste is part of a greater community effort to protect our natural resources and preserve the water quality of local lakes and streams that feed into the Potomac River and Chesapeake Bay watersheds.

You may be surprised to learn just how much of an impact the "poop stands" have in managing pet waste. The FDA estimates that the average dog excretes roughly 12 oz of waste every day. FLAP supplied over 20,000 bags last year. Using a very conservative estimate of 2 oz of waste per bag, the stands prevented over a ton of pet waste from entering the park ecosystem.

<u>NEW COMMEMORATIONS OF THE BLACK STRUGGLE AND ACHIEVEMENT</u> IN VIRGINIA

A Virginia license plate commemorating a Black Richmond newspaper has been authorized by the Virginia governor. Separately, a new historical marker has been unveiled in Old Town Alexandria honoring the achievements of a local sports star.

On February 9, 2022, the Virginia Senate passed the bill entitled "SB 753: License plates, special; issuance to commemorate The Richmond Planet" with a unanimous bipartisan Virginia House of Delegates vote of 22-Yes, 0-No, and in the Virginia Senate a vote of 38-Yes 0-No, 2-no vote. The Bill was introduced by Democrat Senator Joe Morrissey with the support of Senator Jennifer McClellan (D) and Delegate Jeffrey Bourne (D). The bill went to Governor Glenn Youngkin (R) who signed it into law on Friday, April 8.




Figure 1: Richmond Planet, Richmond, VA. December 21, 1895, page 1.

The Richmond Planet was a Black-owned and operated newspaper dating to 1890 but has its roots much earlier. Historical newspaper research has uncovered references as early as 1882 detailing the Richmond Planet as a "pronegro organ" and regional Black political-activist group which struggled against lynching and other pervasive persecution. The Planet also published a local paper and endorsed local political candidates. It was a newspaper that officially ran from 1890 through 1930 and catered to the viewpoints of the local Black population. It was founded by 13- male ex-slaves living in the Richmond area.

The license plate initiative was the creation of longtime Richmond area Black activist Reginald Carter, in conjunction with the Dream For Purpose, whose Facebook page lists it as a "research-led creative house," designed the new plate.

The new design will incorporate an upraised arm symbolizing unity, strength, and struggle - the Black Power symbol, made popular in the 1960s was originally the newspaper's banner in the publication of the Richmond Planet beginning in the early 1890s.

Reginald Carter's lobbying for the new license plate required by state law a preorder of 450 plates at the normal Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) price

(\$10) before the deadline of December 24, 2021, for the state's legislature, to consider taking up a formal vote. The Richmond Free Press reported, on September 2, 2021, that the target had been reached.

According to the DMV new license plate design will be available for purchase after the law goes into effect on July 1, 2022.

A new historical marker was unveiled in the City of Alexandria on April 2, 2022, with speeches given by Senator Mark Warner (D) and Congressman Donald Beyer (D).




Figure 3: Photo by David Chandler, April 10, 2022.

The new marker is located at the corner of North Henry (South US Route 1) & Montgomery Streets in Old Town Alexandria. This marker celebrates the athletic achievements of Earl Francis Lloyd, who grew up near a house nearest this marker at 1200 Montgomery Street. He was the first Black American to play in the National Basketball Association (NBA) in 1950. His achievements further include being named All American at West Virginia State University, the first black player to win an NBA title with the Detroit Pistons, the first black assistant coach, and the third black head coach. He played professionally with the Washington Capitols, Syracuse Nationals, and the Detroit Pistons. He is also named a Hall-of-Famer at the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. According to the West Virginia State University Website, other accolades and recognition include being "honored with induction into the West Virginia State University Hall of Fame, the state of Virginia Athletic Hall of Fame, the state of West Virginia Athletic Hall of Fame, the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame, the Black College Alumni Hall of Fame, and the Parker-Gray High School Hall of Fame. He was named to the CIAA Silver Anniversary Team and was voted as one of the CIAA's 50 Greatest Players. In 2001, the Congressional Black Caucus Policy and Leadership Institute bestowed the inaugural "Legends of Black History" Sports Award on Lloyd, and in 2008 the U.S. House of Representatives honored Lloyd with a Congressional Resolution. In 2007, the newly constructed basketball court at T.C. Williams High School [renamed Alexandria City High School] in Lloyd's hometown of Alexandria, Va., was named in his honor. Lloyd's remarkable story is the subject of the documentary film 'The First To Do It."

Earl died in his hometown of Crossville, Tennessee in 2015. For more information on this historical marker, search "Earl Francis Lloyd" at https://www.hmdb.org/.

TOILET MATH (REALLY!)

Do your kids complain that they'll never use math? If they're asked to answer a word problem about trains traveling different speeds across the country, they're probably right. But they could use math to decide whether it's worth replacing a toilet or other fixture in their house.

For instance, prices for a new WaterSense® toilet at Lowe's range from \$89 to \$399 (That's a throne!). The Kohler® Elliston® is a midrange fixture, priced at about \$270 (\$249 plus gaskets, etc.) and uses 1.28 gallons per flush (gpf). For those of you who are not handy, Lowe's professional installation is \$229. Roughly, about \$500 for a new fixture, installed by professionals.

There are two parts to your water bill – water from Fairfax Water and sewer service from Fairfax County. Fairfax Water charges \$3.46 per 1,000 gallons or \$.00346 per gallon. (Note there are a range of rates and this is the lowest. Higher rates would result in a faster payback.) Fairfax County charges \$7.72 per 1,000 gallons or \$0.00772 per gallon. That's a total of \$0.0112 per gallon to take the dirty water away and refill the tank with clean water. The original toilets installed in Ravensworth Farm probably use about 6 gpf.

The difference between the original toilet and the WaterSense® toilet is 4.72 gpf (6 gpf – 1.28 gpf).

For every flush of the new toilet, you save 4.72 gallons x \$.0112 per gallon = \$.0529.

If a new toilet is \$500 and water costs \$0.0529 per flush, that means you'd break even at about 9,450 flushes. Assume your household has 20 flushes per day, that's 473 days or 1.3 years.

If you install the toilet yourself, buy a less expensive fixture, or pay more for water, the payback would be faster. The payback would also be faster if your existing toilet leaks.

Using the least expensive toilet (\$89 + \$20 in parts = \$109), installed yourself, results in breaking even at 2,060 flushes or 103 days!

NEW MEMORIAL HONORS VICTIM OF VIRGINIA TECH MASS SHOOTING

A memorial for the late 19-year-old Virginia Tech student Mary Read has been relocated and enhanced with greenery. The Annandale resident was one of 32 people killed on April 16, 2007, in the shooting at the university. A rededication event took place in Canterbury Woods Park (5018 Wakefield Chapel Road) on Saturday, April 16—15 years after the attack.

"This was her park," said Braddock District Supervisor James Walkinshaw, who spoke with the family. "So it was important to them that the memorial stay in this park."

The site near Braddock Road that the memorial had occupied for over a decade frequently flooded. County staff worked with Read's family and local advocates to find a "more appropriate and accessible" spot in the park, according to a statement from Walkinshaw.

"Over time, the flooding down there has gotten worse and worse — to the point it's submerged much of the time," Walkinshaw said on April 12, during a board meeting.

Earlier this week, a crew relocated the existing bench and plaque to their new spot, which is by the parking lot at a higher elevation.

"The Read family [is] really excited for this and appreciative of the community's efforts to make this happen," Walkinshaw said, adding that the community's efforts will ensure Read's memory is respected and treated with the dignity that it deserves.

LAKE ACCOTINK DREDGING PROJECT UPDATE

The public comment period on the revised alternatives analysis information presented at the February 10 virtual public meeting officially ended on March 11, but county staff took additional comments after that date. Over 170 comments were received by county staff and about 300 by the Lee District supervisor's office. The information from the February 10 public meeting is posted on the project webpage at:

fairfaxcounty.gov/publicworks/lake-accotink-dredging

County staff continue to look at alternative spoils processing sites proposed by members of the public in Mason District. We hope to know if any of those sites may be feasible soon. Once we know if there are any additional options, we will update members of the board of supervisors and wait for direction from them on what additional analysis is requested so that a decision can be made on a spoils processing site, and we can proceed with a concept design.

At this point we are off of the project schedule published on the website, which showed a concept design being finished by June 2022. We will update the website as soon as we have more information. Questions? Contact Charles Smith at Charles.Smith@fairfaxcounty.gov.




