



They did not include an estimate for a full dredge, so the Task Force was unable to compare process events provided by the previous analysis completed by Arcadis and shared with the community in February when the Fairfax County Department of Public Works and Environmental Services (DPWES) recommended against dredging the Lake, and rather, allow it to become a "managed wetland." LimnoTech confirmed the costs of individual parts of the dredge activities provided by Arcadis. A lengthy question and answer session followed the presentation, during which members of the Task Force sought clarifications on assumptions that LimnoTech used to arrive at the cost conclusions. Not all Task Force members were satisfied with the answers received.

The last part of the meeting consisted of briefings from each subcommittee chair. The Task Force administration (at Supervisor Walkinshaw's) office emailed Task Force members with advance copies of these reports for review before the meeting. Following the individual subcommittee reporting, Chairman Bulova asked for a motion to accept their report for incorporation into the Task Force's final report that will go forward to the Board of Supervisors (BOS) on December 5th and the Environmental Committee on December 12th. The Task Force voted to accept the reports for incorporation with considerations for suggested edits and completion of some committee sections.

In addition to the subcommittee reports, <u>Martin Shepherd</u>, the representative for Ravensworth Farm Civic Association, briefed the Task Force on his findings concerning the use of Robinson Terminal as a dewatering and transportation hub. This finding highlights these benefits over other alternatives that caused community concern:

- ✓ Eliminates destruction of mature tree canopy along Accotink Creek and within Wakefield Park
- ✓ Eliminates daily heavy truck traffic in residential neighborhoods
- ✓ Reduces the carbon footprint of transporting dried dredge materials by 87.05%
- The Task Force accepted Mr. Shepherd's findings for inclusion in the Task Force's final report, with suggested edits.







ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR SNAP?

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) can be used like cash to buy food from authorized retailers and online from Amazon and Walmart but cannot be used for delivery fees. Recipients receive an Electronic Benefits Transfer card. Your account is debited each time eligible food items are purchased. A secret Personal Identification Number is required.

Your household must meet certain requirements to be eligible for SNAP benefits. The application process can be done by computer or phone—no need to come in person. HAVING DIFFICULTY PREPARING MEALS?

(Article from the Department of Family Services)

The Meals on Wheels nutrition program provides home-delivered nutrition services targeted to persons 60 years of age or older as well as younger individuals who may have a disability and are temporarily unable to prepare meals for themselves due to illness or accident. Weekly meals are available for in-home delivery. Priority is given to older individuals with the greatest economic and social needs, with special emphasis on low-income minority individuals, older individuals with limited English proficiency, and individuals at risk for institutional placement. The program is targeted to support eligible adults to remain independent in their own homes with support by this program. The meals program currently provides a weekly, contact-free meal delivery of 11 flash-frozen meals. Meals are delivered once per week. Apply by calling the Department of Family Services at 703-324-5409.

SOURCE WATER PROTECTION: BE 'WINTER SALT SMART' THIS WINTER

Excerpt From: "<u>Straight From the Tap</u>," Fairfax Water, Fall, 2023 Submitted by Stephanie Hammond

What's the problem?

In the winter, salt keeps us safe while we are on the move, but it also leads to higher levels of salt in the region's drinking water supply, including the Potomac River and Occoquan Reservoir.

What is winter salt?

Winter salt is rock salt (sodium chloride) or ice melt (a blend of sodium chloride, magnesium chloride, and other salts). These materials are used in the winter to prevent the icing of sidewalks, parking lots, and roadways.

Why is increased salt in the drinking water supply a problem for water utilities?

Salt cannot be removed via traditional drinking water and wastewater treatment processes. It can also be corrosive to plumbing and may have health impacts for those on low-sodium diets.

What can I do to help?

• Shovel early. Remove snow from pavements before it turns to ice.

• Use less salt. A 12-ounce coffee mug of salt should be enough for a 20-foot driveway or about 10 sidewalk squares.

• Spread salt evenly. Try to not distribute in clumps. Watch the temps. When it is colder than 15°F, do not apply winter salt; it will not work.

Reminder from submitter:

The storm drains in your street catch, move, and release rainwater into the nearest stream to keep excess water away from your property. But fallen leaves and other debris can cause localized flooding if they cover those storm drains. Blowing or sweeping fallen leaves into the street makes them a safety and stormwater hazard to your property and your neighborhood. You can help prevent this from happening by removing leaves from the street and storm drains near your property, usually with a rake. DO NOT BLOW LEAVES INTO THE STREET. (Quoted text).




