Kids swimming in a creek and swinging off a rope swing, folks boating through clean water, young fish moving downstream to the Chesapeake...are these days gone? If you value the health of our local waterways and the Chesapeake Bay, as well as that of Accotink, consider contacting: Supervisor Sharon Bulova at <u>Sharon.bulova@fairfaxcounty.gov</u>, 703 425 9300; Chairman Gerald Connolly at <u>chairman@fairfaxcounty.gov</u>, 703 324 2321; or Congressman Tom Davis at <u>chrisespinoza@mail.house.gov</u>, 703 916 9610 to ask for their support for increase funding for the dredging of Lake Accotink. Limited dredging is set to begin on Accotink in June to alleviate the massive silting of the lake and to create a deeper lake with better water flow and healthier aquatic life With the limited funds currently available, only part of the lake will be dredged. But with additional funds available through Storm Water Management or through Congressman Davis' possible access to Federal funds, a more thorough dredging could be completed.

COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP



Look before you leap and check it out before you pass it on.

GARDEN TIPS FOR APRIL/MAY

- **#** Prune spring flowering shrubs after blooms fade
- **#** Fertilize azaleas and rhododendrons with 5-10-5 azalea fertilizer
- **#** Divide primroses and other spring blooming perennials after flowers fade.
- **#** Let daffodil foliage ripen and brown; do not cut it back.
- **#** Divide chrysanthemums when they are 2-4 inches high. Also pinch growing tips until mid-July for fuller plants.
