GARDENING TIPS FOR JUNE/JULY/AUGUST

- > Prune azaleas, rhododendrons, and other Spring flowering shrubs before mid-July.
- Watch out for pests including bagworms, lacebugs, and spider mites.
- Harvest your vegetables frequently.
- Plant verbena, aster, and butterfly bush to attract butterflies and birds to your garden.
- > Check plants frequently for water during hot weather.
- Eliminate mosquitoes in birdbaths and ponds with mosquito bits or dunks. Keep unnecessary standing water out of your garden.

COOK SAFELY WITH TEFLON

A recent Post article informed readers about the problem when Teflon breaks down; hazardous materials then enter the environment. The article described simple rules to follow when using nonstick cookware:

- Never leave an empty pan unattended on a burner
- Don't preheat a pan before adding butter or oil
- Don't sear meat in the pan
- Don't broil in the pan
- Always use the exhaust hood to prevent noxious fumes escaping into the kitchen

AS MOSQUITO SEASON APPROACHES...

Make sure that you are not providing a breeding ground. Mosquitoes need only a few tablespoons of water to breed!

- (i) Clean out your gutters of debris
- (i) Discard cans or containers
- (i) Remove old tires
- (i) Clean and change water in birdbaths
- i Turn over wading pools when not in use
- (i) Cover canoes and boats with a tight fitting tarp or turn upside down
- (i) Drain or fill in wet and soggy areas with soil or vegetation

CONTROL OF RATS AND MICE

Unfortunately this is the time of year that rodents are looking for food and nesting sites. Protect your home and yard by doing the following:

- ☐ Closing any holes or cracks the rodents could use to access your home
- ☑ Store your firewood up off the ground
- Remove any piles of debris or building material which could provide shelter
- ☐ Clean up bird seed from the ground daily or remove your bird feeders during the Summer months
- ☑ Do not leave any uneaten pet food outside
