A BIT OF RAVENSWORTH FARM HISTORY

Have you ever wondered why the name "Pillow" was selected for a street name in our community? Had you thought that maybe Serta was advertising in our neighborhood? You might be amazed to find out that all of our street names have a Civil War connection and that "Pillow" was actually named for Fort Pillow on the Mississippi River, near Memphis. The editors made the connections and did the research, although we didn't find them all. "Penley" is one example where we were unsuccessful. "In April 1864, Nathan Bedford Forrest's Confederates surrounded Fort **Pillow** on the east bank of the Mississippi River near Memphis. Fort Pillow was being held by 552 black Union troops and a group of Tennessee unionists. When the defenders refused to surrender, Forrest's men stormed the fort. Over three hundred disarmed defenders, black and white, were slaughtered."

"Adair County, Missouri was the site of a battle on August 6-9, 1862. The Union Army attacked and secured Kirksville, Missouri; this victory helped maintain Union dominance in Missouri, a border state."

"Commander James **Bullock** was sent to Britain to purchase warships for the Confederacy. Bullock was able to contract for the construction of four ironclads. Bullock supervised the construction in Europe. The ships were to be seaworthy of the Atlantic and able to navigate the Mississippi River. The dream was to use these ships to break the Union naval blockade. Of the four warships ordered, only one ever saw service."
