Watch program might look like. What is clear is that we have the ability to structure it as we wish. Based upon the input at the meeting, as well as many conversations that I have had in the past several months, I feel that further exploration of re-establishing a Ravensworth Farm Neighborhood Watch is supported. Of course, re-establishing will not occur unless we have two things: 1) A dedicated Neighborhood Watch Coordinator, and: 2) A committed group of volunteers to perform the functions (a minimum of 25 volunteers were recommended by the Police for a neighborhood of our size, however the most successful watches have the most dedicated volunteers—and a mix of daytime and evening volunteers.) If you are willing to be a part of this initiative, either as the coordinator or as a volunteer member, call my number (703-321-8711 or email me at pricey5@cox.net). Do it now, before you forget.

<u>Safety and Security Tip</u>: Even without a formal neighborhood watch in place, the Fairfax County Police urges everyone to call 911 or the County Police non-emergency hotline number (703-691-2131), as appropriate, if you observe something out of the ordinary. They will respond. Also to minimize the opportunity for vandalism and theft, lock your cars when parked and do not leave valuables (lap tops, GPS devices, tools, purses, etc.) in your automobiles.

Save the Dates: December 20th- Holiday Hayride and March 20th - Neighborhood 50th Anniversary Celebration: Mark your calendars for the December 20th Hayride (5-7 pm) and the afternoon and evening of March 20th for our community's 50th birthday celebration. DEFRAY THE COST OF FOOD WITH THE SNAP PROGRAM

Many Braddock residents may be facing loss of income during the current economic downturn. To help make it through difficult times there are several programs that provide assistance. One is the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance or SNAP program which can help to defray the cost of food for your family: http://www.dss.virginia.gov/benefit/foodstamp.html

While the application process can be complex, a family of four with a monthly gross income of less than \$2050 could receive up to a maximum of \$668 a month in benefits. The money is placed on a debit card that can be used for eligible purchases and are exempt from state sales taxes. Residents may submit an application to the Department of Family Services on-line (http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/dfs); by mail, or fax.

Your application will be reviewed on the day that it is received for possible eligibility, although it may take up to 30 days to actually process your application.



TWO LOCAL ROAD CLOSURES YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT

1. Exit 166-B off I-95 South Bound closed during the first week in November.

The detour route is using Exit 167, immediately north of the Closed Exit Ramp.

- 2. Fullerton Road closed at the Fairfax County Parkway in early November due to construction on the Fairfax County Parkway Project.
 - Traffic on North Bound Fullerton Road north of Boudinot Drive will have access to the Fairfax County Parkway east bound, Fairfax County Maintenance/Bus Facility and I-95 Ramps ONLY.
 - Fullerton Traffic off Backlick Road will have access to local businesses north of Fairfax County Parkway and Belvoir North Area ONLY.
 - Fairfax County Parkway West Bound traffic will have access to south bound Fullerton Road, Central Motors Property and Boudinot Drive. Access to Backlick and Alban Road will be using Boudinot Drive.

Both Closures will last approximately 12 months!!!

SECURITY TIPS FROM THE LOCAL POLICE

Did you know that 60 percent of car thefts and vandalism occur in unlocked vehicles? That most home break-ins occur between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.? At our recent General Meeting, we learned some tips to keep our neighborhood safe:

- Do you see something out of the ordinary? DON'T RATIONALIZE IT. For example, you might think, "Oh, that man entering the house down the street is probably a workman." Or, "that person is just looking inside my car because they like the make & model." Or, those people are probably going to visit someone further down the street." Call and report unusual people around you.
- Please report suspicious or unusual behavior, people and noises. You are <u>not</u> bothering the police; they have cars out patrolling and want to respond. It's better to call and have it be nothing, than not to call at all. You may be helping the police determine a pattern of behavior that can be stopped.
- A visible presence discourages crime by eliminating opportunity and deterring teenagers. The patrol car will come and investigate. If a group of kids is thinking about getting into mischief, this will stop them.
- If a solicitor comes to your door, **IMMEDIATELY CALL THE POLICE**. Most solicitors are really just canvassing the neighborhood looking for opportunities. Anyone who comes to your door should be licensed by the county and carrying a permit that says so. Call the non-emergency number and describe the person at your door and the direction they are heading. The police WILL come and investigate to see if they are properly licensed.
- Lock your doors--house and automobiles. Most electronics are taken from unlocked cars. Teenagers look for small change in open cars
- Don't leave your garage doors open or unlocked. Trust your woman's intuition. If something feels wrong, report it.
- Program the Police Non-Emergency number into all land and cell phones: 703-691-2131 Do this today.
- Consider joining the Neighborhood Watch group. Communities with active Watch groups have significant fewer crimes and far less vandalism.

EMERGENCY HOME HEATING ASSISTANCE

Residents who need help to pay home heating bills or who face an emergency heating situation this winter may be able to obtain assistance from a federally funded program locally administered by the county's Department of Family Services. The Crisis Assistance program helps households in emergency situations by providing security deposits for heat and funding the repair or replacement of heating equipment. The Crisis Assistance application period runs through Monday, March 15, 2010.

To apply for this heating assistance program you can download an application online at http://www.dss.virginia.gov/ benefit/ea/fuel/forms.cgi; complete it and fax it to 703-324-8242, or mail it to Fairfax County Department of Family Services – Pennino Building, c/o Energy Assistance, 12011 Government Center Parkway, Suite 232, Fairfax, VA 22035. This application cannot be completed on-line.


