FROM THE PRESIDENT:

Dear Neighbors:

After our recent storms, I heard a few stories from folks about downed wires, no electricity or cable, and hard feelings between neighbors because of limbs coming down in yards.

Last year Ravensworth turned 50 years old so we need to be aware that most of our trees are at least that old and they need looking after. As I walked around our neighborhood after our one big snowstorm of the season, I was amazed to see the extensive tree damage. My neighbors next door and across the street both had trees come down in their front yards. Luckily there was no damage to their houses, but it was close in both instances.

On Queensbury there is a tree down in a backyard that stretches across a few properties. I would imagine they will have to get a large crane in to lift the tree so as not to damage any structures. Almost every street that I drove on had some tree damage and many power lines were downed. I am sure that the main cause was an unusually heavy snow and high winds, but there is a way to mitigate some of this damage.

50 FREE RAIN BARRELS FOR RAVENSWORTH RESIDENTS

The Board of RFCA has received a grant from TransUrban to provide Ravensworth residents with 50 free rain barrels. These normally cost between around \$50 - \$65. Don't know what a rain barrel does? See the information: Why Rain Barrels and Rain Barrel FAQ (below).

How to get one? Well, the details are still being worked out, but you will have to:

- Register in advance online. [A link will be provided on our website.]
- Attend a workshop where you and your neighbors will assemble it. The first workshop will be the May 26th regular civic association meeting. Another workshop will be announced later.
- We will provide the accessories you need to attach it to your rain downspout at the workshops.

The first 50 people to register and attend the meeting will get their rain barrels! Keep watching the website or read next month's Farmer for more information.

WHY RAIN BARRELS?

Rain barrels can be attached to your downspouts to capture runoff from the roof. By installing a rain barrel at your home you will:

Provide your plants with water they will love! Unlike treated water, which is "softened" with dissolved minerals, rain water is naturally soft. The water stored in your rain barrel is better than municipal water for washing your car and watering indoor or outdoor plants.

Save money and water! Instead of water from the tap or faucet, you can use the water you've saved to keep your home landscape happy and growing. You'll also reduce your municipal water bill!



Protect the Chesapeake Bay! Water stored in your rain barrel is water that won't rush off into our streams. Instead, as you use the stored rain water around the home and gar-

den, it will absorb slowly into the ground replenishing groundwater supplies. By decreasing the volume of storm runoff, rain barrels also help moderate stream erosion and the resulting pollution that is impairing the Chesapeake Bay.

RAIN BARREL FAQS

What do the rain barrels look like and where do you get them?

The rain barrels are made from black plastic barrels that used to hold pickles, olives, peppers or onions. We purchase these barrels from a variety of barrel distributors and reuse them as rain barrels.

How large are the rain barrels?

The rain barrels hold approximately 50 gallons. They are roughly 23 inches wide. They range from 41.25 inches to 43.75 inches tall.

Will I get mosquitoes in my rain barrel?

The rain barrels are capped with fiberglass screen that allows water in, but keeps mosquitoes from getting into the barrel to lay their eggs. However, if you are concerned about mosquitoes breeding in your rain barrel, you can add

half a Mosquito Dunk to the water in your barrel to kill mosquito larvae. Mosquito Dunks can be purchased at most garden supply stores.

I prefer not to shorten my downspout. Is there another way to hook up my rain barrel?

Another option for installing your rain barrel is to use a downspout diverter. Diverters can be manual or automatic. The main advantage of the diverter is that it can be used to regulate the flow of water into the rain barrel. Often you also don't have to shorten your downspout, but you will likely still have to cut into the downspout to install the diverter.

Is the water in the rain barrel safe to use in my vegetable garden?

There are differing opinions on this subject. Rain barrels that collect water from copper roofs or from roofs where wooden shingles or shakes have been treated with CCA (chromated copper arsenate) to prevent moss or algae growth, should not be used on edible plants. If you have treated your roof with chemicals or installed zinc strips to prevent moss or algae growth, you should also not use the water in your rain barrel in your vegetable garden. Other considerations include the potential for air pollution in your area. Water flowing from your roof can contain deposited air pollutants. However, this water may end up in your vegetable garden anyway. No matter what you decide, make sure to wash all your garden produce thoroughly before you eat it!

REPORTING A CRIME

The Citizen Reporting System (CRS) is designed to make it easier and more convenient for you to file a police report without leaving home; however, not every crime can be reported using the Citizen Reporting System.

What crimes DO qualify for CRS?

Please use the Fairfax County on-line reporting service for the following crimes:

- Alcohol Violations
- Check and/or Credit Card Case
- Civil Disputes
- Destruction of Property
- Disorderly Conduct
- Identity Theft
- Larceny up to \$5000
- Loitering
- Lost Property

What crimes can only be reported in person?

CRS is NOT appropriate for the following crimes:

- Larceny over \$5,000
- Larceny by force
- Larceny with a stolen drivers license, passport or social security card.
- Check, Credit card cases, stolen values over \$5,000
- Incidents occurring within past 30 minutes
- Violent crimes, completed or attempted
- Sex crimes, completed or attempted

- Noise Violations
- Obtaining False Identification
- Police Service
- Solicitor Violations
- Suspicious Events/Persons/Vehicles
- Trespassing
- Telephone Harassment/Threats
- Vehicle Tampering
- Theft or loss of a firearm
- Stolen vehicles, completed or attempted
- Stolen license plate
- Breaking and entering your home or business, completed or attempted
- Crimes committed due to race, religion, ethnic or national origin, disability and/or sexual orientation
- Aggressive driving

Why can't I use on-line reporting for all crimes?

Some crimes may require evidence collection, photography, or other investigative procedure which require an officer to respond to the scene of the crime.

Can I use CRS to report a hit and run crash?

- If the hit and run crash involves injuries, call 911
- If no injuries, call police non emergency number, 703-691-2131
- Call taker will determine whether your report can be taken by CRS

How long will it take to process my report? Normally, within 72 hours



Can I get a copy of the report?

Actual police reports are not released since they may contain information critical to an investigation or which could be used for identity theft. A verification letter regarding your report may be obtained by calling the Fairfax County Police Department Central Records Section at 703-246-2272.

Can I report a crime that happened outside Fairfax County?

No, your crime or incident must have occurred in Fairfax County, VA. If the incident happened outside Fairfax County, VA, file a report in the jurisdiction where the crime occurred.

What is the purpose of filing a report with CRS?

- Primarily for insurance and police information purposes
- Case will not be investigated
- Assists in preventing future crimes by providing statistics on trends, locations and times of violations.
- May assist in the identification and return of stolen property recovered as the result of other investigations.

If I know who committed the crime, can I still use CRS?

Only if you do not pursue criminal prosecution through the courts

What if my incident does not qualify for CRS?

If your incident isn't eligible for online reporting or if you would like to speak directly to an officer, call the Fairfax County Police Department's non-emergency number, 703-691-2131. You may also go to any one of our eight Fairfax County Police - District Stations and report the incident in person.



STOP ON RED-KIDS AHEAD (THEIR LIVES DEPEND ON YOU)

All Motorists **MUST STOP** for a **SCHOOL BUS** when a **SCHOOL BUS** is **STOPPED** for the purpose of **LOADING** or **UNLOADING CHILDREN**. Check out the **RULES** for these various situations:

At Intersections:




A driver approaching **FROM ANY DIRECTION** must stop and remain stopped until all children are clear of the highway and the bus is put in motion.

All motorists must stop, **EVEN IN THE CENTER TURNING LANE**, and remain stopped until all children are clear of the highway and the bus is put in motion.

Even when Safety Devices are NOT working:



MOTORISTS ARE REQUIRED TO STOP, when a school bus is loading or unloading children even if the school traffic safety devices are NOT functioning properly.

There are legal penalties for not stopping. Penalties can include: Reckless Driving charge, Jail for not less than 12 months, Fine of \$2,500 (or BOTH), 4 points on your license.






