FROM THE PRESIDENT:

Fall is upon us and with that comes school buses and homework, pumpkins and trick or treating, and a return to tolerable temperatures. Some activities are welcome, such as football tailgates, camping, and longer walks with our four-legged friends. Some may not be as welcome like raking leaves, stacking firewood, and the post-Labor Day traffic increase. But it's hard to beat putting the annual heat waves behind us and turning off the air conditioning!

Longer walks and more time outdoors bring increased interaction with neighbors and wildlife. While walking our dog around the lake two weeks ago we nearly stepped on a large copperhead. Fortunately it was noticed in time for me to swipe him away with a stick. However, it reminded me about white-tailed deer and the inherent risk that increases with the approaching mating season.

FREE WHOOPING COUGH / TETANUS/ DIPTHERIA (TDAP) VACCINA-TIONS



The Fairfax County Health Department is offering free Tdap vaccine to people aged 19 and older. In particular, parents & caregivers of infants, people who come into contact with pregnant women, and healthcare workers, are encouraged to get vaccinated at one of the Health Department's clinic sites. ELECTION DAY

In case you've had your head in the sand for the last few months, here's your notice- Election Day is November 6. If you were registered to vote by October 12, you should have received your new voter registration card in the mail by now. (If you haven't, call the Office of Elections at 703-222-0776)

<u>Poil Information</u> Polls are open November 6 from 6:00 am to 7:00 pm. All those in line at 7:00 pm will be able to vote. Ravensworth Farm is in the Eleventh Congressional District. Our State Senate district is 035 and our House of Delegates district is 039. Our Fairfax County supervisor district is Braddock. Our polling location is Ravensworth Elementary School at 5411 Nutting Drive.

<u>Voting Machines</u> Voters have a choice of voting a paper ballot using the Optical Scan voting machine or an electronic ballot using the touchscreen machine. If you choose the optical scan, you will use a pencil to fill in the ovals next to your choices, similar to many tests you may have taken throughout your academic career, and then you will personally place your ballot in the scanner. If you choose the touchscreen voting machine, you will use a machine similar to the self-checkout machines at many retail stores. Both machines are secure and your properly-cast ballot will be counted. Tip: If you don't care which machine you use, ask the poll workers which line is moving faster. They will know.

<u>Voter ID Requirements</u> Here are the acceptable forms of voter ID in Virginia according to the Virginia State Board of Elections.

- Virginia voter registration card (recently mailed to all registered voters in Virginia)
- Valid Virginia driver's license
- Military ID
- Any Federal, Virginia state or local government-issued photo ID
- Employer issued photo ID card
- Concealed handgun permit
- Valid student ID issued by any Virginia institution of higher education
- Current utility bill, bank statement, government check or paycheck indicating the name and address of the voter
- Social Security card (unless you are a first-time voter who registered by mail)

A voter who does not bring an acceptable ID to the polls will be offered a provisional ballot.

First-time Virginia Voters If you registered to vote in Virginia by mail, federal law requires you to show identification when voting in person or absentee for the first time in a federal election. Any of the following types of ID are acceptable:

- 1. A current and valid photo ID (for example a driver's license);
- 2. A current utility bill, bank statement, government check or paycheck that shows name and address;
- 3. Another government document that shows name and address (example: voter card).

<u>Choices, Choices</u> In addition to the five Presidential candidates on the ballot in Virginia, six candidates are contesting the Eleventh Congressional District's seat in the U.S. House of Representatives. There are two candidates for the U.S. Senate.

There are two proposed constitutional amendments up for vote in Virginia. In addition, Fairfax County has four bonds on the ballot. These are for Parks and Park Facilities, Public Libraries, Public Safety, and Storm Drainage Improvement.

CONGRESSIONAL FACTOID

Benjamin Franklin told the Constitutional Convention he didn't think public servants should be paid. But others disagreed, and beginning in 1789 members of Congress received a \$6 per diem for every day they were in session. (In today's dollars, that would be \$157.92.) By 1955, when Ravensworth Farm was new and houses here sold for around \$22,000, congressional pay was at a \$12,500 annual salary.

Today, the average rank-and-file lawmaker collects \$174,000 per year, while party leaders earn \$193,400 and the Speaker of the House receives \$223,500.

The salaries are paid regardless of how much Congress is actually working. The House has worked 106 days through mid-September (105 in the Senate), and is scheduled to finish the year with 133 days in session. That means most lawmakers would make \$1,308.27 per day in 2012.


