TWO BOARD POSITIONS OPEN





WHICH MIDDLE SCHOOLS HAD THE MOST STUDENTS ACCEPTED TO THOMAS JEFFERSON HS?

Of the 3,121 students who applied to Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology, 76 percent of applicants were from Fairfax County. For the second consecutive year, the majority of students accepted to the incoming freshman class at Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology (TJHSST or TJ) will come from middle schools in Herndon and Falls Church.

According to data from Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS), Carson Middle School in Herndon had the most students accepted, a total of 64, for the class of 2017. Longfellow Middle School in Falls Church and Rocky Run Middle School in Chantilly each had 55 students accepted. Last year, 76 students were admitted from Carson and 72 from Longfellow.

A total of 3,121 students applied to TJ this year, according to statistics released by FCPS. Seventy-six percent of those students are from Fairfax County schools. Carson also had the highest number of students apply to TJ this year, a total of 217, followed closely by Longfellow, which had 214 students apply to the governor's school. Nearby schools with students due to attend TJ include:

Frost Middle School - 105 applied - 21 Admitted to TJ Glasgow Middle School - 66 applied - under 10 admitted to TJ Lake Braddock - 149 applied - 21 admitted to TJ Robinson - 48 applied - under 10 admitted to TJ

RAVENSWORTH POOL NEWS

The Ravensworth Farm Swim & Racquet Club met April 18. The pool will open May 25. There will be a "Meet & Greet" party May 18. The Board introduced Will Shaffer as the new pool manager. Mr. Shaffer is a Physical Education teacher at Weyanoke Elementary and has previously worked as Parliament Pool's manager. Heather Vogus is the Dive Team coordinator, Melinda Young coordinates the Swim Team and Cathy Krogel will coordinate Fledglings. Swim Team is Division 6 this year. All practice schedules are already on the Pool's website, as are A meet schedules. B meet schedules will be settled soon. Dive Team is Division 5 and is a developmental team so divers are not required to dive in meets unless they choose to do so.

In the past, Ravensworth Farm and Parliament Pool have had a reciprocity agreement to use each other's pools when their own pool is closed for swimming due to a meet. It is probable the agreement will continue this year. If you don't plan to cheer on the Ravens during their first home meet on June 22, head on over to Parliament Pool (8510 Parliament Drive, Kings Park) for a swim.

Lifeguards age 16 and older are encouraged to get their Operator's Certificate to take on more responsibility in working with the pool chemicals. Those with an Operator's Certificate will be paid \$1/hour more. Brenda Tobin is hiring students age 14 and up to work in the concession stand. Students aged 14 and 15 must obtain a work permit from their high school's counselor.

There are many opportunities for involvement with the Pool. The Board position for Activities Director is currently open. Board members receive a free family membership in exchange for their hard work and attendance at meetings every month of the year. Springfield Days is a community wide celebration that takes place the weekend after Memorial Day each year in Springfield, Virginia.
