CONSTRUCTION AROUND RAVENSWORTH FARM

Ravensworth Elementary School Expansion

Major Construction of School – parking lots and surrounding grounds (Dust/Noise/Run-off/Traffic – Vehicles-People)

The project began the first part of May, 2014. Construction will last approximately 2 years. The size of the existing structure is 62,000 square feet and the new addition of 8 classrooms, an administration wing and two SACC classrooms will add approximately 18,000 square feet. The addition will be one story. Some parking will be added but the kiss and ride has also been re-worked to allow for more cars to be on the school site, rather than queuing in the street. Stormwater management work will include some offsite work and a public improvement to fix an existing outfall. There will be an underground retention or detention facility on-site.



Ravensworth Shopping Center

Major Construction of Ravensworth Shopping Center (Dust/Noise/Run-off/Traffic –Vehicles-People) The Safeway lease ends in February 2015. Proposed new anchor tenant is Lotté Plaza. Tenant selection is ongoing and permits for the façade renewal have not yet been secured. Shopping Center owner and Supervisor Cook will have a Town Hall meeting October 16 at North Springfield Elementary School at 7:30pm.

Washington Gas

Ravensworth Farm Gas Line Replacement to every household

(Noise, Traffic – Vehicles-People/Roads, Yards, Sidewalks)

Supervisor Cook heard back from the Director of Construction on this project. Washington Gas anticipates completion of the gas piping work in late July or early August. Permanent restoration of any hard surfaces and disturbed ground will begin shortly after that with completion anticipated before the end of September. This project includes the installation of all new gas main piping first, followed by changing over and/or replacement of all the individual customer's gas services once this new main pipe is installed and the abandonment of the original gas main lines. Throughout this project Washington Gas has personnel assigned to address any concerns or issues raised by community members and directly contact each homeowner whose gas line is impacted.

Lake Accotink Park Bridge Walkway and Trail

Lake Accotink Park Bridge Walkway development and Trail repair

(Noise, Traffic – Vehicles-People/Roads, Yards, Sidewalks)

The Park Authority Board recently approved the scope to design and permit this project. Burgess & Niple Inc. is being awarded the contract for design.

Design/Permitting Planned completion dates: Design - September 2014, Permitting - September 2015

The selected contractor will determine the best method for accomplishing the construction and a construction schedule is not yet available, but at a recent meeting there was discussion of a pre-fab bridge design option. Construction should be complete in the late Fall of 2015.

Braddock Road Expansion

(Home relocation Buffer Placement / Greenway/ Dust/Noise/Run-off/Traffic -Vehicles-People)

This project could potentially widen Braddock Road from six general purpose lanes to eight lanes by adding two HOV lanes from Burke Lake Road to the 495 Express Lanes. The schedule, which is very tentative, and subject to change is as follows:

April, 2014: Internal staff review of tasks to be included in a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a Consultant; Mid-May to Mid-June: RFP issued; August to September RFP Contract Execution; 2016—Study Completion; 2023 – Construction Completion

All of these dates are ambitious. To get continuing updates please go to the Supervisor's website: http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/braddock/braddockroad.htm. RFCA President Kevin Joyce serves on the study committee and may be the best option for the community to receive updates.

General

Most construction will take place Monday-through Friday. Most crews work 7:00 am to 3:00 pm. However, no specific approvals are required to work on weekends. Hours when work can take place without a noise variance request are Monday through Friday 7 am to 9:00 pm and Sundays from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm.



SENIOR SCENARIO: HANDYMAN SCAMS

Fairfax County's Aging, Caregiver and Disability Resource Line at 703-324-7948 receives thousands of calls each year from residents seeking information on a wide range of services and recreational opportunities. While many callers just need a quick referral, some have difficult issues and benefit from a conversation with our professional human services workers. The Resource Line received the following call about an all too familiar issue: Handyman Scams.

The Call

Claire, a 78 year-old resident, called about a handyman who was pressuring her for home repair work. She had already hired him to repair her roof, replace gutters and remove a dead tree branch. So far, she has paid him \$12,000.

The problem was Clair thought the work was inadequate and incomplete. She told the Resource Line worker that it looked like he tried to repair instead of replace the gutters and that the removed branch left an unsightly stump and was left on her driveway. She said she now doubted whether her roof actually needed repair.

When she complained to the handyman, he told her it would cost her more to complete the work to her satisfaction.

The Response

The Resource Line worker told Claire to always ask to see a door-to-door solicitor's business license. This is a Fairfax County requirement and it is a misdemeanor to knock on doors and solicit work without one. Those who perform lawn care or hedge trimming do not need a license. Claire was also told that Fairfax County detectives investigate these types of scams and that she should call the Fairfax County Non-Emergency Police line at 703-691-2131.

More on Door-to-Door Solicitors

According to the Fairfax County Police, handyman scammers stalk neighborhoods looking for older adults to scam. Apparently, they believe older adults are more trusting and reluctant to report being scammed because of embarrassment. Scammers often put on quite a show - parking trucks and equipment in the neighborhood to appear legitimate and then knocking on doors. Other common chores that scammers offer include car dent removal, driveway paving, home improvement services, and tree and landscape work.

SPEEDING INITIATIVE




In August, Fairfax County launched the first installment of Supervisor Cook's Speeding Initiative which was previously passed and funded by the Board of Supervisors. The initiative is a public education campaign to curb neighborhood speeding in Fairfax County.

The initiative is comprised of a vigorous awareness campaign that will remind drivers to slow down in neighborhoods. The campaign will feature the slogan, "Slow Down: You live here. We live here." and will include community education events throughout the fall.

This effort began on June 19, 2012 with a board matter drafted by Supervisor Cook, and cosponsored by Supervisor Hyland and Supervisor McKay. After extensive review and analysis by county staff, a draft plan was presented to the Board on July 27, 2012. The Board approved the first phase of the plan last year through funding at carry over.

The robust campaign is a collaborative endeavor between Supervisor Cook's office, the Board of Supervisors, the County Office of Public Affairs, and the Fairfax County Police Department.

CHILDREN SATIATED BY HEALTHY SNACKS

Any frazzled parent knows the mantra of growing children: "I'm hungry." And even though it's not going to earn any parenting accolades, reaching for a fatty, salty snack can be the response guaranteed to satiate a child's never-waning appetite. But the results of a new study suggest that a healthier snack can be not only lower in calories, but also just as likely to satisfy.

A Cornell University study tested 200 elementary school students divided into several groups that were given different types of snacks. Some ate chips, some vegetables, some cheese, and some a combination of cheese and vegetables. And all the kids were invited to enjoy their snacks while watching an hour of TV.



The result: The children who munched on the cheese-and-veggie combo ate 72 percent fewer calories than those who snacked on potato chips. The cheese-and-veggie kids also reported satisfaction rates as high as children who munched chips.

Was it the crunch of the vegetables that made them so satisfying? The fun of eating them with the cheese? Or maybe that the veggies and cheese took longer to eat than potato chips?

Perhaps. But the important message of the study is that eating healthier, low-calorie foods can satisfy a child's craving for snacks. This study isn't the only one trying to crack the code of how to get children to eat their vegetables. Another study found that 8- to 11-year-olds ate about one-third more vegetables when they were given creative marketing names such as "X-Ray Carrots" and "Power Punch Broccoli." And recent research in Spain calculated that children were 80 percent more likely to eat their vegetables when allowed to choose their own.

CAR THEFTS: PREVENTION & AFTERMATH

Editor's Note: With several attempted and accomplished minivan thefts in Ravensworth Farm the night of August 21/22, this article reprinted from the August 2014 GEICO Connection is timely.

According to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), in 2011 there were an estimated 717,373 motor vehicle thefts, costing \$4.3 billion nationally. These statistics show a 3.3 percent decline in the nation's theft rate, averaging one motor vehicle theft every 44.1 seconds. Don't get burned. Whether you live near an auto-theft hot spot or not, you can use the National Insurance Crime Bureau's (NICB's) four "layers of protection" to help stop thieves in their tracks.



Common Sense

Among other safety precautions, always remove keys from the ignition and keep doors locked when your vehicle isn't in use.

Warning Device Install anything from an audible alarm to a steering-column collar to tell car thieves your car is protected.

Immobilizing Device Use smart keys, kill switches and other tech tools to prevent a thief from bypassing the ignition and hot-wiring your car.

Tracking Device Install this to send a signal to police or a monitoring station if your vehicle is stolen. In a few states, it could even qualify you for an additional discount on your auto coverage.

If your car is stolen, your insurance company is there to help. Below is a detailed guide on reporting a car theft and how to get back in the driver's seat.

Call the police as soon as possible. If your vehicle has been stolen, you should contact the police immediately and file a stolen vehicle report. GEICO cannot honor a claim for vehicle theft unless you first file a police report.


Report your claim After contacting the police, report the theft to your insurance company. If you do not have comprehensive physical damage coverage, you should still notify your insurance company of any stolen vehicles immediately. Notifying your insurer of the vehicle theft could help protect you if the thief causes damage to others with your car.

A few things you'll need when you contact your insurer:

- Certificate of Title for the vehicle.
- Location of all keys to the vehicle before and after the theft.
- Names and contact information of everyone who had access to the vehicle.
- A description of your vehicle, including mileage, options, service records, and upgrades
- A list of personal property stolen with your vehicle. Coverage for personal items varies from state to state, and your homeowners or renters insurance policy may provide additional coverage for personal items that were stolen.
- Please include any finance or leasing company contact information and your account number, if applicable.

If the stolen vehicle is financed or leased, report the theft to your finance or leasing company. To expedite your claim's process, inform your finance or leasing company to discuss the case directly with your insurer.


