
I hope everyone made it through Snowzilla safely. We lost a tree but it's now sitting in the woodpile. Hope to see you in March.



COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP "JUNK" TRUCK MARCH 19

You know you have stuff that has to go. Now's the time! Jim Hickey, of the Civic Association's Green Committee, has arranged for a Fairfax County trash disposal truck to be parked at the Ravensworth Farm pool parking lot on Saturday, March 19 from 8:00am to noon collect items which are not accepted by private trash collectors at curbside. Now is the time to get rid of old appliances, furniture, mattresses, boards, doors (no glass), swing sets, lawn mowers (thoroughly drained of fluids), piping, etc.

Items that CANNOT be accepted include hazardous waste (batteries, including the small "button" and rechargeables, paint, used oil, pesticides and lawn care products), tires, sheetrock, stone or crushed rocks, and products that can be recycled - such as newspapers, cans and glass. Also, brush will not be collected



THIS IS IMPORTANT!! You may not dump your trash at the pool prior to the arrival of the County trucks or after the trucks depart!

We need volunteers with pick-up trucks or trailers for assisting those people who need help getting large, bulky items to the school. Make every effort to get your materials to the pool on your own as this pick-up is intended mainly for disabled or elderly residents. We cannot clean out basements. To offer assistance or schedule a pick-up, call Jim Hickey at 703-321-8535. For instructions on where to dispose of hazardous waste, call 703-324-5068, and for where to dispose of stumps, rocks and tile, call 703-690-1703.

TO BE CREATIVE, GET A LITTLE BORED

We have all done it: In the grocery store check-out line, we flip out our smartphones to entertain ourselves for the few minutes it takes to wait our turn.

During long runs we can listen to podcasts. During short waits at the doctor's office, we now have the world to entertain us — just on a small screen, with potential data fees to apply. Basically, we don't need to be bored anymore.

But some researchers say that might not be a good thing. United Kingdom scientists asked a group of 40 study participants to copy telephone numbers out of a phone book for 15 minutes. A second group of 40 people were asked to perform a creative task. Then, both groups were asked to come up with as many different uses for a white foam cup as possible. The group that came up with more uses for the cup? The group initially bored by copying numbers out of a telephone book.

The researchers followed up this study with a second study including 90 participants. This group was split into three groups: two groups performing boring tasks and a control group. The results were similar: People who undertook the boring tasks came up with more uses for the foam cup than the control group.

The scientists speculate that the boring activities free up parts of your brain to daydream, even forcing your brain to focus on new ways to carry out a boring task in order to make it more interesting. In this way, the researchers say, daydreaming can be a very important tool. If the mind is sufficiently bored — or occupied with a menial task — it can explore solutions to problems hanging around in the subconscious. The people who say that your best ideas come in the shower can now back up their conviction scientifically. It might be time to invest in one of those waterproof notepads.

Fresh fruits and vegetables delivered straight to our Farm! by Jen Auble

Lancaster Farm Fresh Cooperative (LFFC) is a non-profit organic farmers cooperative of 75 farmers in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. This year, LFFC has a weekend pick-up location in Ravensworth Farm on Inverchapel Road.

LFFC provides fresh, certified organic fruits, vegetables, and other farm-fresh products through a subscription program known as Community Supported Agriculture (CSA). CSA members commit to support LFFC farmers for the entire growing season by prepaying for their share of the harvest in the winter and early spring. The farmers are able to purchase supplies in the winter and start their crops in early spring. They repay the shareholders in fresh, organic, seasonal produce. CSAs enable you to keep local sustainable farms and local food safe for future generations. The produce sold through LFFC is certified organic unless otherwise noted.



As a current shareholder, I can say that it has been a very enjoyable experience. I think the other 60 members from the neighborhood would agree. Tell your friends from nearby neighborhoods how easy it will be to get fresh veggies and fruits. It's even closer than the Farmer's Market.

<u>How does it work?</u> Every Thursday, the list of items on the share is emailed out to members, so that everyone can menu plan for the coming Saturday's delivery on Inverchapel Rd not far from the pool. There are active Facebook and Pinterest sites where members share recipes that they are making using the produce from the week's share. At pick-up, there's a "swap box" to which you can add produce from your share box that your family doesn't eat as much of and take more of something your family likes better. (The swap box works best if you're among the first to pick up your share after delivery.)

What does it cost? This spring/summer season is 26 weeks from May to October. LFFC has medium and large shares available for vegetables. Best of all, the produce is very affordable and ranges from \$23-\$32 per week for veggies (depending on share size) and \$10 per week for fruit (21 weeks). In addition to fruits and vegetables, there are also chicken, meat, cheese, bread, and egg shares available.

The website provides examples of the shares in different seasons and the different types of vegetables that you may receive in a typical week.

COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE ON KEEPING ANIMALS

2-512 Limitations on the Keeping of Animals

- 1. The keeping of commonly accepted pets shall be allowed as an accessory use on any lot, provided such pets are for personal use and enjoyment, and not for any commercial purpose. Dogs shall be subject to the provisions of Paragraph 2 below.
- 2. The keeping of dogs, except a kennel as permitted by the provisions of Part 5 of Article 9, shall be allowed as an accessory use on any lot in accordance with the following:

A. The number of dogs permitted shall be in accordance with the following schedule, except that, in determining the number of dogs allowed, only those dogs six (6) months or older in age shall be counted.

Number of Dogs and Minimum Lot Size

1 to 2 dogs - No requirement

3 to 4 dogs - 12,500 square feet

5 to 6 dogs - 20,000 square feet

7 or more dogs - 25,000 square feet plus 5,000 square feet for each additional dog above 7

ENERGY SAVING TIPS

Question: I'm on a fixed income and last winter my heating bills were really expensive. What can I do to prepare my home and be more energy efficient this year?

Answer: There are a wide variety of things you can do to make your home more energy efficient that will help you save money this winter. Here are a few tips:

- Set your thermostat no higher than 68 degrees when you are home and lower the temperature when you go to bed or when you are not at home. This will ensure optimal home heating and save energy.
- Cut annual heating bills by as much as 10 percent a year by turning your thermostat back 10 to 15 percent for eight hours a day.
- Weatherize your home by caulking and weather-stripping all doors and windows. Also use locks on your windows to make them tighter and draft resistant.
- Reducing air leaks could cut 10 percent from an average household's monthly energy bill. The most common
 places where air escapes homes are: floors, walls, ceilings, ducts, fireplaces, plumbing penetrations, doors,
 windows, fans, vents, and electrical outlets.
- Keep shades and curtains open during the day on the south side of your home to allow solar heating. Close them at night to retain heat.
- Don't block your radiators or heating vents with furniture or draperies. Keep your radiators, registers, and baseboard heaters dirt and dust free.
- Close vents and doors in unused rooms.
- Have your heating system serviced yearly, and regularly replace furnace filters. During the heating season, change or clean furnace filters each month.
- Use Energy Star labeled lighting for outdoor fixtures and other lights left on for more than four hours.
- Close the fireplace damper when not in use.
- Turn your water heater down to 120 degrees to save money on your electricity bill. If you have children in the house, this also is a safety measure.

HARSH PENALTIES FOR TEENS' NIGHT DRIVING VIOLATIONS CURB CRASH RATES

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 16- to 19-year-olds face a greater risk of traffic crashes than any other age group.

Massachusetts lawmakers implemented a no-nonsense law several years ago to help reduce the risk of crashes for these young drivers. One of the key provisions of the new law ... and perhaps the most attention getting for young drivers ... is increased penalties for violating the daily driving curfew. The curfew is in effect from 12:30 a.m. to 5 a.m. Previously, the punishment for driving without a supervising adult during this time had been a \$35 fine for first -time offenders and fines up to \$100 for repeat incidents. But the new penalties hit teen drivers where it really hurts: a 60-day driver's license suspension for the first violation, with increases to 180 days and one year for second- and third-timers, respectively. Plus, any repeat violations require additional training for the teen driver. The law also called for a new driving training curriculum that addresses drowsy driving, as well as greater penalties for dangerous driving behaviors, restrictions on underage passengers and other provisions.

Data from a six-year timeframe, including one year before the law changed and five years after, showed definite improvements. Crashes involving 16- and 17-year-old drivers declined nearly 19 percent, while 18- to 19-year-olds saw about a 7 percent decrease. Traffic accidents that caused an "incapacitating injury" or death were reduced for all drivers. One of the study authors said teens are less able than adults to resist the urge to sleep. It makes sense, then, that ratcheting up penalties for night-time driving violations was the biggest key to reducing crashes.


