

# YOU ARE INVITED! JOIN RAVENSWORTH'S NEW COMMUNITY SUPPORTED AGRICULTURE (CSA)

Fresh fruits and vegetables are being delivered directly to Ravensworth Farm!

Lancaster Farm Fresh Cooperative (LFFC) is a non-profit organic farmers' cooperative of 75 farmers in Lancaster County Pennsylvania. LFFC provides fresh, certified organic fruits, vegetables, and other farm fresh products through a subscription program also known as Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program. CSA members commit to support LFFC farmers for the entire growing season by paying for their share of the harvest in the winter and early spring. The farmers are able to purchase supplies in the winter and start their crops in early spring, they repay the shareholders in fresh, organic, seasonal produce. CSA enables you to keep local sustainable farms and local food safe for future generations. The produce sold through LFFC is certified organic unless otherwise noted.

This spring/summer season, 26 weeks this year, May 1st –Oct 23rd, LFFC has three share options available for vegetables, which allows families of all sizes to participate. Best of all, the produce is very affordable and ranges from \$16-\$32 per week for veggies (depending on share size) and \$10 per week for fruit (21 weeks). In addition to fruits and vegetables, there are also chicken, meat, cheese, bread, and egg shares available.

Every Thursday, the list of items on the share is emailed out to help with meal planning. On a weekly basis (weekend day), everyone picks up their share at a home in Ravensworth Farm. There is an active Facebook and Pinterest site where the community members share recipes that they are making using the vegetables that we receive. It's really that simple!

Registration closes April 14th, but it would be appreciated if you sign up earlier. We need 30 shares to make this a viable site. Early bird discount codes are available (\$15 off medium vegetable share, coupon code 15offsummer17 and 30offsummer17 for large vegetable share). The website provides examples of the shares in different seasons and the different types of vegetables that you may receive in a typical week. This is our third summer hosting in Ravensworth Farm and would love to have you join as well!

#### INVITING NATURE BACK INTO YOUR YARD

Twenty years of large scale bird surveys by the Audubon Society of Northern Virginia indicate a serious and continuing decline in local bird populations, some disappearing from our area altogether. The primary reason, according to the Society, is loss of habitat due to development. So what can you do to find the space to recreate the wildlife habitat that birds and other wildlife need? You can begin by bringing nature back to your own backyard.

Support Healthy Wildlife Habitats in Your Yard To offer a healthy space for wildlife, you should:

- Reduce/eliminate pesticide and fertilizer use.
- Plant native plants for food (host plants for our native butterflies and moths), nectar, berries, seeds, and nuts.
- Protect water quality.
- Remove invasive exotic species that use up valuable space that would otherwise contain native plants
- Keep cats indoors. The domestic cat is estimated to kill 2.5 billion birds a year in the U.S.
- Support birds and other wildlife by providing a source of clean water, structure and shelter for nesting, perching and protection from the elements.
- Keep leaves in your flower beds in winter and some flower stems and seed heads. This provides critical lifecycle support.

Why Native Plants?

While all plants capture energy from the sun and turn it into leafy insect food, only local insects have evolved to take full advantage of native plants. In turn, local birds and other wildlife depend on a specific local insect species. Remove native plants from this cycle, and the food web falters resulting in an inability to sustain breeding and nesting birds. Remove plants that host specialized insects, and you threaten the whole insect species.

For example, our beautiful Virginia state butterfly, the Eastern Tiger Swallowtail, lays its eggs predominantly on our native tulip and black cherry trees because the caterpillars that hatch are specialized to digest their leaves. Some caterpillars transform into butterflies but many make up the large volume of insects needed to feed baby birds.

How important are these caterpillars? Research shows that one set of Chickadee parents need between 6,000-9,000 caterpillars during the three weeks it takes them to raise four babies. What's wrong with non-natives? As long as they aren't invasive they add beauty and sometimes berries and nectar. It's when they need fertilizer, pesticide protection and extra watering that they are less valuable. The bottom line is using native plants will support the local web of life that includes our local birds. And don't think this involves sacrifices or more work. In fact, native plants love our climate and, yes, even our clay soil. There is a lovely native plant to fill every dry and shady, soggy, or sunbaked spot in your yard without pesticides or fertilizer! In addition, native plants often excel in their habitat value. White oak trees, for instance, host more than 550 different species of moths and butterflies, more than any other plant. So, when you need to replace shrubs or you decide to remove that needy lawn, choose natives. You will see the benefits in maintenance and observe wildlife visitors enjoying your efforts. #### SAFE DRIVING IN HEAVY RAIN

Heavy downpours can be dangerous: more than half of flood fatalities are vehicle related, according to the National Weather Service, and Federal Highway Administration data shows that more weather-related crashes happen in rain than in snow or sleet. We asked James Solomon, subject-matter expert on driver safety at the National Safety Council, how to stay safe if you need to drive in a downpour.

#### Drive a clean car in good condition

When visibility is limited by wet weather, it's important that your car itself doesn't impede your sight. Once a month, clean the outsides and insides of windshields and windows, and check your windshield wiper blades for wear. Check the level of your washer fluid once a week.

Solomon also recommends doing a quick check of headlights, taillights, turn signals and tire treads before driving the car for the first time each day. "Rain or no rain, operating without [signal lights], you're a hazard—and it's a ticketable offense," he explains.

#### Know the roads

Roads are built to withstand different weather conditions in different parts of the country, so if you're new to an area, use extra caution during or after a storm. In many southern states, "the asphalt isn't as compressed," Solomon explains. "This means it can rain and the road can look totally dry, but it's not. You'll squeegee up the water that's caught in the road aggregate, and now your tires are wet and slick and you don't even know it."

Take a moment to consider your route, too. If it takes you through low-lying bridge underpasses or past ditches prone to flooding, it might be a good day to take the freeway instead.

#### Switch on lights, not brights

Though many newer cars come with automatic running lights, turn on the actual headlights when using windshield wipers so your taillights come on as well. "The idea behind having headlights is so other people can see you," says Solomon. "When you turn your headlights on and your back lights come on, you identify all four corners of the vehicle."

You don't, however, need to flip on your brights; the brighter light will just reflect off wet surfaces, bouncing back into your eyes and irritating other drivers.

#### Slow down!

Leave at least five seconds of following distance between your own car and the one in front, and don't feel pressure to drive the posted speed limit. "The speed [listed] on the side of the highway is the maximum speed for perfect weather and perfect road conditions, so if the road is wet, it could be too fast for existing conditions," says Solomon. "If other people don't like it, they can pass you."

And remember: never use cruise control on wet roads. If you hydroplane under cruise control, the automatic acceleration can cause you to lose control of your vehicle when your tires regain traction.

#### Don't get in too deep

If water is covering the markings on the road, it's too deep to drive on. According to Solomon, you can lose control with as little as three inches of water on the road. And even if you manage to stay in control, a larger vehicle could push some of that water underneath your car, causing your engine to stall.

#### Steer where you want to go

If you're going too fast and end up hydroplaning (which Solomon calls surfboarding or waterskiing, "because that's what you're doing"), turn the wheel in the direction you want to go—and don't be afraid if you don't steer out of the skid on the first try. It may take three to five adjustments to get back on course (and a little while longer for your heart to stop pounding).

#### Hold off on unnecessary trips

It's one thing if you need to get home to your children or you're already on the road, but otherwise, ask yourself if you've driven in this kind of weather before and if you're ready to handle it right now. When bad weather is in the forecast, "a lot of people feel they have to go to the store," says Solomon. But just as you would stay off the roads in heavy snow, it's OK to stay home in heavy rain. If you have a small business in a flood-prone area and there's lots of precipitation on the way, try to make arrangements for employees to work from home so they don't have to worry about making the commute on potentially flooded roads.

For more tips on driving in heavy rain and other extreme weather, check out the National Safety Council's defensive driving courses. Bonus: you could even get a discount on your car insurance for taking one.




