

CAN YOU HEAR ME? CROOKED CALLERS RECORDING CONSUMERS' VOICES

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) is warning consumers about a new phone scam. The fraudulent caller tricks victims to say "yes." The response is later used to authorize unwanted charges on utility or credit card accounts. According to FCC, the fake callers impersonate representatives from organizations that usually provide a service and may be familiar with the person, such as a mortgage lender or utility.

The scam begins when a consumer answers the phone and the person at the other end of the line asks, "Can you hear me?" The caller then records the consumer's "yes" response to get a voice signature. If you receive this type of call, immediately hang up. If you have already responded to this type of call, review all of your statements from your bank, credit card lender or telephone company for unauthorized charges. If you notice unauthorized charges, you have likely been a victim of "cramming."

Consumers should always be on alert for telephone scams. The following tips can help ward off unwanted calls and scams:

- Don't answer calls from unknown numbers. Let them go to voicemail.
- If you answer and the caller (often a recording) asks you to hit a button to stop receiving calls, just hang up. Scammers often use these tricks to identify, and then target, live respondents.
- If you receive a scam call, write down the number and file a complaint with the FCC so they can help identify and take appropriate action to help consumers targeted by illegal callers. File the complaint at www.consumercomplaints.fcc.gov.
- Ask your phone service provider if it offers a robocall blocking service. If not, encourage your provider to offer one. You also can visit www.fcc.gov for information and resources on available robocall blocking tools to help reduce unwanted calls.
- Consider registering all of your telephone numbers in the National Do Not Call Registry at www.donotcall.gov or by calling 1-888-382-1222 from you phone to register (TTY: 1-866-290-4236).

The Small Mammal House, Reptile Discovery Center and Think Tank will be open every night of ZooLights, offering visitors an opportunity to view the animals at night. ZooLights includes live music performances, familyfriendly rides and attractions (\$), and plenty of opportunities for holiday

shopping. At the Speedwell Foundation Conservation Carousel, visitors sit atop hand-carved animals and spin through scenes from forest, grassland, savannah and aquatic ecosystems. For a special view of the Zoo's holiday light displays, board the Smithsonian's National Zoo Choo-Choo and go for a merry tour on a trackless train ride around Great Cats Circle. Those looking for a thrill can take a 150-foot-long snowless tubing ride down Lion/Tiger Hill. Tickets are \$3 per person for each attraction.

FREE TRAINING IN BASIC DISASTER RESPONSE SKILLS


Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is a training program administered through the auspices of the county fire and rescue department. The training prepares residents to help themselves, their families and neighbors in the event of a disaster in their community. Through CERT, residents can learn about disaster preparedness and receive training in basic disaster response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue and disaster medical operations.

CERT classes are held at the Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Academy located at 4600 West Ox Rd., Fairfax. There are two sessions each week on Mondays and Wednesdays, 7–11 p.m. The class is 28 hours in length, plus the final practical exercise.

CERT training is free of charge and basic gear is provided. The minimum requirements to participate in CERT training at any level is that residents be 16 years of age or older, and either be a Fairfax County resident, or work in the county. CHIM CHIMNEY SAFETY

While it has probably not been cold enough to start a fire in your fireplace or wood burning stove yet, that time is coming soon.

According to Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department, if you use a wood-burning stove or fireplace, make sure your chimney is clean and in good working order by having a licensed chimney sweep clean and inspect your chimney. This should be done at least once a year or possibly more if you use them frequently.

A dirty flue in your chimney can eventually result in a chimney fire that can spread to your home and cause significant damage. Please also make sure you use your fireplace or wood-burning stove safely and follow the recommended safety tips below.

- 1. Never discard hot ashes inside or near the home. Place them in a covered metal container outside and well away from the house.
- 2. Have a licensed chimney sweep clean and inspect your chimney at least once a year if you use a wood burning stove or fireplace.
- 3. Place a glass or metal spark screen in front of the fireplace and install caps on chimneys.
- 4. Never use a flammable liquid (gasoline, kerosene, lighter fluid, etc.) to start a fire or rekindle a small one.
- 5. Keep paper, clothing, trash, and other combustibles at least three feet away from your furnace, hot water heater, or wood-burning device.

WHAT TO DO WHILE DRIVING DURING A THUNDERSTORM AND HEAVY RAIN

Pull safely onto the shoulder of the road and stop, making sure you are away from any trees or other tall objects that could fall on the vehicle. Stay in the car and turn on the emergency flashers until the heavy rains subside. Heavy rains produced by thunderstorms can greatly reduce visibility. Vehicles will provide better protection from lightning than being out in the open. Emergency flashers will alert other drivers with limited visibility that you have stopped. Keep car windows closed.

Avoid contact with metal or conducting surfaces outside or inside the vehicle. Lightning that strikes nearby can travel through wet ground to your car. The steel frame of a hard-topped vehicle provides increased protection if you are not touching metal. Rubber tires provide no protection from lightning. Avoid contact with potential conductors to reduce your chance of being shocked. Although you may be injured if lightning strikes your car, you are much safer inside a vehicle than outside.

Avoid flooded roadways. Most flood fatalities are caused by people attempting to drive through water, or people playing in high water. The depth of water is not always obvious. The roadbed may be washed out under the water, and you could be stranded or trapped. Rapidly rising water may stall the engine, engulf the vehicle and its occupants, and sweep them away. Look out for flooding at highway dips, bridges, and low areas. Two feet of water will carry away most automobiles.






