ries are, Farmer of the Year, Young Farmer of the Year, and Life of Service. To be eligible, briefly, each nominee must be a Ravensworth resident and, with the exception of the Life of Service Award the act(s) of service must have directly benefitted Ravensworth and must have been performed within the previous 12 months leading up to the nomination deadline. The Life of Service award is to recognize those who have consistently and thanklessly served the community year after year. The Civic Association Board will consider all eligible nominations and vote for the award recipients. Civic Association Board members are ineligible during their tenure and for a period of 5 years following their service. TAKE NOTE that the nomination deadline is close of business APRIL 1, 2018.

1) The Farmer Newsletter has been in production for several decades, now. The Farmer provides ongoing information regarding events, interests, and concerns common to all Ravensworth residents. And it is the only means by which this information can be disseminated to all 856 homes in Ravensworth.

Printing and distribution of the Farmer requires a significant financial commitment, which is met each month through the advertising contained herein. Our neighbor, Katherine Craig, has done a phenomenal job seeing that the costs of production of the Farmer and the directory are covered by advertising, we express our sincere appreciation. Unfortunately for us, though, she is no longer able to serve in this capacity.

Advertising revenue is falling, and we need someone to step in and take up the reins. Otherwise, our ability to continue providing this valuable service to the community is in jeopardy. Please contact me, if you are able to offer a modest portion of your time and energy to secure the future of the Civic Association's publications.

We also need more block captains to help with distribution of the directory, collection of Civic Association dues, and identifying new members of the community.

2) The future of Lake Accotink is in question. As has been repeatedly reported, the Master Plan for Lake Accotink is under review and facing likely revision to address the exorbitant cost of maintenance of the lake. We did not receive notice of a meeting regarding the revision, held January 22, 2018, in time to print an announcement in the Farmer. Regardless, Ravensworth was well-represented at the meeting. But the matter is not closed. We need to remain involved in the Master Plan process as much as possible. Please reach out to County officials to make your opinion felt. 3) There are locations in Ravensworth where repair of roadways, curbs, and sidewalks is necessary. We will be contacting VDOT and other responsible authorities to request these repairs. Feel free to contact VDOT directly, or please let me know the location and nature of any repairs you think necessary.



WIDESPREAD FLU CASES SEND MORE PATIENTS TO HOSPITALS

Flu season is spiking early this year, and more cases of the virus have sent Virginians to the hospital in the last two weeks of December.

If someone in your house has body aches, a high fever, sore throat and stomach issues then your family, like many across northern Virginia and DC, has been hit by the flu. More cases of the flu were reported across the state and in the District in the past two weeks, says the Centers for Disease Control. Flu cases soared and remain widespread in Virginia as of Dec. 30 tallies.

Nationwide, three pediatric flu-related deaths were reported the week of Dec. 23. The number of states reporting widespread flu activity — which includes Virginia — has increased over the two weeks from 22 to 46 states, according to the CDC.

For the week ending Dec. 30, Maryland and Virginia were among 46 states that reported widespread flu activity. That means Virginia saw outbreaks of flu or increased influenza-like illness, including recent laboratory confirmed influenza statewide, with more people in every age group requiring hospital care for the flu. Local influenza activity was reported by the District of Columbia.

"Widespread" means flu or flu-like illness has been confirmed in at least half the regions in the state over a three-week period.

The flu season typically runs from October to May with the peak between December and February. The Virginia Department of Health urges everyone six months of age or older to get a flu shot. If you haven't gotten your flu shot yet, there's still time to do so.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention lists healthy habits to undertake to try and prevent the flu. Those include:

- 1. Avoid close contact—Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick too.
- 2. Stay home when you are sick—If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. This will help prevent spreading your illness to others.
- 3. Cover your mouth and nose—Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your elbow when coughing or sneezing. It may prevent those around you from getting sick.
- 4. Clean your hands—Washing your hands often will help protect you from germs. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub.
- 5. Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth—Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.
- 6. Practice other good health habits—Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces at home, work or school, especially when someone is ill. Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food.

Symptoms of flu include:

fever (usually high), headache, extreme tiredness, dry cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle aches, stomach symptoms, such as nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea, also can occur but are more common in children than adults.

WHICH HOLIDAY GIFTS ARE WELCOME IN THE PARKS?

Fairfax County households are overflowing with new toys and other gifts at this time of year. While it is fun to head outside to try them out, it's important to know the rules before bringing holiday gifts into the parks.

Here are some tips:

Drones are growing in popularity, but are not allowed to take off or land in most FCPA parks. Park regulations and Federal Aviation Administration directives ban the use of hobby rockets, remote-control gliders or powered remote -control or tethered planes, boats, cars or other similar devices in most parks. Drone pilots may take off and land at Poplar Ford Park (6704 Bull Run Post Office Road, Chantilly, VA) under a partnership with Northern Virginia Radio Control, a model aircraft organization. For more information on drone usage in the parks, please visit Model Aircrafts and Drones.

Projectiles are prohibited. Try out the new golf clubs only at a county golf course. Unless you're in a special archery program, leave bows and arrows at home. That goes for Tasers, spears, slingshots, dart devices, and other high-speed missile projectiles, too.

Knives with a blade more than four inches in length are prohibited, unless you're using them to prepare food.

Metal detectors may only be used with the FCPA's express written permission.

Got a new puppy? Keep your furry friend on a leash, and no visiting a dog park until they are at least four months old and not in heat. New pony? Stay in designated equestrian/riding areas. Feel free to try out the new fishing rod, but you must comply with Virginia State game laws and park rules.

Take your new skates for a spin at the Mount Vernon ice rink, but don't tempt fate by skating on any body of water in a park. Keep bicycles and skis on established trails, walkways and roadways. No off-trail use. Similarly, do not sled or tube or ski on our golf courses once the snow arrives.

Keep the ear buds in your ears. If you want to play something loud enough for everyone around you to hear, you need written permission from the Park Authority.

If you want to spend the night in your new tent, plan to stay in a designated area, register and pay the appropriate fees.


SCANDALS IN THE CITY




