PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Lake Accotink Update

On April 30, Supervisors Cook and McKay hosted another community meeting about Lake Accotink, at which all the options for the lake's future were discussed. Supervisors Herrity and Gross were also in attendance. All of the supervisors spoke to me approvingly of keeping the lake much as it is now. In addition, Supervisor Cook confirmed that, in the long run, dredging and adding a forebay, which had been billed as the most expensive of the options for the lake, is actually the least expensive of all the options. That is because of the hidden costs of losing Lake Accotink associated to the requirements of water

Run 4 Ravensworth, the biggest fundraiser of the year for Ravensworth Elementary School PTA. Around 520 students ran as many laps in the school parking lot as they could in 20 minutes on May 4 to raise money for the school. Each student asked family, friends, and neighbors to sponsor him or her per lap. While pledges had not been tallied as The Farmer went to print, at least 600 laps had been tallied. The goal was to raise \$20,000. If that challenge is met, the school principal, Ms. Roxann Salata, will be put "in jail" in the school lobby.



PEDESTRIAN OVERPASSES ON BRADDOCK ROAD

I am organizing a series of community meetings for residents to learn about and comment on the proposed pedestrian crossings on Braddock Road, the designs being considered, and possible locations for additional crossings. The first meeting will take place in June and the second will be scheduled for October. The specific dates will be announced in upcoming weeks through the Cook Advisory and Social Media.

Members of the community suggested the County research pedestrian overpasses as part of the Braddock Road Multimodal Study. The overpasses would provide an "elevated crossing alternative" that would not affect traffic flow at major intersections on Braddock Road. These overpasses would further promote connectivity in Braddock by providing pedestrian access to more neighborhoods, shopping centers, and public transportation. After receiving feedback from the community and the Braddock Road Task Force, the County planned a pedestrian overpass across Braddock Road in between the Red Fox Drive (East) intersection and the Burke Lake Road/Woodland Way intersection. The County also offered the option of placing an overpass "across Braddock Road in between the Kings Park Drive intersection and the Stone Haven Drive intersection" or "across Braddock Road in between the Southampton Drive intersection and the Wakefield Chapel Road intersection (closer to the Wakefield Chapel Road intersection)." Ultimately, the location of additional overpasses would depend on community interest. The County is open to any viable location with community support.

"WIN" FOR ADULTS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

Supervisor John C. Cook has been named the Sponsoring Chairman of the Welcoming Inclusion Network (WIN), a collaborative committee dedicated to improving employment opportunities and day services for people with developmental disabilities. Adults with developmental and intellectual disabilities face a number of challenges when it comes to finding employment and day services. The County has historically provided these services to individuals with intellectual disabilities in light of inadequate state funding levels. Recent state and federal regulatory changes now mandate that such services be provided equally to individuals with developmental disabilities, thus doubling the population served. Funding, however, has not increased, requiring changes in our services.

In order to help the County revise its programs, a collaborative group of stakeholders called the Welcoming Inclusion Network was created in February 2018. WIN stakeholders include a wide range of people in the community including parents, service providers, advocates and Fairfax-Falls Church Community Services Board developmental disabilities services staff. The group's goals fall under the four terms of "Network, Design, Employment, and Inclusion."

The goal associated with Network entails building opportunities for increased information and resource sharing among agencies, companies, other organizations, and the community at large. The Design goal is to ensure service equity and efficiency through community-designed services. Employment includes boosting employment opportunities through existing and new service models. The final goal of Inclusion lies in identifying and addressing other challenges those with developmental disabilities face in achieving full community inclusion. WIN is still open to community members interested in improving these services and community inclusion for those with developmental disabilities. SNEAKY SUMMER INJURIES

'Tis the season for easy living—until a bug bite, a burn, or a little too much booze does you in. More than 29 million people are treated in the ER for injuries every year, according to the CDC, and summertime is far and away the busiest season. (This is especially bad news when you consider the fact that hospital medication errors—and fatalities—also spike in summer.) Here's how to avoid becoming a statistic, and some treatment tips if you're reading this a little too late.



1. BBO blunders

Making burgers and kabobs sounds like a brilliant idea, until you remember that you aren't a grill master. U.S. fire departments respond to an average of 8,200 home fires involving grills, hibachis or barbecues per year, and burns to the skin and smoke inhalation are far more numerous.

Sidestep it: Exercise caution when lighting the grill and opening the cover, since once it's fired up, the whole shebang is hot.

Treat it: If it's a minor burn, hold the skin under cool running water to reduce swelling for up to 15 minutes or until the pain subsides. "If the burn is on the face, hands, or over a large part of the body, you may want to seek medical attention," says Dr. McGinnis.

2. Killer sunburns

They not only hurt, they are evidence of a weakened skin defense. "A burn is an inflammatory reaction by our skin to the sun," says Ranella Hirsch, MD, a Boston dermatologist. Plus, extensive research shows that repeated burns can damage your DNA and increase your risk of skin cancer.

Sidestep it: Dr. Hirsh recommends sunscreens with broad spectrum UVA and UVB protection. "But more important than the number is how often you reapply it," says Dr. Hirsch. Slather on another two or three tablespoons every 90 minutes, whether you've been in the water or not.

Treat it: If your skin is scorched, mix one part whole milk with one part cool water and gently apply it into the affected areas with a washcloth. "The proteins in the milk will take away the sting immediately," says Dr. Hirsch. And as it heals, resist the urge to peel off the flaking skin. "You're opening up ports of entry for infection."

3. Lawn mowing injuries

Cutting the grass is not only dirty and loud, it's dangerous: Each year 80,000 Americans require hospital treatment for lawnmower accidents, the majority of which are caused when other things—think rocks and sticks—are accidentally picked up and thrown by the mower blades.

Sidestep it: Make sure your mower is in good working condition, clear the yard of any objects that could be flung by the lawnmower blades, and don't mow without enough daylight. "Always wear proper protective equipment, including pants, long sleeves, closed toe shoes, sunglasses and, ideally, hearing protection," says Dr. McGinnis.

Treat it: It depends on where you get hurt but see a doctor right away if your eyes are injured. If you've cut your-self, clean the wound with soap and water, and control the bleeding with pressure. "If the injury is severe, seek immediate medical attention," says Dr. McGinnis.

We moved to Ravensworth Farm too late in the summer of 2011 to join the pool. As we met neighbors through the winter, we heard great things of the pool and how easy it would be to find friends for our then four-year-old daughter if we joined. We were told we would especially make friends with younger kids and parents if we joined something called Fledglings. They said Fledglings was swim lessons. Our daughter had already taken swim lessons at various REC Centers but we were going to join the pool anyway and it is just blocks from our house, so we signed her up. We figured she probably wouldn't advance more than she had done in her REC lessons.

Boy, were we wrong! It's amazing what a four-year-old can learn in four concentrated weeks of five lessons per week! It's extra-helpful that the coaches are "big kids" that the little kids really want to impress. After her first summer of Fledglings, our daughter had conquered the shallow end. After her second summer, the deep end held no fear (or danger). After her third summer, she won her event in her first swim meet. <u>LISTEN TO THE LOCKSMITH FOR KEYS TO A SAFE HOME</u> (CONTINUED FROM PREVIOUS ISSUE)

High Security Locks Locks are getting better all of the time. It's been said that every lock can be defeated, but why make it easy for the bad guys. Grade 1, high security deadbolt locks are made with high security materials and are next to impossible to pick or drill open which means a potential intruder will have to find another way in.

Garage Doors Garage doors provide easy access for locksmiths and burglars. That red pull-cord that hangs just inside the door can be grabbed from outside with a simple tool or even a coat hanger to release the drive motor and manually lift the door. There are bolt on products that make that impossible.

Locksmiths The state of Virginia requires licensing of locksmiths. The process includes schooling, experience, background checks and finger printing. Once licensed, locksmiths have a code of rules and ethics to follow or risk losing their license and their ability to work legally. Some of the tasks a residential locksmith can perform for you include re-keying cylinders, making new keys, repairing locks, supplying and replacing locks, installing new locks, servicing and replacing hinges, and some provide door repairs and emergency lockouts.

Beware There are a number of scammers working as unlicensed locksmiths who take advantage of unsuspecting homeowners. They have toll-free 800 area codes and advertise \$19 service fees and low rates over the phone but that all changes when they show up. I had a recent customer complain that he was charged \$700 for the installation of a new lock that he later saw for sale at a local big box store for \$15. Plus his door was a mess when the scammer left. Beware of "cheap" service providers and always ask to see ID and license of any locksmith before granting them entry into your home.

Cheap locks—Too many home builders install cheap, low quality, grade 3 residential locks on their doors that offer limited security at best. While almost any lock can be defeated, don't make easy for the bad guys to get in.

Worn or cracked keys—Keys wear out. The more you use them the faster they wear to the point where they no longer function. We see a lot of keys that have been used to pry or dig something free and now they're bent or cracked to the point where they no longer slide in to their cylinder or they to break off inside the cylinder. Worn and broken keys are a leading cause for lockouts.

Lock box—Lockouts are a locksmith's bread and butter. The person locked out is at the mercy of the locksmith who is going to charge \$100 to \$300 (depending on time and distance traveled) for less than an hour's labor. He may be able to get you in by some nondestructive method like picking your lock or using some device to jimmy your door open. However, he may have to drill your lock open which means an additional expense to replace and rekey your lock. An extra key secured in a hidden combination lock box bolted to a deck post or some other inconspicuous spot with long screws can solve an otherwise expensive situation.

Combination Locks—There are several brands of residential combination locks that enable multiple user codes to be added and/or deleted as needed, WiFi access, key override and provide the same security as traditional key-only locks. They are available in different colors and styles in both deadbolts and lever sets.

Deadbolts—One of the most critical components to securing a door is a good reliable deadbolt. Selecting the correct style is very important: single cylinder deadbolts require a key to lock and unlock from the outside and have a thumb-turn inside providing fast and simple locking and unlocking which can be lifesaving if you need get out in a hurry; double cylinder deadbolts require a key on both sides of the door and should only be used when there is glass near, or on the door. Unlocking in an emergency may not be possible if you can't find the key.

In closing, most locksmiths are available to provide a security survey of your home for a small fee. He or she can point out vulnerable areas that may be at risk and suggest solutions to help keep your doors and locks operating properly and securing your property. Many of which can be performed using simple tools.


